



A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

Every Sunday, the first reading and the Gospel lesson are connected by a similar theme; the second reading is a continuous reading from a letter of St. Paul or one of the Pastoral Letters of the New Testament. The Gospel is usually preached about, like a middle child the second reading is simply just there.

Did you notice the second reading last Sunday? From St. Paul's First Letter to the Thessalonians: "And for this reason we too give thanks to God unceasingly, that, in receiving the word of God from hearing us, you received not a human word but, as it truly is, the word of God, which is at work in you who believe."

During the month of October, in every Catholic Church, bishops ask pastors to count the number of people attending Sunday Mass. Our ushers quietly took the count. Throughout the entire month of

October, a total of 5,523 persons attended Mass here at St. Juliana; total Sunday attendance varied by a high of 1,424 to a low of 1,340 persons for the five Masses. I'm no wiz at arithmetic but I reckon that comes to 276 people on average per Sunday Mass. Over the past years, our attendance has been declining: total attendance for 2016 was 5,571 and 2015 was 6,148. Last year we celebrated forty-one funerals; good men and women not replaced! Ours is primarily an Anglo parish of one language. Other parishes are larger and more diverse. I just thought you would like to know this.

I pray that those who attend our Masses find worship worthy of Almighty God through our ritual, song, homily, and the service we give one another. I pray you all feel welcome here by the priests, deacons, and the ministers of hospitality – the group we used to call "ushers." When we gather Sunday after Sunday, our faith is enlivened, our belief is strengthened, our holiness is increased. This is God's Work, *Opus Dei*, alive in us when we say "I believe."

Our parish grammar school is strong, enjoyable, and faith-filled. The students and their families add life to this parish. With 307 students we are one of the few Catholic grammar schools in the Diocese of Orange which grows in enrollment. I enjoy our school students and appreciate the administration, faculty, and staff that makes sacrifices to ensure it is viable. To parents, thank you again and again for choosing to send your progeny to St. Juliana Parish Grammar School. GO FALCONS. Each week your children attend Mass; kindergarten, first and second grade on Tuesday at 8:00AM, Wednesday the third, fourth, and fifth graders attend the 8:00AM Mass, and on Friday the sixth, seventh, and eighth graders are at 8:00AM Mass. Once a month, on First Friday or on another significant day, the entire student body attends the 8:00AM Mass. Parents or significant people in lives of our students, please attend Mass with our students. Don't let the week-day school Mass be a substitute for Sunday worship. To the whole parish, thank you for supporting our parish school in the second collection and by attending school activities, including the Gala.

What do you do after you say: "I believe"? How do you answer that question? It takes a village to make a group of people into a vibrant Catholic parish. You are those people. You are that village.

Please attend our parish Ministry Fair. Mass and events don't just happen and the parish does not run itself! How might you use your talents and time to praise Jesus and make us a better community of faith? The community is looking for you to be a minister of hospitality, of the Eucharist, to serve with the bereavement group. Might you be a week day sacristan and help open the church before the 6:30AM Mass? We need you at Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on the first Tuesday of each month. Will you be a volunteer at the Fall Festival? Won't you help, for just one Mass, with coffee and donuts? When you don't attend a faith formation lesson or if you are not yet a member of a Small Christian Community there is an empty seat, you are needed to fill those chairs – they are comfortable.

Compared to other parishes and mega-church communities, our numbers are few. Size is relative. Its faith and its work, belief, that matter. Whatever our number, this community is rich in belief. St. Juliana herself was known for faith formation and a devotion to the Holy Eucharist. Take your lead from Jesus and St. Juliana. Lead others in your community to St. Juliana's Parish.

You are a wonderful community. And for you I give thanks. You make my ministry easier: "I can't do it without you." And we can't do it without the help of God. In the end, it is God's work; it's the love of Jesus that we imitate.



We consider wisdom today. The first reading from the book of Wisdom presents this precious gift as a feminine spirit, a very desirable virtue sought by many and graciously present to all who seek her. In today's Gospel, Jesus tells a parable to illustrate wisdom in a practical, measurable way. The wise will conserve their resources, use them prudently, and mark the passing of time. The foolish, on the other hand, not planning ahead, will be in the dark. Both of these readings tell us how accessible wisdom is to all who simply and honestly seek it.

On Friday, October 20, 2017, Juana and her husband Mariano, and their youngest daughter, received new tar paper and shingles on their roof. They are very grateful to their sponsors, Jack and Jean Sweeney. In recent years, whenever it rained, they had to fetch buckets to catch the drops. They were joking that the drops would tend to land on something important like their food, or in their beds while they were sleeping. Juana says, "Thank you for making our dreams of having a dry home, a reality." Juana works many hours as a Corazon volunteer accumulating hours in exchange for benefits such as the roofing materials for this project. Mariano works for a small recycling company taking apart metal from used items, cleaning them, and separating the metals into piles of the same type. The couple have 4 other grown children and eight grandchildren who live in close proximity. Two of their daughters also volunteer for Corazon and their children receive Corazon scholarships to help them with the purchase of school uniforms, workbooks, and materials, and receive regular tutoring to help them in their scholastic achievement. Juana enjoys participating in the adult classes offered by Corazon, such as gardening and child abuse prevention, and helping her neighbors in building their projects. She says that Corazon has strengthened their family, and has made their lives better. After the project was over, Jean and Doug Knudson enjoyed a homemade Mexican meal with 25 other volunteers from the neighborhood. After we drove away, it almost immediately started raining.
