A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

It must have been a difficult day. They were chosen by Jesus, they were instructed by Jesus, they knew Jesus' motives, they were sent by Jesus as missionaries, they saw Jesus at his final hour. Jesus left them. Then he "was taken up" away from them.

They had to have felt abandoned. No?

Would I have been patient enough to remain waiting for the Holy Spirit? When would I have reached the conclusion: that's all there is. I was taken in, fooled.

Jesus neither fooled nor did he abandon his chosen followers or those who left everything to follow him because of their missionary witness. It's only when we are too caught up in our own issues, when we are too insensitive to be in awe and wonder of the glory of God that we miss the presence of the Almighty which is always right before our eyes. Before sunset, or at sunset tonight, go and hear the harrumph of the Pacific Ocean, see the blossoms of Spring, watch the sunset, admire the first star of the night. Is the moon made of cheese? Notice a young human and offer comfort to an elderly one. Welcome a neighbor into your home.

That's the joy of being a believer in God. Discovering Him in all His many and wonderful forms. God, the Father has not abandoned His creation. He simply cannot.

Where might Jesus, the Son of God be found now? He is the son of a carpenter, the mother of a house wife. Jesus has graduated from or will graduate soon from a variety of schools. He is in those young ones and adolescents and maturing men and women who are fearful because their lives are changing. They know the hell they are in (!) but they don't know what's coming next and it is hell. That's fear. Jesus is in each of those who are hiding because they are afraid they are going to be fooled, they have been hoodwinked before, they were the first ones out and the last ones chosen for any team. Jesus is also in the first of every class, the best in the sport, and in every name called and mis-pronounced for a diploma on graduation day.

Where is Jesus? He is in and with those parents who are afraid because their nest will be empty. He is in and with those parents who are excited because they have an extra room in their home and garage for their own use!

Where is Jesus on this Ascension Day? He is in you when you have strength to correct the bully, provide for those who don't have, challenge the one next to you to stop drinking, gambling, or just stop acting "weird" and start loving again.

Today, as much as we celebrate Jesus' going up we can celebrate the grace he left us to deal with the conflicts, challenges, and torments of our lives and ascend to places, heights, we didn't know we could reach.

You might not need to say one word. Your actions will reveal your intentions. Today, is the day of your ascension to a new better humanity and a new Christianity. It's the ascension of the St. Juliana Falconieri Community in Fullerton becoming more like Jesus. Reach for the heaven, Jesus will pull you up! He won't leave you as an orphan, alone and abandoned. 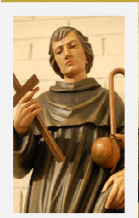

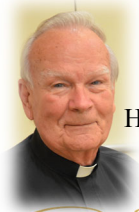

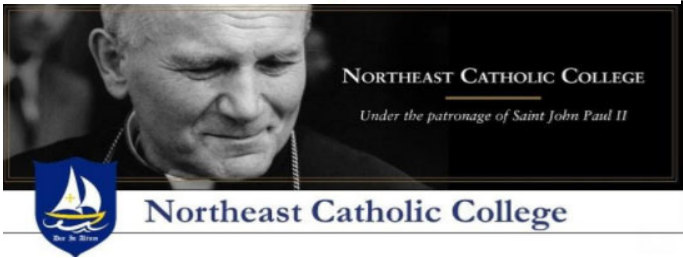
