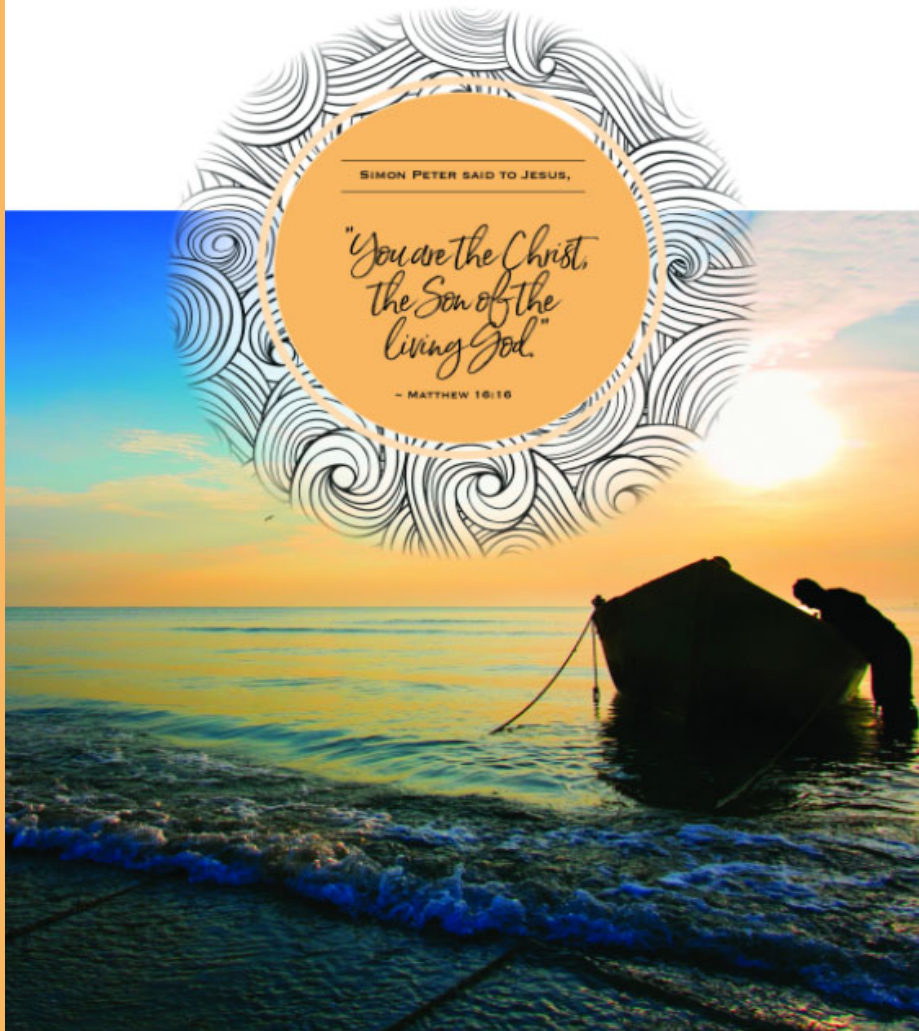

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

The early Christians formed a community to imitate Jesus by the way they lived their lives. Being “one of heart and mind” they became known, grew, and survived.

Community, is one of those words like excellence and love; misused, overused, and not understood. Every time a corporation or school or a whatever celebrates an anniversary, the slogan is familiar: “Brand X celebrating 25 years of EXCELLENCE.” That’s nice, but what does excellence mean? Can nearly everything reach excellence? What does Brand X do that makes it excellent? Love is also thrown around recklessly: “I love ...” Not just like or want to possess, but love. Love, really? For an excellent example of excellence and love, meditate on St. Paul’s First Letter to the Corinthians 12:31-13:13. “Set your hearts on the greater gifts. Now, I will show you a still more excellent way.... Love is patient; love is kind....Love never fails.” Basically, excellent love is serving others. In the act of serving others many become one and a community is formed. When a Christian community is formed, it is done in imitation of Jesus who himself came “not to be served but to serve.”

As a Christian community we pray in such a way that prayer forms our lives, we become the community of our prayer. Third Eucharistic Prayer for various needs has this petition: “Grant that all the faithful of the Church, looking into the signs of the times by the light of faith, may constantly devote themselves to the service of the Gospel. Keep us attentive to the needs of all that, sharing their grief and pain, their joy and hope, we may faithfully bring them the good news of salvation and go forward with them along the way of your Kingdom.”

Attentive to the needs of everyone in our community of St. Juliana, we need you to pray. Pray for people you know who are sick, who have died, who are in rough waters in their life, and etc. Pray for people with new jobs, who are pregnant, had a child, who are at college, and etc. “Keep us attentive to the needs of all, sharing their grief and pain, their joy and hope...” At the statue and votive candle shrine of St. Peregrine there is a loose-page book where you can write the names of people you are praying for and if you wish write why they are mentioned. This one book replaces a book specifically for the dead and a box of prayer intentions that used to be kept in the back of the church. Do stop and pray with and for one another as disciples do. A strong and encouraging witness to our community of faith is members praying for and with one another.

If you wish someone living or dead to be prayed for as the intention of the Mass – those cards can be purchased for a donation at the Parish Office. Each Mass celebrated has a “stipend” that is a donation given for its intention.

Bulletin boards in the vestibule of the church have been reduced. Frankly, all I really want to post at all the times are references to pro- life centers for those considering abortion, suicide counseling hot line information, and vocation information. When someone, especially a young person, comes into the church to pray, sometimes that information is most important and necessary at once. Other VERY current information is posted by the office staff and should not destroy the above mentioned needs. Most all current or future information is found in the weekly bulletin or the newspaper of the Diocese of Orange and those are kept in racks throughout the church. The parish and school web sites are useful: www.stjulianachurch.org and www.stjulianaschool.org.

A clean and tidy vestibule of the church is inviting for all who enter. Please keep tables, chairs, bulletin boards, and etc. out of the vestibule. I hope you agree that the table in the back of the church is excellent. Don’t you love it! It was made by one of our own parishioners for the church; Carl Martorana, thanks so much!

The church new doors do not have stoppers; they cannot be kept open except by holding them open. Thus there will be no need for signs or announcements to close the doors. As members of a Christian community, greet one another with kindness and hold the door open as needed. Doing so will indicate excellence, love, and service to one another. An access ramp is located at the south east door. I hope the ushers – ministers of hospitality – will locate themselves both inside and outside of the church to welcome and assist members of our community. The new front entrance will have doors which can remain open.

The community can also pray with and for each other as disciples do.

The community at liturgy needs a variety of servers. If you are scheduled to serve as a minister of hospitality, the Holy Eucharist, reader, or altar server please plan on arriving dressed appropriately fifteen to twenty minutes before the service begins. If you are scheduled but are unable to make your assignment please find a substitute or notify another server so a substitute can be found.

Usually, on Sunday, the washrooms in the parish center will be accessible from the outside door.

“Keep us attentive to the needs of all that, sharing their grief and pain, their joy and hope, we may faithfully bring them the good news of salvation and go forward with them along the way of your Kingdom.” Serving the needs of the community, we proclaim the Good News!

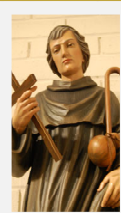

The *Faith Direct* program gives you:

- * A convenient and consistent way to support St. Juliana Falconieri by electing to use direct debit from your bank or credit card account.
- * The opportunity to support our parish even if you are absent from Mass for travel or illness.
- * A solution to a situation we know many families face on their way to Mass: where did I put my envelopes?!

With the support of the parish finance council, we have selected the *Faith Direct* program for many reasons, including:

- * For 10 years, *Faith Direct* has worked with hundreds of Catholic parishes throughout the United States and is recognized as the leading eGiving program.
- * *Faith Direct* provides the critical third party security needed for this new way of parish support: this limits the liability for our parish and keeps your information in secure hands.

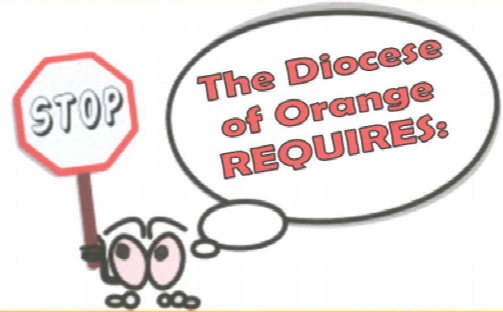

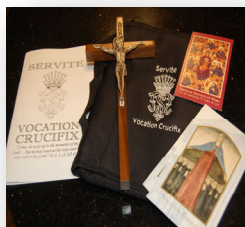

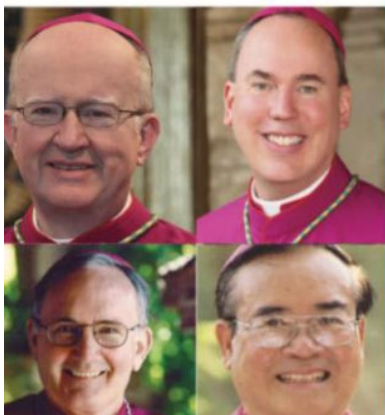
