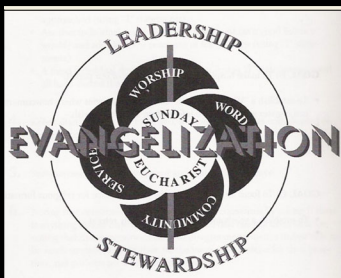

Welcome Fr. Clyde Phillips from the Maryknoll Missionary Fathers. Each year the Diocese of Orange assigns missionary groups to speak at and take a second collection from its parishes. This year the Maryknoll Fathers are assigned to St. Juliana Parish. Fr. Clyde will be sharing his experiences of the way he makes the Gospel of Jesus known. When we leave Mass we are sent to proclaim the Good News by the way we live our lives. Give your attention to Fr. Clyde and learn about the way he and the Maryknoll Fathers live their lives in service of the Gospel. I received a very nice thank you note from the FOCUS (Fellowship of Catholic University Students) president Mr. Craig Miller for the support our parish was to Mr. Franco Watts who spoke to us in August. Recall FOCUS was the missionary group that was assigned to St. Juliana's two years ago. Franco is a result of their missionary efforts and your support. FOCUS remains at CSUF with a new group, still strong, and still inspiring. I am encouraged by the group and I hope you are too. Franco is now stationed with FOCUS at Cal Berkeley.

Your generosity in the second collection last weekend for the victims of Hurricane Harvey totaled \$6537.50. WOW! Thank you so much! The collection will be sent to the Diocese of Orange who will send it to Catholic Charities in Texas. Catholic Charities is superb in what they accomplish. With little administrative and over-head costs, donations reach victims for whom they are designated.

Last weekend I updated two Masses about Fr. Luke. Fr. Luke continues to be in a lot of pain from his lower back into his right leg. He is uncomfortable sitting and not able to stand or walk without pain. He is under the care of a few very fine doctors who are gathering information to make a decision as to what should be done for his recovery. Surgery is not out of the question but data must be collected to make the best decision. So, he waits. What can you do for him? Pray for his healing. Send cards, especially hand written cards. They are the best. Thanks for respecting his privacy and thanks for wanting to know about him.



The Fall Festival is gearing up again to be the best of all Fall Festivals. Thank you, especially thank you to John & Maureen Kohaut for being such able chairs of the event and all who volunteer to organize and work our Parish Fall Festival. It's a huge effort but know that "a good time will be had by all." The whole St. Juliana community is grateful. Now, go and have the time of your life on September 22, 23, and 24. Bring your friends who come every year, bring your friends who have never been, bring grammar school alumni, bring yourselves and have a good time. Spend money! Pray for good weather! Fr. Clyde Phillips, a Maryknoll missionary priest, is with us this weekend, September 9/10 to give witness to God's Word among the people and cultures of the foreign lands he serves. Fr. Clyde was born in Hilo, Hawaii on Dec 30, 1948 and was ordained a Maryknoll priest on May 20, 1978. He was assigned to the Philippine Region where he served for 20 years and was named Director of the Philippine Lay Mission Program in

1986. That same year he was elected Assistant Regional Superior of the Philippines, and he went on to serve as Regional Superior for two consecutive three year terms. While at our parish Fr. Clyde will share his experiences of encountering God in the people that he serves and invite parishioners to discover ways they can live out their call to be a missionary disciple!

Fr. Clyde is taking up a collection for his missionary work and will be happy to talk with anyone who is interested in learning more about mission life or perhaps becoming an overseas missionary.

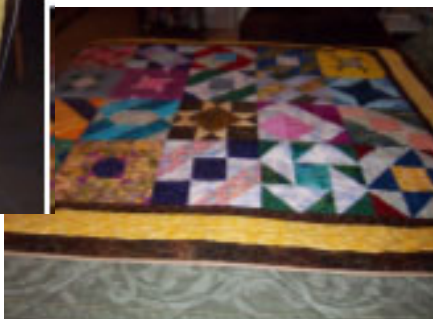
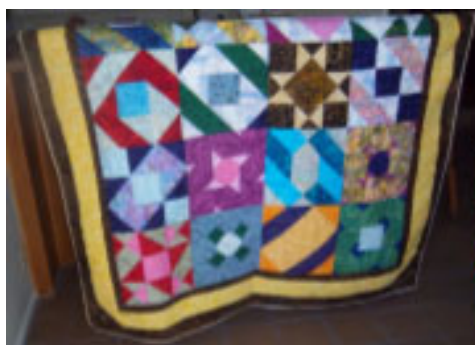
PENNIES FROM HEAVEN UPDATE - PLEASE RETURN THE BABY BOTTLES

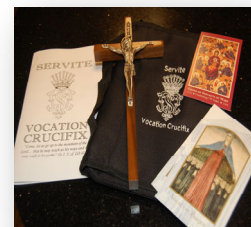

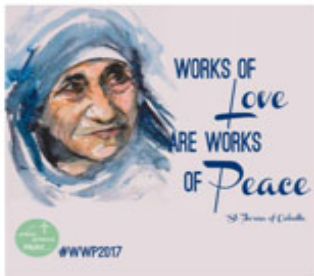
