A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

It's said that art imitates culture. Art, in all its forms, is like a mirror; the artist reproduces culture in whatever media he/she uses. Some people argue the opposite, culture imitates art. If an attitude or act is seen in an art form, culture is sure to begin imitating it. It's why kids get in trouble for imitating cartoon characters! The television/cinema character does it first, then little Michael imitates Superman. I enjoy chicken and egg discussions; they remind me of a Sunday meal with my family.

Pop-culture is filled with signs, slogans, and shibboleths. It's an art form. Let's turn something very important into a catch phrase and repeat it often, make signs proclaiming "What Would Jesus Do?" -then wear it on our clothing, or on our wrist. Being mass

marketed to millions, it will become popular for some time until being so mass marketed it becomes so ordinary, so common, it won't be noticed. It's the way the cross became jewelry and lost deeper significance. Similarly, excellence and love lost their meaning. What is love? If everything is excellent, what is excellence?

Our community will be excellent, when we imitate Jesus. We will imitate Jesus when we know him, form a relationship with him, talk to him as a Good Friend, and let him tell us as Christians who we are and what we are all about. Then we'll go out and "Glorify the Lord by the way we live our lives." Jesus and his Holy Spirit will give us the courage to be Christian people. As disciples first, we read the Gospel, the Pastoral Letters, and writings of the Church. Once we have learned what being a follower of Jesus means, we go out on mission to be an apostle, those who proclaim the Gospel. Sometimes with words, most of the time with actions we become an example of Jesus because we know who we are and what we must do to bring the Good News of Jesus to life.

Belief is an action; the way we live our life. It is not something we read about that affected the lives of many people long ago in a far-away land. Belief is not a museum piece, it is a practice perfected through use. Make your life holy by your belief-actions. Belief in Jesus is the practice of lighting a fire on the earth changing the old and creating something new, it is being present as Jesus was compassionate, it is loving as Jesus served. Belief is being fruitful, Jesus started with twelve.

On the east side of our church is a sign: "**Stewardship, It's what we do after we say I believe.**" Stewardship can be just a new shibboleth, a common phrase, over-used and vacuous. Or it will be our identity, our call to action to be a new creation in Jesus. **Stewardship is our challenge.** If the Gospel doesn't challenge you, you haven't heard it!

Christianity, the Gospel of Jesus, is a moon shot different from the traits of "being a good human." You want the cashier to be a good and honest person; someone who gives the correct change and bags the groceries with a smile! The easiest definition of morality is "being human." Christianity demands "loving others as Jesus loves us," it means, as St. Paul tells us living "a more excellent way." As believers we have to "light the fire of Christ's love on the earth." Jesus' heart was often moved with pity, he acted with compassion, worked miracles – on the Sabbath, the forbidden day. He gave people new hope.

Sum up Christianity with these two words: forgiveness and resurrection. Do you accept the forgiveness of others? Do you offer resurrection – compassion, a better way of life for all people, easing their burdens and lessening their pain? Raise yourself up, help someone. Jesus hates death; he rose from it, then gave life to all who believe.

After you say "I believe in Jesus" what do you do to be more like him? Are you part of the Catholic community really - not just a "Sunday Mass-goer?" Is there a Church ministry you want to join? Is there hospitality you can offer? How do you show compassion for others and become a neighbor to the oppressed and afflicted? Is there a door you can open for another that would ease a burden and raise the hope of someone? Is there some act you can stop doing because it is not the act of a good human being and far from the excellent love expected of a Christian?

Start with what is expected as just "being human" – then challenge yourself to be a Christian. It's the call to discipleship. It's the act of stewardship. "**What do you do after you say: I believe**"? If Christianity were against the law, of what would you be convicted?

"It's Fall Festival weekend! We're so glad you are here!"
