



Our hearts go out to all the people of the Philippines at this time, especially to the families that have lost a loved one or are displaced due to the recent Typhoon. This tragic event has resulted in thousands of deaths. Myriads more are without the basic necessities of food, water, shelter and clothing. Catholic Charities and the Bishops' Overseas Network are on the scene but they can only do so much. Bishop

Vann has asked that parishes in the Diocese render financial help. We will send a gift from parish funds but I invite everyone who is able to make a private donation. You may do so by marking the memo line on your check: *Aid to the Philippines*. Place it in an envelope and drop it in the offertory basket or bring it to the office. We will then forward your donation to the Diocese.

This weekend Servites around the world celebrate the *Feast of All Saints and Blesseds of the Order* on November 16th and the *Feast of All Souls* on November 18th since the 17th is a Sunday. These men and women Saints and Blesseds followed the aspirations and ideals of the *Seven Holy Founders* and thus attained a special place among the heroes and heroines of another time. In a short history of the early days of the Order we read this description of those early Servants of Mary: *"The foundation story of the Servite Order does not provide a graphic picture of the personalities of its first brothers....But one thing is certain: these men (Founders) took a definite decision to be poor rather than to be rich. Of all the times and places, fortune especially favored thirteenth century Florence, Italy. In the light of this, it was truly a courageous decision to forsake the riches of the world and to choose instead to follow Christ as brothers, living in a spirit of poverty, service and devotion to the Virgin Mary. And it was this witness to the Gospel values that drew others to follow them and caused them to grow from a tiny lay group to a religious Order, and to spread down the centuries and across the world."*

The hospitable members of our Bereavement Committee extended their warm healing grace to the families of this parish last Monday evening with a parish-wide memorial Mass in remembrance of all those we buried from our community this past year. The members of this Committee do an outstanding job and serve the people of St. Juliana with their loving presence - I am so grateful for them. Our Adult Choir also provided music for this Mass that was truly a memorable gift to all in attendance. Thank you all for your talented dedication.

I enjoyed sampling the home-cooked eatables and visiting with all the vendors, volunteers, and patrons of the recent *Knights of Columbus Gourmet Night* in the Parish Center. The money obtained from this event will help fund the many charitable projects sponsored by our Knights. I extend my gratitude to Grand Knight, Brian Burley and all the volunteers for organizing this food and drink gala.

A few weeks ago I wrote a short piece in the bulletin about the need for volunteers to help with the food preparation at *Isaiah House*, the Catholic Worker house of hospitality in Santa Ana.

The response was so unexpected that we had more volunteers than needed. Nonetheless, the eight volunteers from the parish were given tasks from peeling vegetables, cutting melons, slicing bread, shredding lettuce to eventually serving over forty women who board at the house and more than 150 patrons at the Civic Center in downtown Santa Ana.

It was an amazing experience for me. These *Houses of Hospitality* envisioned by Dorothy Day and Peter Maurin in the 1930's shelter and feed thousands of men and women who otherwise would live on park benches and in underpasses without the basic necessities of life. It is simple and basic living. The food is wholesome and plain. The residents are polite, grateful, and healthy.

There were young men and women volunteers as well as students from various neighborhoods who also helped on that second Friday of November. They performed their tasks with gusto and moved about effortlessly talking to the women and providing conversation on a variety of topics. It's a blessed ministry housed in a vintage multi room home with an extensive protected patio and room to move about. Many of the residents brought their pets with them who would otherwise have been impounded and they too move about freely and are well fed.

If you are interested in volunteering, St. Juliana's time to help is the second Friday of the Month. Barbara Dietterle and Deacon Gerhard Stadel are our parish contact persons. If you are unable to help but would like to make a gift to replenish their pantry or maintain the home, a check made out to St. Juliana for Isaiah House will then be brought to the administrators for their use.

There are copies of *The Catholic Worker* newspaper in church along with *The Orange County Catholic* which will be published weekly.

Once again St. Juliana will host the yearly *Interfaith Thanksgiving Service* in church on **Tuesday, November 26th at 7 pm** in church. Member faith communities of FIMA will be represented. I hope you will to attend.

Pope Francis wrote these words quoted in *The Catholic Worker*: *"This evening, I ask the Lord that we Christians, and our brothers and sisters of other religions, and every man and woman of good will, cry out forcefully: violence and war are never the way to peace! Let everyone be moved to look into the depths of his or her conscience and listen to that word which says: Leave behind the self-interest that hardens your heart, overcome the indifference that makes your heart insensitive towards others, conquer your deadly reasoning, and open yourself to dialogue and reconciliation. Look upon your brother's sorrow and do not add to it, stay your hand, rebuild the harmony that has been shattered; and all this achieved not by conflict but by encounter! May the noise of weapons cease! War always marks the failure of peace; it is always a defeat for humanity. Let the words of Pope Paul VI resound again: "No more one against the other, no more, never...war never again, never again war!"*

Reflecting on God’s Word: Worlds do change. They come and they go. One day we simply stop climbing up on our mother’s or father’s lap. Or we quit reading comic books, or put away our Barbies®, or we begin to notice beauty. It happens more than once in a lifetime. We pass the exam and get our driver’s license, and in a moment all of childhood’s boundaries crumble. We graduate from school and our days become our own, sometimes frighteningly so. We move away from home and realize we can no longer return, not to the way it once was. And while we think all those moments are of our own doing, in truth they are not, none of them. They come upon us as does November out of autumn, and frequently just as bleak. The temples of our lives that we’ve adorned not only with precious stones but also with precious memories and treasured ways, are always being torn down without one stone left upon another. And no one ever asks our permission.

The new worlds we fear the most, however, are not the ones that change our outer landscapes so much as the ones that can reshape our inner landscapes. For believers, for those who live by the ways of Jesus, it is faith that offers us the willingness to trust and the courage to continue on. Jesus’ vision can become the one still point in our ever-changing world, or the one source of life and love when all else is collapsing.

DIOCESE OF ORANGE FOR CHRIST FOREVER CAMPAIGN

Diocesan Update: Thanks to the outstanding leadership of our pastors, priests, and parish leadership and the generosity of more than 18,000 donors, our *For Christ Forever* capital campaign reached 70% of our goal!

As of November 7, 2013, we are happy to report \$70.6 million in pledges throughout the Diocese.

(The average pledge is \$3,922.)

Pledge Totals Surpass \$567,695 at St. Juliana Falconieri Church!

The *For Christ Forever* Campaign Committee would like to thank all the families and individuals who have contributed to date and have made the diocesan campaign a great success. We have received **\$567,695** in pledges from 136 St. Juliana Parish individuals and families. At this time, we are awaiting a response from over 1,340 of our parish families. We hope to hear from those families very soon. Currently, we are at 41% of goal from only 9.2% of our parish. **Please keep in mind that since we have surpassed our 2013 PSA goal in cash, we will now receive 25% of all monies collected up to our campaign target of \$1,287,473 and 50% of all funds raised above and beyond that target.**

**One of our parish goals is to have 100% participation. Let's continue being bold by being Catholic!
TOGETHER we are doing GREAT things!**




