

This past week Servite Friars from parishes and communities across the United States gathered at Mater Dolorosa Retreat House in Sierra Madre. This has been a popular location for our annual retreat and Provincial Chapter. Nestled in the foothills surrounding Sierra Madre, Mater Dolorosa is the perfect setting for quiet reflection and group meetings. The Chapter this year was a time of renewal. Elections and change of personnel happens every three years. Our next Chapter of elections will be in 2015.

A special moment in the Chapter occurred on Wednesday, June 19th, the official feast day of *Saint Juliana*. Members of the Chapter gathered here at St. Juliana for a special Mass and reception. My thanks to the parish choir, Secular Servites, staff, leadership and our bereavement committee who provided salads and dessert for welcoming and hosting this special moment in our Servite life.

This weekend we have our parish celebration of *Saint Juliana*. On Sunday afternoon following the 11am Mass we will picnic with each other and join in group festivities on the lawn. Surprises galore and good food will welcome all who attend. I am hoping for a large turn-out of families, especially children.

St. Juliana is the first and most important woman saint in the Servite religious family. She was beatified in 1678 and canonized in 1737. She made her act of complete self-giving at the age of about fifteen into the hands of St. Philip Benizi, O.S.M., from who she received the habit of a Servite oblate; this would date her birth somewhere around 1270. She lived at home until her parents died, and then gathered around her a group of companions to found a community of consecrated virgins. This was achieved on July 3, 1332. She died on June 19, 1341, and many miracles began to occur at her tomb in the church of Santissima Annunziata in Florence. According to historical writings after her death, St. Juliana was the illustrious foundress of the enclosed nuns and the sisters of the Servite family. A particular devotion to the Holy Eucharist was an important part of her saintliness.

You may know that we have a branch of the *Order of Secular Servants of Mary* here at St. Juliana. The name of this local community of Secular Servites is: "*Saint Juliana of the Eucharist*." The Prior General of the Friar Servants of Mary has granted the Secular Order official status and is now canonically recognized as a true extension of the Servite family. The next meeting of the Secular Order will be this Wednesday, June 26th at 7 pm in the St. Juliana meeting in the Parish Center. Everyone is invited to learn more about the Secular Order.

During the summer months Mass attendance dwindles somewhat. I am sure that vacationers do their best to find a Catholic church while on the road. At times that may be difficult or impossible. In those moments, try to at least spend some part of an hour personally or as a family in prayer. If you have a copy of *Magnificat*, take it with you and pray the Mass together. If you have a prayer book or a bible find out what readings are used for the Sunday you will be away.

While away from the parish for vacation or business don't forget to hand in your offertory envelope or electronic pay to cover the Sundays of your absence. This is good stewardship and it

signals your willingness to ensure the financial well-being of the parish.

In his April 10, 2013 Audience, Pope Francis delivered these words to those in attendance: "*Being Christian is not just obeying orders but means being in Christ, thinking like him, acting like him, loving like him; it means letting him take possession of our life and change it, transform it and free it from the darkness of evil and sin...Let us show the joy of being children of God, the freedom that living in Christ gives us which is true freedom, the freedom that saves us from the slavery of evil, of sin and of death!*"

Recently, I came across the author Kathryn Schultz. In her book *Being Wrong*, she encourages her readers not to fear error. She sees it as inevitable, transformative and necessary for creativity.

Daniel Gilbert, author of *Stumbling into Happiness*, has done studies showing that all our worrying often just leads to unnecessary dread. In fact, even if the negative event we're concentrating on does occur, many people find that it's not as bad as all the dread they experienced beforehand. Our imaginations often take us to a darker place than reality does.

At the monthly meeting of FIMA (Fullerton Interfaith Ministerial Association) Michael Shepherd, the Housing and Community Engagement Manager of *Pathways of Hope*, presented the membership with a flyer alerting everyone to the groundbreaking ceremony and open house of a building project sponsored by *Pathways of Hope* (formerly known as FIES) on Tuesday, July 9th at 11:30am at 504 W. Amerige Avenue. *Pathways of Hope* has been serving families affected by hunger and homelessness since 1975 and one of the most successful programs has been a family transitional housing program in the Fullerton community since 1986 and with this new construction expanding to serve more families. As the weather warms, we will need to use air-conditioning more and more in church. One concern I have is that doors are often left open before and after Mass. Because the church doors are so heavy and awkward at times to open, ushers, parishioners, and visitors leave them open hoping to be of assistance to those who follow. This may seem reasonable and polite but it's working the air-conditioner harder as it attempts to keep up with the hot air entering the church. So I am asking ushers, parishioners, and anyone who may be reading the bulletin to please close the door behind you and not leave the doors open before and after Mass. If you find the door open before or after Mass during the week or on weekends, please close the door.

June 29th is the feast day of one of the Church's most famous converts: St. Paul. His feast is coupled with St. Peter. Both were giants of the early church. Every Catholic has a family member or friend who is far from the church, and it is often difficult to know what the right thing is to say or do to lead them in the right direction. Pray this week. Give good example. Invite. Learn together. *Rediscovering Catholicism* by Matthew Kelly is a good start.

- ~ Feast day - June 19th; patron saint of bodily ills and sickness
- ~ Born in Florence, Italy in 1270
- ~ Niece of Alexis, one of the canonized Seven Holy Founders of the Order of Friar Servants of Mary (Servites)
- ~ Women followed Juliana's religious lead and were clothed sisters of the Third Order of the Servites in 1332
- ~ Died - June 19, 1341
- ~ Canonized a saint on June 16, 1737

Fra Michele M. Poccianti chronicles St. Juliana Falconieri's life by noting, "...one reads that this very chaste virgin had so strong a devotion to the Passion of Christ that after death the image of Christ Crucified was found imprinted on her breast..."



AUXILLARY TEACHER SPOTLIGHT

Claudia Kellogg - Cantor and Choir Programs



My name is Claudia Kellogg. Besides directing the Cantor and Choir programs for St Juliana Elementary School, I am also the parish organist.

I started the cantoring program in 1992, about two years after I joined the faculty of the school. The Cantor program is an audition-only ensemble of ten students, open to grades 3 through 8. The Cantors meet once a week after school on Mondays. Students picked through auditions are trained to lead the school Masses, help out the Choir and solo for selected Sunday parish Masses, and sing at other events when needed. Most Cantors stay for the full school year. Some singers, because of school sports or other after school family commitments, will stay for only the first or second semesters.

The Choir is a non-audition, “y’all come and sing” group that is open to students in grades 2 through 8. Choir meets once a week after school on Tuesdays. The Choir, with the Cantors, sing for school Masses, selected parish Masses and a few non-school events during the school year. Like the singers in the Cantor program, most stay for the full school year, with a few staying for only one semester.

Both classes study basic choral and solo techniques, and music theory. Music is mostly religious to cover all the Masses we accompany. For the non-Mass assignments, we cover standard musical theater, folk and children’s music.






