



Summertime is here. When the radio announcer introduced the topic of weather and the official start of summer, I thought to myself, "What happened to spring, fall, and winter?" A little voice inside of me whispered, "You're not in Chicago my boy."

After four years here in southern California I still watch for climate change. I realize that there are seasons of a sort but much more subtle in character. I have lived most of my life in the Midwest and the onset of summer is so much more dramatic back there. After a lengthy winter and brief spring, the warm and humid days of early summer bring a happy respite.

Summer here at St. Juliana usually means a continuation of the sunny days and mild temperatures characteristic of this exceptionally beautiful climate. I didn't know much about the weather in Orange County at the time I was assigned to the parish four years ago. When some of my friends heard that I would soon leave for Fullerton, they knew right away that this would be a locale to relish sunny warm days and cool evenings---and no bugs!

When planning outdoor activities in the northern climate, planners are at the mercy of the weather. Every year when we had our annual parish feast day and carnival at St. Domitilla Servite parish in Hillside, Illinois where I spent eight years, three of the five days had rain. It never failed. Unlike those times, our parish feast day last Sunday was truly glorious. The weather was perfect. The attendance doubled last year's. The food was good, the games were fun, and the four car motorized train kept the little ones entertained for hours while the fire department and police cruiser fascinated the adults. And there were lots of balloons. I hope you stopped by after the 11 am Mass. If not, please mark your calendars for next year when we will celebrate St. Juliana's feast day on Sunday, June 29th. The previous Sunday, which is closer to the actual feast day on June 19th, is Corpus Christi, and while this would be a better choice, we are not allowed to change the Mass for that day.

Chair person, Julianna Tapia, the Knights of Columbus under the leadership of Brian Burley, the Secular Servites directed by Dave and Heather Lazaro, OSSM, the chili bake-off volunteers, Bill Jason with some of the scouts, and face painter *Sneakers the Clown* (Suzanne Martin) helped organize and execute the fun-filled day. At the end of the evening everyone helped to break-down the e-z up's and empty the waste containers. Of course, we would not have had electric outlets if handyman, professional painter, and nice guy Ray Silva hadn't dragged out all the cables and electric boxes we store for the annual Fall Festival.

As you already know that the second collection this weekend is for the annual "Peter's Pence Collection." By contributing to this collection you will be supporting our Holy Father, Pope Francis in his charitable works. This collection is taken up worldwide to support the most disadvantaged: victims of war, oppression, and natural disaster and others in need of emergency assistance. Your gift, large or small, makes you a pilgrim of

charity around the globe. During his pastoral visit to Cuba last year, Pope Benedict XVI proclaimed, "I come...as a pilgrim of charity, to confirm my brothers and sisters in the faith and strengthen them in the hope which is born of the presence of God's love in our lives." Our contributions will be combined with those from our brothers and sisters around the world to help the Holy Father reach out to those in need.

We have some future events scheduled for the parish that need reservations. Our Vacation Bible School summer program, "Kingdom Rock," takes place in the Parish Center from July 15-19 and children who wish to participate must register now. The theme of VBS is: "Stand Strong." The children will learn how God's love and the love of their family and church help them to stand strong. They will journey through medieval times while learning about God's love through drama, games, crafts, and scripture. Registration has been taking place for the past month and time is running out, so please call Mike McHenry at the faith formation office (714)-879-1965. Reservations are also necessary for the *Women's Silent Retreat* which will take place November 8-10, 2013 at Sacred Heart Retreat House in Alhambra. The theme of the retreat this year is "Year of Faith." The retreat director is Father Francis Benedict, OSB. Availability of private rooms is running out, so call soon.

A recent article appeared in the *National Catholic Register* in the section: *Culture of Life* written by Jim Graves. The title of the article, *Converts come to the church Like St. Paul* answers the question: "What Helped Your Conversion?" Jim Graves writes: *Every Catholic has a family member or friend who is far from the Church, and it is often difficult to know what the right thing is to say or do to lead them in the right direction.*

Many have been aided in their entry or return to the Catholic Church through the efforts of Tom Peterson, a former advertising executive who founded Catholics Come Home (CatholicsComeHome.org). Headquartered in Atlanta, the organization produces inspirational television commercials that reach out to those not practicing the faith.

Although not technically a convert, Peterson went from being a nominal Catholic to a zealous one. As he recalled, "I'd be there physically at Mass but I didn't follow the teachings of the Church." What called him to conversion, he said, were "people who spoke a common language with me and treated me with love and compassion." When an opportunity arises to talk about your faith, "keep it simple," he urged.

He also believes in connecting on a personal level with a potential convert: "When people showed they cared about me, listening to my questions and needs, they drew me in. I wanted to be more like them, and ultimately more like Christ."






“This is my 12th year teaching Physical Education and I love it. My students know my four “Rs” **Respect, Responsibility, Resourcefulness, and Ready**, and they come prepared each year to build on their previous year’s skills and apply them to new challenges. I believe that physical activity strengthens academic learning. I encourage my students to try new activities, care for one’s health through “Healthy For Life” tips each week, teach them the bones and muscles of the body, the Healthy Plate, and sportsmanship and fair play while practicing safety in all that they do.

“I build field goals for kicking, a small painted track on the field for running, balance circuit for strength, as well as atom and hazardous waste transfer, hula huts, tarp play, poppers, pilo polo, to just name a few fun things. The students learn about lacrosse, zumba, scooterboards, square, line, and wall dances, ropes, rhythm ribbons and sticks, create a tennis court, as well as the standard popular sports that end in “ball”. We can get 20 jumping a long rope at one time together while others are double dutch jumping. Music of all types warm the students up for a fun PE class.

“My students participate in the PAL track meet and After School Sports Program, the 8th grade builds and runs field day for the school during Catholic Schools Week, the 3rd grade goes to the Honda Center for the Ducks program, and 8th grade this year will participate in the Faley Special Games. 4th through 8th grade have a quarterly PE project or written assignment. Grades 4 through 8 participate in the California Fitness Gram.

“My students know they try their best at all times, realize that skill levels vary in a class, but know that they can always enjoy what they are doing and have fun. It is great to hear this was fun, I did it, I liked it, and I want to do this again.




