



A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE, O.S.M.



The readings this Sunday, 19th Ordinary Time Cycle A, remind us that we sometimes look for God in the wrong places or walk right past Him – looking for Him in the wrong places. Truly after an earthquake we are humbled, shamed, or simply caught off-guard and exclaim: "Oh, m-y GOD!" as if to inquire "Oh, m-y GOD what have I/we done to deserve this?" God did not cause an earth-quake to punish any of us, a drought to teach us a lesson, or strike lightening to kill, or cancer because we are bad. He doesn't cause rain

because we washed our car. That simply isn't the God we worship; He wishes our safety for He loves us.

As we gather for Eucharist, we pause and call to mind the times we have missed God. Missing the mark is called "sin." When have we lived for some-one who is not God, when have we longed for some-thing that is not God? Whom or what have we made into an idol? When have I diminished not only my Christian life but my human life? If the purpose of Christian living is: "to know, love, and serve God in this world so that I will be happy with Him in heaven" (a question with a star next to it in the Baltimore Catechism and many of us know what that means), when have I missed that mark?

The Penitential Act of the Mass is not to replace the Sacrament of Penance but to remind us that we do gather to receive God's all merciful love. Part of that act is to be mindful that God has forgiven our sins. We do not deserve this great gift, but we rejoice in His goodness and love. We need to recall when we were aware of His presence and give thanks for the graces we have received. We also need to recall when we missed His presence and promise to do better the next time.

Thus the Penitential Rite serves to remind us of a basic reason we have to give thanks to God. The emphasis is on the reconciliation Christ has won for us rather than on our sins. Listen, for example, to the language of the Roman Missal for the invocations to the Penitential Rite: "You were sent to heal the contrite; You came to call sinners; You plead for us at the right hand of the Father; You came to gather the nations into the peace of God's kingdom; You come in word and sacrament to strengthen us in holiness; You will come in glory with salvation for your people; You came to reconcile us to one another and to the Father; You heal the wounds of sin and division." Or simply: "Lord have Mercy, Christ have Mercy, Lord have Mercy." These invocations always focus on Christ and on God's forgiveness. This gives us good reason to give God thanks. May Almighty God have mercy on us, forgives us of our sins, and help us to be more aware of His presence, His grace, His love, His mercy in our ordinary gum-chewing daily life. AMEN!

Now, go off and honor a God moment. Watch the sun-rise, the sun-set, kids flying kites, hear the harrumph of the ocean, hold a baby until he/she falls asleep in your arms, walk the dog and talk to a neighbor, or sit on a bench at Disneyland and smile. Whatever makes you say: "WOW" just might make you aware of God's presence.

It is only after a "WOW" moment of recognizing God can you begin to pray honestly: "Glory to God in the Highest."





MESSAGE FROM THE DIOCESE OF ORANGE BORDER CRISIS FOR CHILDREN

What Is the Border Crisis All About? How Can I Help the Unaccompanied Children and Families?
Central American children from El Salvador, Guatemala and Honduras are migrating alone to the United States in record numbers. While not a new phenomenon, the number of children who are making the perilous journey alone has increased exponentially - 6,775, on average, arrived between 2003–2011, and upwards of 90,000 are projected to arrive in Fiscal Year 2014 (Sept). Multiple factors are contributing to the increase in forced child migration including: a lack of strong social institutions and civil society support, abuse in the family stemming from pressure on family units due to violence and family separation, a lack of viable economic and educational opportunities, and environmental factors affecting crop production. However, the overriding and overwhelming factor is generalized violence and corresponding breakdown of the rule of law threatening citizen security and creating a culture of fear and hopelessness.
