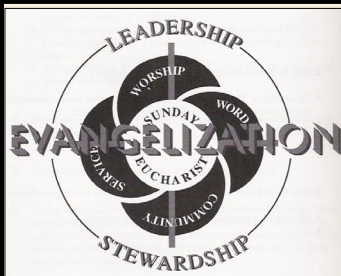

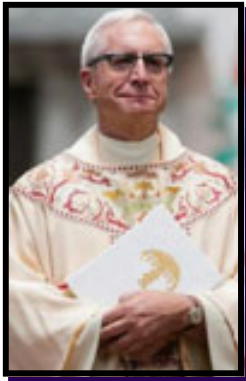

A MESSAGE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

The very best conclusion I have found to the faith, theology, and belief sequence comes from the theologian Richard McBrien: "If theology is faith brought to a level of self-consciousness, then belief is theology in a kind of snapshot or frozen state. Theology is a process: belief is one of its products." What we believe as a church is miles long.

There are many Christian beliefs. Some of these beliefs are called dogma, belief statements promulgated with the highest authority and solemnity. Its denial is heresy. While every dogma is a doctrine, not all doctrine is dogma. (Remember dogma has a bite and a bark!) Infallible statements are dogma. Doctrine is official teachings of the Church. And then there is a whole network of rivers of belief that, while important, are smaller cased beliefs and are part of national Churches, religious congregations, various pious groups, and individuals. To complicate matters yet more, the Church is governed by Canon Law and then lesser decrees such as norms, guidelines, and instructions. Not all documents from the Holy Father are of equal weight.

Although there is only one Christian faith, Christians have many beliefs. Some of these beliefs remain through time, others have changed. Given the years of our Tradition, some are old and some are new. It is important, in my opinion, to sort out which are essential to our experience of Jesus and his people today.

Which beliefs "looking into the signs of the times by the light of faith" give you strength to devote yourself to Jesus and to the service of the Gospel?

The parish speaker series continues Monday, May 11 at 7:00PM in the Church. Please invite your family and friends to hear Dr. Jacqueline Dupont, PhD, a gerontologist who will speak on "The Normal and Abnormal Signs of Aging." Now, don't roll your eyes backwards. Dr. Dupont has been very helpful to the Servite Friars as we age, I'm confident she will be important to you. Husbands and wives, adult children please plan on attending this discussion, it is for you. It's good to know what is normal and what is not normal behavior in the process of human aging. What might I need to be alarmed about and what is simply part of "new normal?" "I don't recall what lock this key opens!" – that's all right. If you can't remember they are keys, there is a problem. Only it's not that easy. Dr. Dupont is a treasure; please welcome her talk as a gift. More speakers on health and well-being are coming! Please take advantage of our offering.

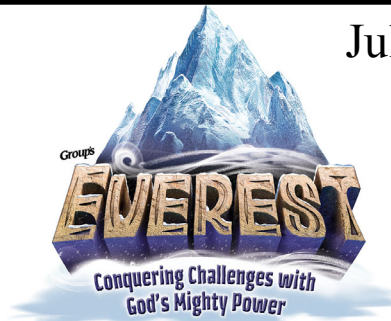

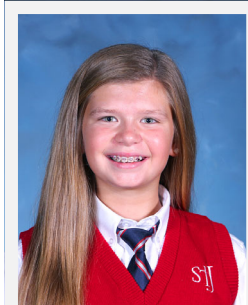
Dear Pope Francis,

I am a sixth grader at Saint Juliana School in Fullerton, California. We were told of your meeting with Vatican employees and lay people and how you gave them suggestions about how to live better, more holy lives. In the following paragraphs, I will be writing about three of the ten things you asked the people to do. I chose three quotes that have and will impact my life and other peoples' lives.

"Take care of your relationship with others, transforming your faith into life and your words into good works, especially on behalf of the needy." I chose this line because once, my friend admitted that she had never prayed the Our Father. She had been going to a public school her whole life. She said that she wished she would've wanted to learn but her family never had time. My other friend and I had to teach her the creed, the Our Father, and the responses at Mass on Sunday. She was grateful that we taught her and always is the first to stand or say a prayer at Mass. Even though she was my friend, I was able to teach her and influence her to be a better Catholic.

"Be careful of envy, lust, hatred and negative feelings that devour our interior peace and transform us into destroyed and destructive people." I chose this quote because everyone gets tempted once in awhile and it is hard to not fall into that trap. For example, when I am with a friend, a conversation might come up about other people. Unfortunately, this is called gossiping and it is hard not to do. Our minds can become very corrupt if we have a mindset to always say what people did wrong or that they are spoiled and have a few things that we don't. We should be thankful that we have double the amount of food that some children in poorer countries have. Sometimes, I look in my closet and say, "What should I wear today?" I would try on about five different outfits and say that none of them were right. If that little girl who only has one, maybe two clothing items that she owns walked into my closet, wow would she be happy! There are so many things that we take for granted every single day. All of us need reminders to keep us, along with our words, peaceful and full of love.

"Making sure your Christmas is about Jesus and not about shopping." During Christmastime these days, everything is about the shopping, the sales, and the toys. Nobody seems to remember the real reason that we are even here! Instead of buying a new gift for you or adding something else to your Christmas List, go buy a gift and donate it to the ones who may not get a gift. Some kids would think, "Are you kidding? I couldn't live with only one new toy a year!" These kids go crazy for one gift! Since I was little, my family has put on a Nativity play on Christmas Eve in place of opening an early gift, as some families do. This is one way that we stay true to the event when Jesus, our Savior, was born on that night! Next year, that will be my main focus To always thank God in my prayers at night.



Thank you for being such a great and wonderful teacher and leader for the Catholic Church. Someday, I would like to be half the person that you are. I will continue to try to live what you say but for now, I will try to perfect the quotes I wrote about.

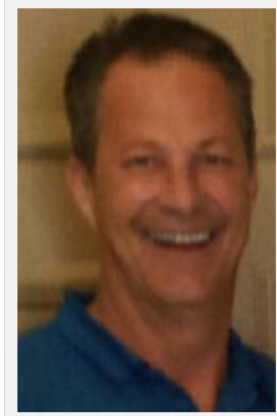

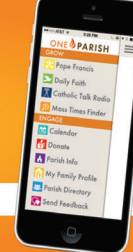

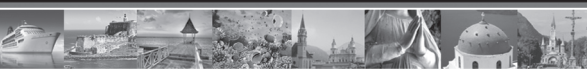
