
The vision of St. Juliana Falconieri Catholic Community is to live as a people of God with Christ at the center of our lives through liturgy, faith formation and community.





Let's begin a section on the gospels.

What are the Gospels? Seldom is it best to describe what something is by clarifying what it is not. Defining something by what it is not works with Non-Dairy Creamer and Non-Fat Milk, but not with a whole lot more. What the Gospels are not – biographies of Jesus. A reader expects a biographer to have some facts regarding the person's parents and early life, at least dates. The Gospels of Mark and John do not mention Jesus' infancy, John does not give the name of the mother of Jesus and Mark does not mention Joseph. Matthew and Luke, the two Gospels which mention Jesus' infancy are not alike. We cannot be sure of the source, the "Who saw it happen?" or "Who spilled the beans?" type of question. The Gospels are neither history books nor historical writing. The Gospels do describe events, a lot of events. Yet, after reading the Gospels we still do not know dates or a lot of historical data in any sense of history. But the Gospels do tell us what it means to "believe in Jesus and have faith and life through his name." (John 20:31)

The four Gospels are their own literary form; in their presentation they are unique. Clearly they aren't biography, history, non-fiction, fiction, science, science fiction, letters, poetry, drama, fantasy, or self-help.

What do they contain and how were they written? The Gospels originate in the words and deeds of Jesus, a real person of history. For ease let's put Jesus' life-time from 1AD to 33AD. During those years Jesus was born, grew up, and as an adult lived as an itinerate preacher who had followers. The Gospels take their origin from Jesus' own ministry, his words and works, the last part of his life. Those words and deeds went through some interpretation and adaptation from the time of his life and death until they became the Gospels. The infancy narratives, the first part of his life, however are not part of this period. They come before his public life.

From the time his audiences heard Jesus speak and the time the evangelists (Gospel writers) wrote is the time of "oral tradition." During that time the writers had the powerful insight of the resurrection which happened after Jesus' death. The resurrection influenced their writing profoundly. The biblical scholar, Fr. Raymond Brown, S.S. writes that the writers "infused their accounts of Jesus with a post-resurrection insight into his divinity, an insight they had not had when he was alive." Basically, once the evangelists knew the resurrection, the Gospels were written from death/resurrection to birth – end to beginning. The beginning of Jesus' life and his life itself had to point to the resurrection. This is not unlike the method of biographical or sports writing today. Knowing that Abraham Lincoln became the President of the Union, a biographer writes Lincoln's biography with the presidency looming in the future. Knowing that the Angels won the baseball game, the sports writer composes his copy knowing that the victory was theirs.

There is of course some unease when we say the Gospels are not literal history. If the teaching is not literal why or how is it Gospel? It is Gospel because it proclaims "Jesus is Lord" - come and believe in him. St. John writes: "[T]hese signs (words and deeds) have been recorded to help you believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, so that through this faith you may have life in his name." (John 20.31) This truth has been influenced greatly by the faith of the Gospel writer and the community for whom he wrote. Read the Gospels as writings which reveal Jesus as the Lord, to inspire belief and faith.

Some readers might pause and ask a questions regarding the source or the historicity of the Gospel teaching: "Whose testimony is this? Who spilled the beans? Was the person there and is the testimony of that person reliable?" Not a good place to start. Then the question of history: "Is this writing reliable and supported by history?" Not a real good reason to read the Gospels. How many Magi (Wise Men) were there? The Gospels give neither a number nor their names. Is the number of the multitude exact or the size of the stone jars precise? Read the Gospels not for their origin or historicity but for the way they reveal God in the person of Jesus. How do the Gospels, the Good News of Jesus, reveal Jesus to you, the reader?

Review, the first period of Jesus' life is his life including his ministry and resurrection. Let's say that lasts until about 33AD. The time of the Apostles' preaching - that's the period of "oral tradition." Fix 33-65AD as that period. Finally comes the writing of the Gospels; Mark most likely in the late 60s AD, Matthew and Luke in the 70s-80s AD, John in the late 80s-90s AD. It is plausible that many, even most of the actual apostles, were dead during the period of Gospel writing.



JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY

October 16, 2016

Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Though Jesus told today's parable more than two thousand years ago, human nature hasn't changed: we recognize both characters instantly. The merciless judge represents the corruption that has short-circuited justice throughout history; the distraught widow, society's perennially powerless, marginalized to what Pope Francis calls the "peripheries" by those who wield power but lack the mercy that could transfigure society with compassion. To confront such reality, Jesus bids us, "pray always without becoming weary" (Luke 18:1). Prayer opens our eyes to see others from Jesus' perspective, and leads us to work for justice by coming to the aid of others with what Pope Francis extols as a higher standard, mercy. Thus, when Jesus asks, "Will not God secure the rights of [God's] chosen ones? Will [God] be slow to answer?" (18:7). We respond by making God's liberating work for others our own. "[W]hen the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?" (18:8). Yes, we respond—and mercy!






