



The Gospels: Lesson III

Of the four Gospels, Matthew, Mark, and Luke are very similar. As such they are called the *Synoptic Gospels*. That Greek word is nothing to be afraid of, it means: can be seen together or seen through the same eyes. The Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke are so similar that they can be arranged in three parallel columns with Matthew (Mt) on the left, Mark (Mk) in the middle, and Luke (Lk) on the right and pretty much match up. The quick conclusion is that both Mt and Lk had copies of Mk's Gospel (it was the first one to be written) in one hand as each wrote his own Gospel. At other times Mark's column is empty but pretty much the same lesson is taught by Mt and Lk. Ah! That is the second source, commonly called the "Q" or "Quelle" source. "Q" is a batch writing containing sayings, lessons, and narratives that are attributed to Jesus which Mt and Lk had but were not used by Mk.

Mt and Lk also each have their "special section" – their individual "secret sauce." This is the special material Mt and Lk use to address their particular audiences and purposeful way of writing. Mt is composed of Mk, part "Q" and part just Mt. Lk is written with Mk, part "Q" and part just Lk. Mk is Mk without Mt, Lk, or "Q." What was just described is called the "Two Source Theory."

Mk was the first to write this new form of literature, Gospel, and he did so perhaps in the year 70AD. The Gospel leaves the author anonymous. We do not know Mark. It is believed that he knew Peter and from this friendship he wrote down what Peter remembered of Jesus' words and deeds. Mark wrote for an audience of Jews and Gentiles.

Matthew's Gospel is a good revision of Mk's Good News. Mt wrote primarily for a Jewish audience but with huge appeal to Gentiles. The theology of the long genealogy of Jesus tells us that Jesus is the "Christ, the son of David, the son of Abraham." Then at the Sermon on the Mount Jesus, now presented as the New Moses, takes his seat on the mountain and teaches the Good News and the new law, the Beatitudes. Imitating the first five books of the Bible, the Pentateuch, the Gospel of Mt can be divided into five discourses each distinguished with a beginning and ending. We guess that Mt wrote his Gospel close to 85AD. Again, the Gospel does not identify the author.

Luke wrote two dynamic volumes, the Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles. The Gospel is the "Good News of Jesus Christ." The Acts of the Apostles is the "Good News of the Spirit-led Church." Lk most likely wrote his Gospel after Mk, he certainly had a copy of the first Gospel and a good guess is he had it shortly after it was written. Most likely, Lk also wrote in the 80s. He must have been an educated man, he wrote in Greek very fine Greek at that. We are taught that Lk wrote in Greek for Greeks.

The Gospel of John (Jn) is different from the other three. His audience is for everyone who will "believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, so that through this faith you may have life in his name." This Gospel emphasizes Jesus' divinity more than the others do. Such an emphasis is noticed quickly in the opening: "In the beginning was the Word: the Word was in God's presence and the Word was God... The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us..." Most likely it was written between 90-100AD.

The Gospels were written long ago. Today, their lessons are so familiar to every believer that they become "same-old." They no longer teach the challenging reform of one's life. Practice reading each Gospel lesson as if you are hearing it for the first time. Put yourself in the audience. Assuming you are not always Jesus, do you recognize Jesus Christ our Lord? How do you hear the Good News of the "Kingdom of God?" How do you react to what you see, hear, and feel? What do you need to do to "believe in Jesus so that through this faith you may have life in his name"?

Believe what you read. Practice what you believe!

The enhancements of the interior of the church have begun. Let us pray that the work we undertake will continue to provide a suitable place for prayer and worship of Our Lord for all who enter our doors.

Remember that on the weekends of Nov. 19/20, 26/27, and Dec. 3/4 Mass will be celebrated in the Parish Center. There will be no Mass on Friday, Nov 25th. There will be no morning or evening Mass on Saturday, Nov 26th. Confessions are also cancelled on Nov. 26th. First Saturday Mass on December 3rd is cancelled.

Please plan on attending our Mass on Thanksgiving Day Morning at 9:00AM, a most wonderful way to join as a community to give thanks to God for all He does for us every day. Might the football games begin after Mass?

All Saint's Day Masses, November 1st, will be in our church at 6:30AM, 8:00AM, and 7:00PM. Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will take place from after the 8:00AM Mass to before the 7:00PM Mass on Tuesday, Nov. 1st. Please join our community when we recall all the Faithful of this parish who died in the past year on Sunday, November 6th at the 9:00AM Mass. We will host families and friends in the Parish Center after Mass. Our Parish Ministry Fair will also be celebrated on November 6th. Please come and consider how you might participate as an active member of your faith community.

JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY

October 30, 2016

Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time

Last Sunday's Gospel gave us a tax collector's beautiful prayer to take with us from this *Jubilee Year of Mercy*. Today, another tax collector's encounter with Jesus offers a comforting memory to cherish, but also a challenging mission to embrace. Zacchaeus' short stature (see Luke 19:3) matched how contemptible, socially and spiritually, Zacchaeus' religious acquaintances considered tax collectors to be. Jesus counters that judgment with mercy. Radical sin meets unmerited grace. God seeks and finds the lost; a sinner's home becomes salvation's house. The sinner "quickly" welcomes salvation "with joy" (19:6), while the righteous grumble judgmentally at God's mercy. Mercy challenges us, too. Like Zacchaeus, we have been sought and found by Jesus, called by name to welcome Jesus into our heart's home. Therefore, we must go forth from this *Jubilee Year of Mercy* as "missionaries of mercy," seeking our fellow sinners with Jesus, receiving them with joy (see 19:6) as cherished brothers and sisters, and joyfully offering our judgment-free hospitality as Jesus' own "Welcome home!"




“OH, WHEN THE SAINTS COME MARCHING IN!”

Second Collection next weekend, November 5-6 for Military Service

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) approved a special triennial collection for the AMS in November 2012. The first National Collection for the AMS was timed to coincide with Veterans Day November 2013 and raised more than \$8,239,000. The second National Collection for the AMS will be taken in dioceses and parishes across the country in 2016, for most at Masses the weekend of 5-6 November, or as otherwise determined by an individual diocese or parish.

The Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA (AMS) was established by Saint John Paul II in 1985 to provide the Catholic Church's full range of pastoral ministries to those in the United States Armed Forces. The mission of the Archdiocese is to "serve those who serve" by providing the same pastoral care and services as any other Catholic diocese to Catholics serving in the United States Armed Forces, enrolled in U.S. Military Academies, undergoing treatment at any of the 153 Department of Veterans Affairs' Medical Centers in the U.S., Puerto Rico and Guam, working in civilian jobs for the federal government beyond U.S. borders, and the families of these populations. Programs and services vital to the unique mission and ministry of the Archdiocese include *Vocations, Evangelization and Catechesis, Sacramental Records, Tribunal, and Veterans Affairs*.

The AMS Office of Vocations informs and supports men exploring a priestly vocation and provides opportunities for vocation awareness and discernment with a focus on the military chaplaincy. The AMS Co-Sponsored Seminarian Program is a partnership with local dioceses and religious communities around the country. Currently, the AMS partners with 23 dioceses across the U.S. with 28 co-sponsored seminarians studying in 16 seminaries. As many as 20 additional candidates are in-processing for 2016 and, since the fall 2014, 113 candidates have been on one or more of the AMS discernment retreats and expressed interest in the Co-Sponsored Seminarian Program and military chaplaincy. Once a seminarian is in the Co-Sponsored Seminarian Program, the AMS covers half of the costs to his home diocese for priestly formation.

In 2016, three priestly ordinations and one transitional diaconate ordination are expected. Twelve priests are currently serving as priests in their home dioceses before they will begin ministry as active duty military chaplains. In 2015, three new co-sponsored priests joined a branch of the military. The Nation and the Church continue to depend on this generation of future priests to relieve a chronic shortage of Catholic chaplains in the military. At the same time AMS vocations programs have surfaced numerous other vocations to the priesthood and religious life who do not intend to serve as chaplains!

The AMS receives no funding from the military or the government in support of the aforementioned programs and relies solely on private donors. The AMS annual operating budget is over \$6.8 million, which includes the cost of maintaining an archive of more than 3 million sacramental records, a tribunal to adjudicate marriage annulments and other issues of canon law, and a religious education and faith-formation program. Additionally, the AMS average annual share of expenses for the Co-Sponsored Seminarian Program is more than \$2.8 million over the next five years. The AMS average annual cost per seminarian is \$18,000.

While the Government is reducing the size of the Armed Forces, the world situation, as we have repeatedly and dramatically witnessed both at home and abroad, continues to make the need for a strong military more evident. It is imperative that the Catholic faithful who defend our religious freedom do not have to sacrifice theirs.



The PSA funds are fully utilized on an annual basis and require replenishing to keep these vital ministries operating. Currently in its 37th year, the PSA was initiated by Bishop Johnson for the people of our growing diocese to join together to build up the Church in Orange County. Our subsequent Bishops McFarland, Brown and now Bishop Vann believe that the PSA is necessary to continue to fund the important ministries and services that serve all Catholics in our Diocese as well as thousands of those in the community.

Why does PSA also support Catholic education? The PSA supports annual tuition assistance grants to Catholic elementary schools in our diocese. For example, the funds raised for the 2014 PSA were granted to schools for the 2014-2015 school year. The funds raised through the For Christ Forever capital campaign are invested in an endowment which is a permanent fund that will provide annual income to the schools to supplement the PSA funding and other resources.
