



A review of the Sacraments

For the past several weeks, we have weathered a short course on the seven sacraments of the Roman Catholic Church. Let's review and finish! The "old" definition still works: "A sacrament is an outward sign instituted by Christ to give grace." The sacraments point to something greater than what is happening before our eyes. The acts and items and prayers of the sacraments reveal our salvation. The oil, water and prayers of Baptism, bread, wine, and words of consecration of Holy Eucharist, the chrism and prayers of Confirmation, the confession of sin, act of contrition, words of absolution of Penance, the healing oil and prayers of the Sacrament of the Sick, the chrism, prayers, and laying on of hands of Holy Orders all point to the grace of God which we receive through the "merits of Jesus Christ."

Through the sacraments we Catholics are led to conversion and from conversion, to salvation. They are the chief ways that we "find God." God reveals himself in our gestures and through the "ordinary things" of water, oil, bread, and wine. Yet these very ordinary things, as signs, point away from themselves to some One much greater. And that much greater is God. The grace of the sacraments make us holy. Therefore, the one baptized becomes a "new creation."

We use language and the ordinary to reach God. What other means do we have? Be attentive to the presence of the sacred in each sacrament. It is God who is speaking to us; God is acting, God is our direction. Put another way, the sacraments point the way to God to the Beatific Vision, the end of our life's journey.

This language and direction might be new! It can be a challenge. Don't Christians simply seek Jesus Christ? Well, yes and no. In "the Last Discourse" John 14-17, Jesus makes it clear that to see him is to see his Father. It is precisely in the conversation with Philip that Jesus says: "Have I been with you so long, and yet you do not know me, Philip? He who has seen me has seen the Father..." God is revealed in Jesus. If you forget all the rest, please remember this: "The greatest gift God has given to us is that in Jesus, God has let us in on the secret of who He (God) is and what He is all about." Our journey is toward God, it is the face of God that we seek. Listen to who we address in the prayers of the Mass: "We give you praise, FATHER (capitals are mine) most holy for you are great..." "You are indeed Holy and to be glorified, O God..." "Therefore, holy Father as we celebrate the memorial of Christ your Son..." The problem, if problem, is the right word, is this: we are made Christians, we are asked to believe in Jesus Christ before we become Theists, believers in God. Too often, we confess "absolute" belief in Jesus but remain unable to express understanding or belief in God.

We belong to the Christian Church, specifically the Roman Catholic Christian Church. Many people today claim a certain spirituality, a belief in God. At the same time, many people do not belong to any religious community, any community which is a confession of faith and a cult of worship. In our community we believe in God and as a community we celebrate the many ways that God continues to reveal Himself so that we are in a relationship with Him. Some of those ways are called sacraments. Let us celebrate our conversion – with knowledge, emotional response, and moral acts because through a prayerful reception of each sacrament we encounter and deepen our relationship with God and Jesus, His Son. As we celebrate the sacraments, let us "put on the personality of Jesus." We are changed and for the better. If not, why would we do it?

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

This month, parishes around the country will conduct the “October count,” a measure of attendance at Sunday Mass. The measure has been taken for many centuries, and in some European dioceses it is possible to measure the level of engagement in worship by the population over the course of many centuries. Long ago, it was also the custom to track “Easter duty” by a statistical report. Penitents would receive a kind of chit at confession, which they would then turn in at their parish church when they received Holy Communion during Easter time.

Long ago, of course, Communion was fairly rare in the life of a Catholic Christian, perhaps only once a year. The chits would be tallied by parish priests and reported to the chancery, which in turn would hold on to the records and include the statistics in a report to the Vatican every five years. Nowadays, the October count has proved especially critical in the life of our Church as bishops use the figures to measure the vitality of church life, to sketch parish boundaries, and even to decide when to close, merge, or form new parishes.

JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY

October 9, 2016
Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time
Jubilee of Marian Devotion

This weekend, the Jubilee honors Mary under the title Pope Francis suggests, “Mother of Mercy.” Recall the Good Samaritan Gospel. Priest and Levite saw suffering but showed no mercy. Recall the rich man, who never saw Lazarus right before his eyes, and showed no mercy. Today, Jesus sees ten lepers from afar and shows extraordinary mercy. Mary’s entire life, declares Francis, was modeled on Jesus, “Mercy-Made-Flesh.” Indeed, standing at the cross, Mary saw Jesus’ mercy take flesh when Jesus showed mercy to the executioners. So Pope Francis recommends we frequently pray the *Salve Regina*, Hail, Holy Queen, asking her to ever look upon us with mercy, so that we might be worthy to gaze upon the face of her merciful Son Jesus. May we do so not only in eternity, but here and now, opening our eyes to see Jesus in others, and our hearts to serve Jesus in others by loving deeds of unconditional mercy. —Peter Scagnelli, Copyright © J.
