



~ A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M. ~

Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist are the three Sacraments of Initiation into the Roman Catholic Church. The “Good work of God” that is begun in Baptism is completed with Confirmation and Holy Communion. Once initiation is complete the Christian is, as St. Augustine put it, “another Christ.” The fully initiated Christian is described as “A chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a purchased people to proclaim the praises of him who has called you out of darkness into his wonderful light, you who were not a people are now the People of God.” (I Peter 2.9-10).

Baptism is the cause of Confirmation. The Sacrament of Confirmation “perfects” Baptism in as much as it completes baptism. In the prayers of the celebration, the bishop instructs the candidates that they are called to be “witnesses to Christ and more perfect members of the church.” Baptism is the cause of Confirmation.

Historically, Baptism and Confirmation were linked together as one ceremony. The ceremony included the prayer over the one to be initiated (laying on of hands), the anointing with oil and the seal of the Holy Spirit. This was all celebrated by the local priest. Confirmation became a separate ritual in the mid- 400s, when it was celebrated by the bishop who made his rounds to all the churches in his region to visit and pray with the faithful and collect donations (read taxes!). Various reflections, theologies, of the sacrament have influenced its meaning today. Our understanding and celebration of the Sacrament is primarily a result of the Council of Trent in 1547 and its Catechism in 1566.

Confirmation is the celebration of Christian maturity. In it one accepts the faith and the responsibility that comes with being an adult disciple of Christ and a member of his Church. The Sacrament of Confirmation enables the faithful one receiving it, who was most likely baptized as an infant, the opportunity to make a public witness of his or her intentional conversion and growth in a religious journey toward Jesus. While the infant was baptized passively, he/she is rather active in Confirmation.

Let us pray that our newly Confirmed will be “sealed with the Gifts of the Holy Spirit” especially with courage to continue to grow in the faith resisting temptations to do otherwise. Often we joke to those who receive First Holy Communion, they are not receiving their “last communion” – for those who are confirmed may your Confirmation not be a graduation ceremony where the confirmed have completed the course requirements and leave, commencing life outside of the Church and the Holy Spirit.

In the Sacrament of Holy Eucharist we remember what has been passed onto us: “That Jesus took bread and wine...That he blessed bread and wine...that he shared the bread and the wine...and asked that these actions be continued in his memory” (ICor. 11: 23-26). Eucharist refers to the entire gesture of giving thanks, for that is what the word means. The Eucharist is THE MEAL OF THANKSGIVING. As Confirmation consigns Baptism, in the Eucharist we give thanks to God for all that He has done in the past, does in the present, and will do in the future.

Holy Communion allows members of the Church to be in full communion with the Church. First Communion is a beginning of a continuing communion, not an end in itself.

The easy definition and description of Holy Eucharist is that it represents the Last Supper of the Lord. As Baptism is celebrated at the command of Jesus: “Go and make disciples” (Matt. 28:19-20), Eucharist follows Jesus’ command “whenever you do this, remember me.” It is the word of Jesus that produces this sacrament. Because of this, the Eucharist is the Real Presence of Jesus as bread broken and wine shared. When we associate our understanding of the Eucharist with the Last Supper, the true meaning of Holy Communion will come to light.

Be especially careful not to refer to the Eucharist as a symbol. Once consecrated the bread and the wine are changed in substance (transubstantiation) into the body and blood of Jesus. The Body of Christ we share is the Body of the risen and glorified Jesus, thus it is a sharing in his resurrection. The Bread that we share and the Cup from which we drink is real food, the Real Presence of Jesus.

If you received First Holy Communion or the Sacrament of Confirmation this weekend – the St. Juliana Falconieri Faith Community is proud because of you! You are courageous. Grow in your relationship with Jesus, be guided by the Holy Spirit in your life, know of the support of this community, and “Glorify the Lord by the way you live your life.” If you are the parent(s) of those who received the sacraments, thank you for your support, encouragement, and trust in the St. Juliana Faith Community. Together we are disciples, intentionally living as the Lord asks us to live our faith. Finally, to those who teach the youngsters and form them in their faith as religious educators, be proud and take courage, we can’t do it without you! To all; be faithful to Jesus who is always faithful to you. God bless.

JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY

Sixth Sunday of Easter

6th Grade: 1st Place Winner

Dear Pope Francis,

My name is Keira and I am in the 6th grade at St. Juliana Falconieri School, which is located in Fullerton, California. We were told that you have ten New Year's Resolutions that will help us live better, holier, and happier lives. I chose three resolutions that have impacted and will impact my life and the lives of others. The three resolutions are simple phrases or sayings that we should learn from and continue to value in our life.

The first resolution I chose was "Don't gossip." I chose this resolution because when you gossip, while it may seem like you have done no wrong, you could actually negatively impact the person you were gossiping about tremendously. Your gossip could make the person cry or feel empty inside, especially if you said something bad about him or her. Your gossip could also make him or her mad enough to start saying bad things about you. It's best not to talk about people behind their backs. We can apply this in our lives by thinking about ourselves, and all of the ways we can be better people, instead of spending time talking about how other people can be better people. If we wouldn't gossip, I definitely think that the world will become a happier place.

In my daily life, I can apply this when talking with friends outside of school. While I might be tempted to start talking about other "mean" people in the class and the children who are "spoiled," I realize that I am just about to enter the "gossip trap," as I like to call it. Instead, I can turn my attention and words by saying, "Do you want to play a game?" or "What do you like best about school?" I also have been the victim of gossiping, because I am sensitive and I try to be "perfect," and other people have chosen to say negative things about this behind my back. I realize that being "perfect" isn't what is important in life; it is being kind to others and not gossiping about them even though you might be angry with a particular person. I think that all of us need reminders in life that we, along with our words, need to be full of love.

The second resolution I picked was "Make it a Habit to 'ask the Lord'." I picked this resolution because it is important to pray.
