



~ A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M. ~

Let's recall: three sacraments to initiate us into the Catholic Christian community – Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Communion. The two sacraments for healing are Penance and the Sacrament of the Sick. Now two more are linked as "The Sacraments of Service and Communion," they are Matrimony and Holy Orders. I flipped a coin and chose matrimony first.

This might come as a surprise, the wedding celebration of let's call them Mary and Joseph from engagement to honeymoon day has become a multi-billion dollar industry in itself. When, where, and how does the Roman Catholic Church fit into this day? How does the priest and the ritual of the Roman Catholic Church fit into this "industry" without causing conflict to the couple or compromise to the Church? Is the priest and the church as meaningful, forget purposeful, as bridal showers, invitations, photographers, florists, reception beverages, reception food, dancing, and honeymoon send off? Are Joseph and Mary as attentive to the priest as they are to their private wedding coordinator and reception manager? Will the private coordinator work with the church coordinator? Is the father of the bride happy about the bills, and tolerant of his daughter? (ha!) Last question: Will their wedding day and marriage itself let all people who attend the ceremony and enjoy the friendship of the couple know that Jesus is in the picture?

Joseph and Mary, married in the Roman Catholic Church, are on a journey to salvation. By their marriage in the Church, they are a living sign that Jesus is alive in their relationship. It is Jesus' love for others that they imitate. Together for life, Mary and Joseph help each other to "pursue holiness."

American Civil Society – perhaps an oxymoron (you'll laugh tomorrow morning) - celebrates our Independence Day weekend.

Independence speaks of our freedom(s). Today we celebrate that we are "Free from the bonds (of the leadership) of those with whom we have been connected, we are a people free to create and celebrate a new government deriving its just powers from the consent of the governed." From that great document, The Declaration of Independence, our nation's first leaders wrote the Constitution of the United States which begins with these three words: "We the People."

"Freedom from" gives "we the people" the awesome duty to be a people who are "free to be." Our freedom from came at the cost of a Revolutionary War. Our freedom to be comes at the cost of great responsibility.

It is our responsibility to safeguard the unalienable rights of each person. These unalienable rights are those rights given by their God, their Creator. This means that as a people we must respect each person as a being of dignity. It means we must be prudent and just.

By the "facts submitted to a candid world," a most wonderful phrase of the Declaration of Independence let the world's population experience us as the Americans we claim to be. Allow those same facts to show that we are Catholic Christians living our lives rooted in the command of Jesus to love one another.

We are Independent from the rule and ruler of Great Britain, but we are not free from each other. Nor are we free from the command of Jesus.

Today, celebrate being with each other. Do what is most American, welcome relatives, neighbors, strangers, and your parish priests (!). Play baseball, play the cornhole toss game, and horse shoes. Swim and dance. Eat American Food today, not Italian sausage and peppers but hot dogs and potato chips. Please do not put ketchup on a hot dog.

I invite you to begin your Fourth of July by celebrating Mass with our faith community at 9:00AM.

JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY

July 3, 2016


Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Last Sunday, Jesus rebuked James and John for wanting to “call down fire from heaven” (Luke 9:54–55) on an unwelcoming town. As he sends forth disciples today, Jesus again forbids retaliation against non-receptive listeners (10:10–11), showing us how to be Jesus’ “missionaries of mercy” this Jubilee Year of Mercy. Like the first disciples, we are sent not to proclaim ourselves but Jesus. As Jesus sent them in pairs, so are we also to work together in the community of the Church. We often describe the Church as Isaiah describes Jerusalem in today’s first reading, our comforting, nurturing Mother (Isaiah 66:13). So, going forth gently, like lambs among wolves (Luke 10:3), we share comforting peace, nurturing food and drink (Luke’s image for Eucharist), and Jesus’ healing promise of unfailing, unconditional mercy (10:5, 7, 9). Thus Jesus bids us proclaim the kingdom of God by showing what God’s kingdom looks like in action. “Go, preach the Gospel,” Pope Francis’ saintly namesake of Assisi is said to have instructed his first friars, “and when necessary, use words!”



PEACE

The greeting of peace at Mass adds substance to a message of today's readings: peace is relational. When we greet in peace the person near us at Mass, we share the touch of a handshake or embrace, sincere eye contact, and friendly words.

The scriptures speak of a similar peace. The first reading from Isaiah describes the peace of the holy city, Jerusalem, a place of prosperity and comfort where the "LORD's power shall be known to his servants" (Isaiah 66:14c).

The Christian understanding of peace changes slightly. Paul writes of the "peace and mercy" on all who are created anew. Jesus describes a feeling of peace that will rest on those who accept his disciples and their message.

Peace is both an absence of strife and a personal blessing. May we always and sincerely bring peace to our own lives as we share it with others.
