



Marriage class continued, Lesson VI

Fr. Guy presided at the happy marriage of Lena and Aldo. The rehearsal was easy because it was planned and the participants respected the church. The wedding ceremony was a sacred moment with some humor. The prayerful ritual flowed nicely. Mr. Gentile cried as he walked his only daughter the length of the church aisle. Aldo remarked that it was the longest wait of his whole life! Fr. Guy's homily was spot on. He mixed a message of marriage, love, the Scriptures that were read, a life together, with some of what he knows about the couple into the homily message. He also picked up some information (read: dirt) on them at the wedding rehearsal dinner. There was some laughter and some moments to reflect on what it means to take responsibility for the other for the rest of your life. He commented on love and pointed to the crucifix as THE image of love. A subtle look of horror if not fright came over the faces of many! Most of those attending the ceremony received Holy Communion. Although the final musical piece was called a "march," Aldo and Lena walked out into happily ever after!

Fr. Brown continued to prepare Joseph and Mary for the sacrament of Matrimony. With some difficulty they completed the Engaged Encounter weekend. The accommodations were not those of a quality hotel and because the food was less than appealing to her, Mary didn't eat much of it. As Fr. Brown continued with them, they admitted that the weekend was a help to their communication skills and taught them how to live as a married couple. Joseph remarked that actually Fr. Brown's preparation has been quite good for him and not nearly as difficult as what one of the other couples had to complete for Fr. McTavish at St. Anthony the Hermit parish. With all the paper work and counseling completed, Joe and Mary finished their final appointment with Fr. Brown.

After they met with Fr. Brown they met with the music coordinator. That meeting was difficult. In high school Mary starred in "My Fair Lady" and thought "*Get Me To The Church On Time*" would be sung at her wedding. Ms. Fitzgerald, the church music coordinator, simply told her "No." Ms. Fitzgerald continued: "That song can be sung at the reception but not during the church ceremony." After some discussion and careful diplomacy, Catholic Church wedding music was planned. The music does not have to be Latin but it does have to be church appropriate.

Ms. Wright, the church coordinator, also met with Mary and Joe. That too became problematic. Along with a hired coordinator they already planned to have Joe's niece Zoey, age three, scatter rose petals down the church aisle. That is not allowed in the church. "Good Glory" cried Mary. "Nothing I want to do can be done! My dad will make it all acceptable; just wait until you talk with him. He's given money...." Ms. Wright continued; "Mary, you received a folder with the wedding ceremony guidelines of St. Dismas Parish, I gave it to you myself. What's more, I reviewed it with you before you left on your first meeting back in March." "Yeah, I remember but I didn't think it was serious. I didn't believe it all applied to me!" Mary responded. "Mary, it is serious. You are being married in the church," Ms. Wright continued. "Rules! Rules! Petty nonsense!" Mary countered. "Mary, these rules are for the safety of your guests and the dignity of the ceremony. Many of them are set by the Diocese itself and are out of our control. Others have come as a response to past problems. Still others to set a tone of a church and religious not secular and out-doors wedding" said Ms. Wright. Mary was frustrated. "Ms. Wright is your first name 'Always'?" she asked. Ms. Wright paused and spoke; "Mary and Joseph, let's work together. Fr. O'Malley has inherited some of these rules and brought a few with him from his previous parish, Our Savior of the Sheep."

Joseph broke into the conversation: "Ms. Wright, what do you expect of us and our guests? How do we need to be?" Ms. Wright continued: "Let's review the expectations. You and your guests, even if they are not Catholic are to observe proper behavior in a Catholic Church. No alcohol consumed on the church grounds by anyone. No water bottles or drinks brought into the church. Do not scatter or throw anything. Do not affix flowers to the ends of the pews. All of that is written on the pages I gave you." "That isn't so outrageous Mary," remarked Joe, trying to save the hour. "Sometimes the wedding guests, by their behavior – their talking in the church during the ceremony especially at Communion time, their drinking of liquor before the wedding, their dress, the constant snapping of photographs, and so forth – bring attention to **themselves** and do not honor you or the Church. All of us at St. Dismas just want you to have a holy ceremony" Ms. Wright explained. Joe concluded; "Mary, let's make the church wedding dignified and have a lot of fun at the reception. It will be all good." The appointment with Ms. Wright ended.

Thank you very much – I am noticing great participation at 24 Hour Eucharist Exposition. It is my experience that we are gaining more parishioners and others. I am especially grateful to families who come – Moms and Dads with children – a great family faith prayer practice. If you can't come for the hour, come for part! Ours is a community of about 1550 households, we are coming along – Thank You, come to Exposition! Return an hour of thanks to the Lord for all the good He has done for you!

Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Last Sunday's "Parable of the rich fool" delivered a compelling reason to do the right thing—now: "You fool, this night your life will be demanded of you" (Luke 12:20). Today, Jesus warns us: "You also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come" (12:40). Though we do *not* know when our Master will come, we *do* know what our Master expects to find. Jesus expects us to be vigilant (12:37) and diligent (12:42) in our work for the kingdom, but also filled with reverent mercy toward our fellow servants and ourselves. Hopefully, Jesus' warning not to get drunk and beat each other up (12:45) does not apply to us literally! But what changes do I need to make, right now, so that the many people outside "the Master's house" will want to come inside to experience the healing comfort of Jesus' own mercy in the compassion of Jesus' modern-day disciples?


