



A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

Second Sunday in "Ordinary Time"

In the spring of 1977, beloved Fr. Jude Herlihy, OSM was the Prior Provincial of the US Western Province of Servites, I was a seminarian. I had graduated college; the next year of formation would be the novitiate. But where? After a provincial council meeting, Fr. Jude came to my room and said: “Lad, we are sending you to Begbroke, England (a small village very close to Oxford). You are going to be a novice. Be sure to get yourself some warm clothes and a rain coat, you’ll need both.” The experience was very good. My novice master and the elements of community were all quite good, even when America would bear the brunt of British humor. There was a lot of food, not much cuisine. The local pub and the pubs of Oxfordshire provided a lot of distraction to the more important matters of life.

In our community of thirteen men was Fr. Philip Allen, OSM who had the habit of finishing nearly all activity with the words, “Well, there you have it” and name the event, as in: “Well, there you have it that was your Christmas, I hope you liked it. There will be another one next year!”

“Well, there you have it that was your Christmas, Feast of the Holy Family, Feast of the Solemnity of Mary the Mother of God, Feast of Epiphany, and Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. I hope you liked it. Now we are in **Ordinary Time**. ”

What is so ordinary about time? Most likely the ordinary hours of your day are spent in play, education, work, or retirement then you return to and awaken from sleep. Hopefully time is spent on meals shared, stories told, people encountered and remembered, exploring horizons and teaching ideas, and serving others. We do our best not to make ordinary time b-o-r-i-n-g thus, distractions are sought. The first distraction was not the television and Apple Products are not the last distraction, although a high sugar diet will eventually solve problems! There have always been distractions, amusements, and wasting time. God has given us time as a gift; how do you use it in an ordinary way? Here is another assignment: how much ordinary time do you make sacred and how?

What will you do during ordinary time in the Church year? What does it mean for you to be a Roman Catholic and a member of this community of St. Juliana Falconieri? The opening prayer for the First Week in Ordinary Time included this petition for reflection and action: “O Lord, we pray that (we) may see what must be done, and gain strength to do what (we) have seen.” In the extra-ordinary time of Christmas, we saw people – a shepherd and drummer boy, common folks along with noble type wise men journey to the scene where God is revealed in Jesus Christ. They were distracted from their ordinary life, they came and worshiped. I suppose they did that in “awe and wonder.” Although “Christmas is over” the One who has been revealed is still being revealed, in his community. In “awe and wonder” He is being encountered by you and me.

Everyone who came to the First Christmas was looking for a deeper relationship with God. What are you looking for when you pray in ordinary ways? How different is the liturgy of the Holy Mass? How is prayer at home different from the community of church gathered for the Holy Eucharist? Is the church building and its community different from a civic auditorium, theatre, stadium, gymnasium, and etc.? How is coming to church different from going to any other place? Do you take notice of the tabernacle and its Sacred Inhabitant, in this church not off in a separate chapel but front and center in the building? How is the celebration of the Mass different from entertainment? Nifty questions. If entering this church and participating in Mass isn’t different from the theatre or stadium, what is it?

During Ordinary Time, take time to experience the “Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. The One on whom the Spirit of God rests.” Do so in a deliberate way. Make prayer a sacred encounter with God. Make coming to St. Juliana church a sacred experience. Deliberately come to church, during the week for weekday Mass or simply stop for a “visit.” On the First Tuesday, our 24-hour day of Exposition, if possible come as a family. Unless it is deliberate it won’t be done. Shouldn’t being a Christian start with accepting Jesus and the desire for him to transform your life? Shepherds, drummer boys and wise magi thought so. Conversion, living life deliberately, takes time. It takes time to grow into a mature Catholic Christian. Spend this “ordinary time” allowing God to reveal himself to you and you revealing Him to others. Pray that you will “see what must be done and gain the strength to do what you have seen.”

“Well, there you have it, that is your work for Ordinary Time.” We’ve only just begun. (Never did like that song.) Christ Be Our Light...try that one!
