



A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

Why Do Catholics Do That? was the title of a book written in 1995. It's also a question we Catholics are asked by folks who are both curious and cynical. Our best answer; **because we believe**. The words and actions of Catholics are the beliefs of Catholics. We believe that by our words and actions of belief we "look into the signs of the times by the light of faith and constantly devote ourselves to the service of the Gospel." Further, **by being "attentive to the needs of all people, we share their grief and pain, their joy and hope, we faithfully bring them the Good News of Salvation and go forward with them along the way of the Kingdom."** That prayer is taken from Eucharistic Prayer III for Various Needs, it's **a perfect mission statement for the Church. Stewardship is what we DO after we say: "I believe."**

As we pray (or worship), so we believe, so we live. Perhaps you were taught "*lex orandi, lex credendi, lex vivendi*". Whether you were taught the truth in old Latin or English, or never heard it, you've been living it, its truth is your way life.

Curiosity might have killed the cat – but it's good for the Catholic. I was a novice in Oxford, England where our community of Servite Friars (brothers and priests) shared a chapel with cloistered (enclosed) Servite Sisters. I used to over-hear the many prayers of the good sisters. One was: "Lord save us from fire." When we joined the sisters for tea one afternoon I asked: "Sister does that prayer refer to the Great Fire of London?" "Why yes it does, brother" Sister Veronica assured me. "But sister, the Great Fire of London was in 1666." I remarked. "Brother, we've never had another one!" She exclaimed.

We Catholics say a lot of prayers, we do a lot of fine actions; in short we hold a lot of beliefs dear to us. **Pause and sort out; "do my words and deeds reflect my prayer/belief?" Do I act as one who believes in God "24/7" or just on Sunday or more only during Lent?** Do I pray as I should? Is Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament an important prayer time for my family and me? Which animates my being more: vitamins and a gym or from prayer, and the life that comes from prayer's direction? Christian discipleship begins with believing in God and following His Son, Jesus. It's the way we become saints!

Answer anew for yourself: Do I believe in God? What kind of God do I believe in? (personal or impersonal God) Do I have a relationship with God?

What do you know and believe about God the Father? Not Jesus but God, the Father. We Christians know a lot about Jesus, the Blessed Virgin Mary, a calendar year of saints, and the practices and precepts of the Church. How is God the Father included in your faith? Listen to whom our Eucharistic Prayers are addressed. To whom do you pray when you say: "Our Father...?"

My hunch is there is significant silence regarding both the Father and Jesus. It's okay for priests, deacons, and religious brothers and sisters to talk about God; is He the topic of your dinner table or sick bed? Catholic school students are educated in the faith which means they are taught more than right from wrong. Do not reduce believing in God to morality. Morality can be defined as "being human." Belief in God and having a relationship with Jesus is a moon-shot more than telling the truth, not stealing, and not killing? My barber and dentist fulfill those modest hopes.

I was taught as a school boy and I believe as an adult that God is THE Supreme Being - supreme above all creatures and infinitely perfect. God is the being that which no greater being can exist. He is a personal being, not a force or cosmic energy like gravity. God is not an object like an eternal flame. I believe there is One God. This one God made us for Himself and I am always longing for Him. Seeking God is as natural as seeking water.

I believe that God is a personal being who can be known and experienced. He revealed Himself and He continually reveals Himself. He has a relationship of love with us. We love Him in return. In Jesus Christ He let us in on the secret of who He is and what He is all about.

When I say I am a Catholic I mean I am in a relationship with God and I am baptized into a community of God's Faithful People, and I live my life accordingly. Belief in God prompts my service to Him and His People. **Stewardship, doing the faith, comes from believing in God. Loving as Jesus loved prompts compassionate words and merciful actions. Stewardship is what we do after we say: "I believe."**

Why do we Catholics do what we do? **We Catholics do what we do because we believe that by knowing, loving, and serving God in this world we will be happy with him for eternity in heaven where He dwells.** We are instruments of the "Good News of Salvation" pointing to God by what we say and do. **We glorify God by the way we live our lives!**

Reflect on the First Commandment: I am the Lord your God, you shall not have false gods before me. Reflect on that this week – try it as a couple or a family. If faith is kept silent in your home, what might happen if it is allowed to be discussed and lived openly? Talk openly about your personal relationship with God, your greatest love. Then do the faith. **You are on your way to discipleship!**




