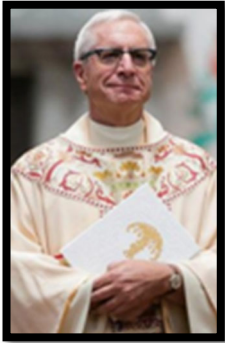

NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

Try as one might, it is not possible to escape two very important life-forming questions. The first, “Who am I?” The second, “How do I fit in?” Unfortunately, a lot of us go about answering the second question first and meet frustration at every turn. And to make matters worse often we try to correct the mistake by repeating the error! Trying to fit in without realizing one’s talent, skill, potential, or personal values, or place in life is



a cause of folly and madness. The want-to-be but not able who pretends to be a chef, only to get burned and spoil the food and meal. The want-to-be but unskilled who tries to play soccer but gets injured, laughed at, and game loser. The want-to-be but unskilled who takes the lead in the school play, steals the show in all the wrong ways. The one who wants-a-relationship and joins a gang only to abandon all morals and personal

values. “Who am I?” demands self-knowledge. It’s difficult to look at yourself in the mirror which does not lie and accept the mirror truth. It can only reflect one image, the true one.

Sometimes a warm-up act will try to steal the attention of the head-liner. Second fiddle doesn’t realize he isn’t the first chair. The also named on the marquee isn’t the main-light. Just the one who prepares the audience for the light. For all those years Ed McMahan announced: “And now heeeeeeers Johnny!” Ed wasn’t Johnny. Just the one who prepared the audience for Johnny Carson to come through the curtain and the great applause.

St. John the Baptist realized from the start that he was not the light. John knew his place and his purpose; his “who am I?” and “how do I fit in?” A voice, an important voice, crying in the wilderness to prepare a way for the light. He came to call people to the Light, the Light of the World. He deflected attention from himself to the other. “I must decrease, He must increase.” Love is not stealing thunder, it is giving thunder its due. Had he done anything differently, he would not have been himself and he would have been frustrated.

Parents and teachers must realize, at least from time to time, that they are little more than voices and lights in the wilderness. The wilderness of distracted and dark souls. Yet, parents and teachers must find their proper place. They are not the ones who must succeed. They must yield to God who is drawing all souls, each being, to himself. That’s who you are. Your love is in your appreciation of what the other is accomplishing, not what you have done.

How do you fit in? By watching the gauge of your success. Like Sisyphus, don’t quit. And after a school year or even a life-time if only a few realize that you are NOT a total idiot, you are a roaring success. Know who you are and how you fit in, then happiness and fulfillment will be yours.

Can I convince you that you are light and that you fit in as being light for others? Right now we are rather bedazzled with light. Lights on trees, lights cascading down buildings. Drive down Raymond to Chapman! Just look at the lights! However, all those lights as mesmerizing as they are can distract us from the real Light of the World.

Trouble is there are two lights. Let us not forget the “light” of Lucifer, the “Light-Bearer: who fled the real Light preferring to live in darkness because he could not reign as the Light. Lucifer blinds us to the real Light.

Each of us IS wonderfully important. Yet only Jesus is the Messiah. And Jesus told us to serve others and not to be served. That is our identity and that is how we will fit in.

How might we serve? Why not ask someone who is not Church-going to come with you to Mass? Ask someone to come to a faith-formation gathering. Invite someone who doesn’t get an invitation to your home to come for dinner. You can be a light, because you are light! You can make a difference by your love, by your witness to the Light of Christ, which is what you were meant to do.

None of us is The Light, but each of us –like John– is nonetheless privileged to be a witness to the light. And as the old slave spiritual sings so truly: “I got a little light, and I’m gonna make it *shine!*”

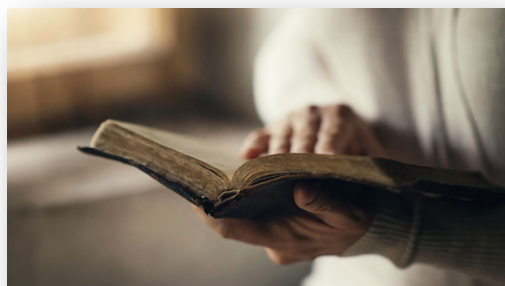


FAITH SHARING GROUP
