


THE PARISH AS ONE BODY

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

You must have noticed that, whenever there's a horrible disaster, like a hurricane or a fire, as the survivors are interviewed they always say the same thing. It never varies: "Well, thank God, we all got out alive." They've lost *everything*—even the roof of their home, their furniture, rugs, appliances, and clothes. They've lost irreplaceable possessions—family pictures, trophies, all the stuff on the hard drive from their computers. But the disaster has made them sho

drive from their computers. But the disaster has made them shockingly aware of what's truly important—being alive and having one another.

That's a good thing to remember when we're surrounded by no-longer-important wrapping paper and bows, video games and clothes that don't fit and the fruit cake. What's truly important—and will remain important, no matter what—is being alive, and having one another.

That's not to make anybody feel *guilty* for being lucky to have Christmas gifts. On the contrary, it's meant to make us breathlessly *grateful* for being so lucky.

GK Chesterton wrote that we're happy that Santa Claus filled our Christmas stockings with small presents. But do we often say thanks to the Person who fills our every-morning stockings with the miracle of two legs? We take a lot for granted, as if we'd done something to deserve all that surrounds us.

Well-meaning people have put a price on just about everything except the really important stuff, like being alive and having one another. Why? Because it's impossible to pay for something you were freely given.

Every Christmas present, though, required a bribe to Santa Claus: "Ya better watch out, ya better not cry...He sees you when you're sleeping, he knows when you're awake." So even a few fun presents demand at the very least that we pull the wool over Santa's eyes. And the same watchfulness gets transferred to God—when we say, "What did I ever do to deserve this sickness, this unwelcome intrusion, this loss?" As if deserving—quid pro quo—had anything whatever to do with God's connection to us. He makes his blessings rain on the just and the unjust. "The Lord giveth, and the Lord taketh away." He gave us life before we even existed, so how could we have done anything to deserve that?

But something deep down in us does want to give something to God in gratitude. Some little shepherd boy wants to give the newborn Jesus a baby lamb—or at least play for him on his drum. The wise men bring him gold, frankincense and myrrh—which were utterly useless in a Bethlehem cave. The angels sang so loudly and so long that the baby was kept awake.

When you look around the Christmas table, overlook the easy stuff–like the decorations and the food. Look at each face, absorbing it, and say, "Ah!" and "Oh" and "Thank you!"

That's what Christmas and Eucharist mean: saying thanks to the God who gave us life and those we love open-handedly, for nothing, the God who at the first Christmas emptied himself of all privilege to

become one of us and show us how to use the lives he gave us.

Thank you for the cards and presents that came my way from you all. Thank you for your presence in our St. Juliana Falconieri Parish and Grammar School all the time. Thanks for putting up with me and my nonsense!

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS

Children of the parish are somewhat focused on Santa Claus these days, who is keeping an eye on who's naughty and who's nice. Santa Claus, with his heavenly patron Saint Nicholas, has been more or less in charge of gift-giving to American children for a hundred years or so. In other places, perhaps more attentive to our Christian tradition, there are different gift-bearers. In Greece, Saint Basil delivers the presents on his feast day, December 31, and makes sure everyone is sprinkled with holy water. The Baby Jesus is in charge elsewhere, called the Christkind in Austria and Belgium, El Niño Jesús in Columbia, and Le Petit Jesus in France, where he shares his duties with Père Noël. In the Czech Republic almost everyone is atheist, but Ježíšek, the infant Jesus, brings gifts to one and all. In Poland the "Star Man" is said to bring the gifts, although often he turns out to be the village priest in disguise. Saint Nicholas, not his Americanized cousin, is the giver in Holland, where he wears a bishop's miter, and in Russia, where he wears a bishop's crown. Soviet Russia tried to dethrone Saint Nicholas and promote Grandfather Frost, but no one was much fooled by this attempt to squeeze religion out of Christ's birth. One country has a saintly woman in charge of the gifts, Saint Lucy, honored in Sweden on December 13, when children serve their parents breakfast in bed, and others awake to news that they have been nominated for a Nobel Prize. Some children have a second round of gifts on Epiphany, when the magi assume the gift-giving duties. In general, the gifts of Christmas are simple pleasures, not great heaps of treasures. Once upon a time, a new pair of socks or an orange was enough for us. No matter what gifts we receive, all of them are to point us to the true gift, and the true giver.



ADULT CONFIRMATION

If you are over the age of 18 and have not received the Sacrament of Confirmation please contact Mike McHenry at 714-853-1193.

Through Confirmation the individual's baptism is reinforced and sealed. This sacrament, like baptism, may only be celebrated once. It is closely linked with baptism in that there is an anointing with oil (Chrism), laying on of hands, and special activity of the Holy Spirit.

This beautiful sacrament will be conferred on Pentecost Sunday, May 20, 2018.

THE 12 DAYS OF CHRISTMAS

When most people hear of "The 12 Days of Christmas", they think of the song. This song had its origins as a teaching tool to instruct young people in the meaning and content of the Christian faith.

Each of the items in the song represents something of religious significance. The hidden meaning of each gift was designed to help young Christians learn their faith. The song goes, "On the first day of Christmas my true love gave to me..."

The "true love" represents God and the "me" who receives these presents is the Christian. Here you go:

The "partridge in a pear tree" was Jesus Christ who died on a tree as a gift from God.

The "two turtle doves" were the Old and New Testaments - another gift from God.

The "three French hens" were faith, hope and love - the three gifts of the Spirit that abide (I Corinthians 13).

The "four calling birds" were the four Gospels which sing the song of salvation through Jesus Christ.

The "five golden rings" were the first five books of the Bible also called the "Books of Moses".

The "six geese a-laying" were the six days of creation.

The "seven swans a swimming" were the "seven gifts of the Holy Spirit". (I Corinthians 12:8-11; Romans 12, Ephesians 4; I Peter 4:10-11).

The "eight maids a milking" were the eight beatitudes.

The "nine ladies dancing" were nine fruits of the Holy Spirit. (Galatians 5:22 & 23)

The "ten lords a-leaping" were the Ten Commandments.

The "eleven pipers piping" were the eleven faithful disciples.

The "twelve drummers drumming" were the twelve points of the Apostles' Creed.

So, the next time you hear "The 12 Days of Christmas", consider how this otherwise non-religious sounding song had its origins in the Christian faith.

THE GIFT OF GOD'S WORD

Word

On this day of gifts and gift giving, it seems appropriate that we take a of GOO moment to reflect on the great gift of God's Word. Because it is creative,

God's Word always points to its author, always calls us to respond. Because it is powerful, God's Word can link the sublime with the ridiculous, the transcendent with the immanent, the divine with the human. Because it is graceful, God's Word establishes a relationship of deep intimacy between us and God.

At the heart of God's Word lies a tantalizing tension between the mysterious and the mundane. In our liturgical celebration, this unresolved tension both reveals the meaning of life for us and calls us to respond, to act upon that meaning.

Once accepted and opened, the gift of God's Word is a gift that keeps on giving and keeps on calling us to give in return. It dares us to be like the gift-giver and to become gifts for others, not only at Christmas, but at every moment of life.




