


#### THE PARISH AS ONE BODY

#### NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

One of our priests, Fr. Philip Grimes, OSM, the only one we all called "father" (all other priests and brothers are on a first if not nick-name basis) he didn't drive a car and most likely didn't commit even a venial sin. Fr. Grimes solicited a community member to drive him to the post office, drug store, dry cleaners, shoe cobbler, and Anaheim Public Library. At the library where every other week he checked out seven mystery novels; the next seven in alphabetical order of the author's last name from the



previous group. When he died, he was well into the authors whose last name began with "T".

Mysteries. We are brought into mystery from the time of our birth. At first everyone and thing is unknown and mysterious. Someone is ever present to solve the mystery to protect us from harm and to inform us of what is before us. Children have open minds and hearts, wide eves and broad smiles; they are surrounded by unknown mysteries. In our earlies days Mom or Dad named and gave the purpose of every new "thing" - things have names. The mystery was no longer. In school, mystery and imagination gave way to advanced learning and memorizing lists, then more complicated lists, just so we'll know things have names and purposes. I wonder if education destroyed mystery, reducing much of what we encounter as a problem to be solved and not a sign of continued "awe and wonder" that points away from itself to something greater. One mystery will always remain; sing: "Ah, Sweet Mystery of Life, at Last I Found Thee." For those in love, life goes on as an intriguing mystery for which there is no explanation apart from love. A great mystery of life is the one we love the most, the person you are vowed to or gave life to. The mystery isn't that love is far away, it's that love is close at hand. And that love cannot be figured out. That another person can remain so close and share life is a mystery.

Can you be religious and spiritual without experiencing mystery? Nifty question. It's one that our detractors ask all the time. Their lives are filled with mystery too; usually they call their mysteries "problems" and spend their life solving the problem and gaining fame, fortune, and power.

God and experiences of Him (faith) are mysteries that draw us more deeply into themselves filing believers with the glory of God Himself. The mystery of God cannot be reduced to simply not knowing an answer or solution, a problem. The great mystery of life is God, the One we love the most, or should.

God in a manger; God revealing Himself as a human, that's love. That's a mystery. Love is the only way to begin to discuss the mystery. "For God so loved the world, that in the fullness of time he gave his only son that whoever believes in him may not die but may he eternal life." John 3.16

Scholars didn't go to the manger; theologians were nowhere to be found. They still can't solve the mystery of God being ever present to us. God is always present as love is always present.

In silence, put aside all that is preoccupying you. Put the problem of your pains aside. Rest from your wants and desires. In silence reflect in wonder, open-eyed, and find in life more than you can account for. Don't ask for life to be easier or for people to focus more on you. Join the community that today waits, in wonder, for the mystery of coming of the Lord.

Life is more than we have answers for. Life is more than any one of us can account for.

Once more reflect on expecting; expecting the love of your life, your child, sibling, grandchild. Explain love. This time do it around the manger. Look at the manger and its people. Not ideal humans but people as they are. Explain expecting the love or your life, your child, sibling, grandchild. Look at the manger, experience Mary's courage and compassion; look at the crucifix imagine and see Mary's courage and compassion. Imagine the mystery, love, and courage of The Blessed Virgin Mary. Experience faith.

In silence listen. In mystery, love, courage, and faith move on to the next level of holiness, deeper into the alphabet, and recognize what has been done for you, so that you can do for others. A voice cried: "Prepare the way of the Lord." Listen and prepare. Help others to do the same. For whom or what are you preparing? Nifty questions.

In a time of preparation, much of it having to do with material things, it is good to hear the words of Isaiah, "Comfort, give comfort to my people, / says your God" (Isaiah 40:1). 
