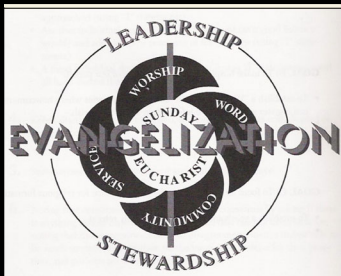

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

How is “God’s wisdom” spoken to you? Received as it is, how is it understood? Once it is understood and believed, is it made manifest in your actions? For the longest time God’s wisdom was a matter of keeping commandments, the Ten Commandments and a few more. Then the issues of the day and the manner of life and decision making got a bit more complex. This aphorism works: “If you are faithful in small matters, you will be faithful in large matters.” What rule do you use to sort out large and small matters?

It’s a foolish notion to go through life believing that a law makes certain acts sinful. Laws – keeping order in tribe – are different from justice which is different from Catholic moral decision making – making decisions for action based on imitating Christ’s command to love one another.

One might ask, “Fill in the blank. Laws are meant to _____.” If you said “be broken” you are the average Joe or Mary. Why do people keep laws? At a low level the answer is “to avoid punishment.” Yet capital punishment, the death penalty itself, does not stop homicide. Laws keep order in the community. Really, aren’t most laws based on common sense? Certainly God saying murder is wrong didn’t make murder wrong. Murder is wrong in itself and God said so. It was wrong long before the Ten Commandments were promulgated.

What about moral decision making? Do not equate “being moral” with “being Christian.” Being moral and being human are synonyms.

Being Christian, means making moral decisions based on Jesus’ law: “Love one another as I have loved you.” Notice that’s different from “do to others what you would like them to do to you.” Why make Christian moral judgments and actions? Not many answer because of “fear of hell” any longer. Nor is the answer: “to gain sanctifying grace.” So why do you make a Christian moral decision?

To be fully converted is to know the faith, have a heart for it, and a moral conversion – to act on its belief. I practice the belief: “I believe in One God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, all things visible and invisible.” (Nicene Creed) When I recognize that together we must share a web of relationships on a planet. I believe that God trusts me with the wisdom He gave me to use properly His creation that surrounds me. I must take care of “our common home” and the people who live on it.

That means there is something objective, some unavoidable and inconvenient facts about actions that say “Yes, this ought to be done” and “No, that must be avoided.” There is rational, objective understanding that says do not throw unwanted humans into trash bins.

Because I am a human being I ought to act like a human being. Because I am a converted Christian my actions ought to imitate those of Jesus who came “Not to be served but to serve” and follow his command “love one another as I have loved you.”

Jesus takes the whole spectrum of “being human” to a higher level. His teaching is not about the law or even justice. Jesus’ teaching is about love a step higher than justice and perhaps two steps higher than “the law”. Jesus’ Gospel is about love and service. Love requires a relationship. The relationship requires an encounter, meeting the other person, spending time with the other. Becoming a friend with the other, not because you went to Disneyland or Balboa Island together but because you served, healed each other, visited each other, and suffered together. You loved each other even when the other was not likeable.

God’s wisdom is spoken in the Scriptures, in the words and deeds of Jesus. It is understood as Truth and is the belief on which our actions are based. Meet Jesus in the Gospel; let him convert you from a “former self, the old way of being” to a New Creation.

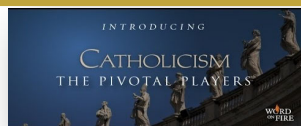
