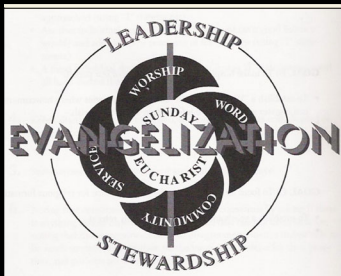

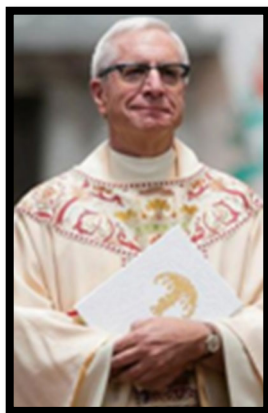

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

Over the years I have had some really fine spiritual directors, members of the Servite Community, religious sisters, and priest friends with whom I could discuss “matters of priesthood and religious life.” One time, at least once, while discussing the matter of vocations, or better – the lack of vocations – my spiritual director remarked that perhaps the vocation director is simply trying too hard. I snapped my head: “Whadda ya mean? Trying too hard, he ain’t got even one fish on the hook, not one!” “Maybe he is looking for the perfect catch” the spiritual director responded. “Well, shouldn’t he be?” I asked. My director responded: “Look at Jesus. He seemed to simply catch, to use your word, those who were available. And look who he promoted, not Judas the one with business experience and some acumen but Peter who was both a klutz and a ham-head. Really, not only Jesus, but look at yourself, someone accepted you....” Then the fight started! Neither Peter nor Thomas were perfect picks at first but they became outstanding disciples as they grew in knowledge and love of Our Lord.

Consider for a moment two great saints who are named Thomas. One, Thomas Aquinas has the faith all figured out with mathematical or Cartesian certitude. Plenty of reason without any room for doubt, uncertainty, or ridicule. The science of theology really is a splendid thing! He also wrote some fine prayers and music, all of which are remembered and used to this day. Because his thought is written in Latin and is “old” do not think it wrong.

The other is Thomas the Apostle. Thomas was one of the few apostles with a personality. Most of the first Christian schools seem to have come from central casting and could fit into any chorus. But certainly neither Peter nor Thomas.

When it comes to real matters of faith, neither Thomas was going to be fooled. No blind leap in the dark for them. Really, anyone who says faith is “a blind leap in the dark” is kinda dopey anyway. All blind leaps in the dark are both dopey and dangerous. Gather data, arrange the data logically, form a conclusion, and put the conclusion out for others to critique – make all leaps based on evidence and critique. If ten friends tell me they’ve seen a man who’s been stone-cold-dead, I’d like heavier evidence than their improbable word. It defies all knowledge from experience, not to mention logic.

Thomas is right, the great sin is certitude and doubt is virtuous. Most real learning does not begin with certitude, it begins with doubt, which leads to collection of data – perhaps by scientific experiment or personal interview. Without doubt and the humility that comes with doubt, you’ll never know if you are wrong. You have been hoodwinked before, even by your own Mother. Yet, without sufficient data we have formed certitudes about many very complex questions: the shape of Mother Earth and its spinning orbit, medical issues, welfare cheats, the Church, and people in our community.

What we ought to doubt is our ability to formulate immediate, definitive, and once-for-all answers; better is to admit the severely limited capacity of our minds, even to claim to know obvious realities, much less to say we understand with only off the rack conclusions. St. Thomas Aquinas and St. Thomas the Apostle both grew from doubt to true faith. Not all disciples were perfect at first; they grew to be better as they believed and understood. Follow their lead.



Thank you, each of you who planned, ministered, participated, sang in, and attended our Easter celebrations. The Triduum, the three days of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, the Great Easter Vigil, and Easter Sunday itself were all splendiferous! As a community of faith we rose to celebrate what is essential for us. Thank you so much for being the community of faith you are!

Thank you, Deacon Gerhard and Cathy (Mrs. Deacon!) for your many years of service to us. Your ministry at St. Juliana will be remembered, your service has set a high bar. As you begin a new ministry at Holy Family Cathedral, *Sempre Adelante* – Always Forward. A reception will be held for Deacon Gerhard and Cathy following the 9:00AM Mass today (Sunday, April 23).

In the pews and bulletin (page 9) you will notice a census up-date card. Please help us! Kindly take time (NOT DURING MASS!) to complete the form legibly in ink and either drop it into the collection basket or at the parish office or in the night depository box on the outside of the office.

Lastly, I will be presenting four Monday evening classes beginning at 7:00PM lasting to 8:30PM on April 24, May 1, May 15 and May 22 – NOT MAY 8 – “Go, make disciples of the nations” Who is Jesus and what is his Church? – basic theme: The Church the Disciples left behind. At least I am starting with that idea. Please join me, you make great company! Come; teenagers, college students, and into maturity! Bring a friend; bring an enemy....bring some food to share!
