THE PARISH AS ONE BODY



3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time



A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

Some of the most interesting characters in novels or movies are those who are there as if flies on the wall. They don't join in and when they are asked to reveal themselves they don't want to matter. Draw them into a conversation and they leave suddenly, like to the bathroom, through the door, or to another group. But, when these folks remain and begin to join in the conversation, they are usually memorable.

I enjoy challenging such people. When they reveal their true selves, they don't mouth the party line, what "everyone else knows" or what everyone wants them to say. They enter the conversation uncensored.

Here's the chase. In the calendar of the church we are in "ordinary time." Doesn't sound so exciting does it? Wrong name for a season on the Catholic calendar. Wanna have a clue as to why members say "It's b-o-r-i-n-g" or ask "Like, what's the point?" Look at what we call it "Ordinary Time."

Remember the color mauve? Do you really desire beige? Why order vanilla at 31 Flavors?

Hey, Church, give the period an active name. Hey, honey, paint the room a vibrant color. Pralines and cream, please!

When you visit a "bucket list" venue what is your reaction? I'll bet WOW, wonder, awe, silence maybe tears in the emotional moment, just fill in the rest of the space. What was your response to the Grand Canyon or the Sistine Chapel? It wasn't ordinary. And you weren't ordinary anymore when you departed from it. Pictures, postcards, tweets, a new narrative to tell **EVERY**one. Spend time with the memory. Go and create a new one.

I recall going to the school's chapel as a school boy. It was a different experience. My life was changed because of the ONE I encountered there, because of the beauty present there. I walked into my Grandparent's home differently than I walked into my best friend's house. I walked into the parish church in a manner differently than I walked into my Grandparent's home, my best friend's home, Sears, or Disneyland or Angel Stadium. I did so because of the presence of the ONE who is always there.

Walk into the church; meet the ONE who is present. You are in a Roman Catholic Church, JESUS IS PRESENT IN THE TABERNACLE. You are walking out of culture, out of society, into a sanctuary, into sacred space for an encounter with the sacred. Out of clock time into God's time, Kairos. Silence! Wonder! Awe! It's not the same as walking into any other space. One should feel challenged. The presence of Jesus should dis-orient you. The image of Jesus in the manger or on the Cross is challenging and not comfortable. If the Gospel does not challenge it is not understood.

If ordinary means something like "everything else" or "all the rest" our Catholic Church is not ordinary. Circuses and Latin verbs are ordinary; seen one you've seen them all. Neither circuses nor Latin verbs are around much anymore. Although the Mass is a ritual – repeated actions – it is never ordinary.


Draw someone into this discussion: "What's working and what's not working with the Roman Catholic Church? Specifically with worship." Allow the discussion to take its own uncensored direction.

I had such a conversation not long ago. I was told in these or in similar words as the saying goes: "It lacks mystery. It's like everything else. It depends on the personality of the priest. I'm not challenged to be different."

I asked: "What did you hope to get out of the experience?" That's when deep silence came. Best answer: "Not much." Another person in the group suggested: "You'll only get out what you put in." That's when I broke into a sweat to compose myself: "You will never put in enough unless you are martyred; you get salvation. Salvation comes as a gift. It's the gift of the Eucharist!" What you experience is the message of evangelization: the Good News of your salvation. Jesus Christ is raised from the dead; death has no power over us. That's what the Mass is about. "Where would I have ever learned that?"

"Ordinary?" WOW! What a difference the encounter with Jesus the Living God makes! Jesus said: "Come, follow me." In ordinary we are made extra-ordinary by our encounter with Him who changes lives. When Jesus makes a difference in the Catholic community, Jesus will make a difference in every community.

OUR PARISH CREST

1.) At the top, this is the crest of the Servite Order, set on blue in honor of Our Lady, the patroness of the Order.

2.) The largest part of the crest, features two oranges for Fullerton in the Diocese of Orange. The stylized lily between the oranges represents the city of Florence, Italy - the home of both Juliana and the Servite Order. Prominent is the "IHS", one of the symbols for Jesus Christ.

3.) This is the crest of the Falconieri family itself, blue and white "checker".


FAITH SHARING GROUP




