


THE PARISH AS ONE BODY

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.



It's CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK – let's celebrate the Good News of Catholic Education and Faith Formation. We have strong schools of Good News on our campus – a Parish Catholic Grammar School and our parish faith formation programs. Thank you – administrators, faculty, staff and an army of volunteers, students, and parents for making St. Juliana Falcons a great school, a community to learn and practice our faith. Faith formation at the parish school and a variety of parish programs is successful when the graduates of the school and the members of the parish imitate Christ. Imitating Jesus is the measure of success. Forming faithful disciples of Jesus and His Gospel must permeate Catholic

education at all levels and each program. Football teams, activities, advanced placement programs and graduate schools notice: "Catholic education is successful when its graduates imitate Jesus Christ." If there is no evangelization, there is no Christian school. Faith formation programs exist because they evangelize.

As Jesus taught with a "new kind of authority" so does the Catholic school teach with a "new kind of authority." Jesus is the authority that teaches today: "you must change your life, 180° from the kingdom society to the Kingdom of God." Students of our Catholic school and parish faith formation programs ALWAYS learn to believe and understand their faith experience, and live what they believe and understand.

The Kingdom of God, a new community and God's creation, is formed with the Lord of Life at its center. At our school, students form the habit to pause and listen to the voice of the Lord who guides us and whom we obey. That foundation forms a good faith habit. The identity of the Lord will spread as students of our schools learn and live the life giving relationship with Jesus they form in Catholic schools.

That's the Good News of Catholic Schools.

There are competing voices and but no higher authority. Be aware of the competition, those voices which shout: "The more you have the happier you will be. Everyone knows, everyone is doing, religion is leaving you behind. Religion is for the weak." Strong and informed directs our students and this Catholic community to spread the Good News of a different Kingdom.

I want each one of you to participate in the faith formation classes, sacramental preparation programs and parish school offered on our campus. The baptized never stop being disciples, students of the Word of God.

It is very possible to be good citizens of the city without being good citizens of the Kingdom of God. Learn the ways of the Kingdom of God in our faith based learning programs. Practice what you learn.

I need you to bridge the Parish Grammar School and the Parish Church Community to form one Parish Community in faith formation. Jesus formed a community by the single personal invitation: "Come Follow ME." The personal invitation is from Jesus to us. Our faith formation programs of Catholic education at all levels are for YOU. - *Extensive research and support for the opening of Transitional Kindergarten to the point of our school offering T-K beginning in Fall 2014.
- *Research and support of jump-starting and growing our school's endowment fund. This fund grew from \$24k to \$95k presently through collaboration with the St. Juliana School Parent Club fundraising efforts.

*Extensive research and support for adding Spanish to the school's curriculum to the point of offering this to our students in this 2017-18 school year.

As we progress in our work with JCSB we invite you to join your prayers with ours in asking the Lord to bless our efforts as we support the Principal and Pastor of our school community for the betterment of all. Here are the goals that are on the agenda for this year:

- *Continue to grow our endowment fund through fundraising efforts supported by the St. Juliana School Parent Club, Parish, and all others who believe in Catholic school education.
- *Establish an Alumni channel which we believe will strengthen our St. Juliana community.
- *Continue our efforts to become a Blue Ribbon distinguished school. With the implementation of a world language (Spanish) we can continue this process. Although it will still take at least two years for this distinction, we are well on our way.
- *Continue assisting the Principal and the Pastor with larger facility planning and management.
- *Continue to offer a competitive curriculum to become a school of choice when families are making their educational decisions.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank the many past members of our school board who have contributed to the success of these efforts since its inception. Their time and talents are very much appreciated.


