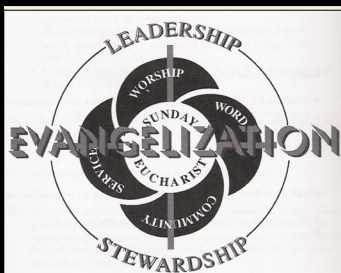

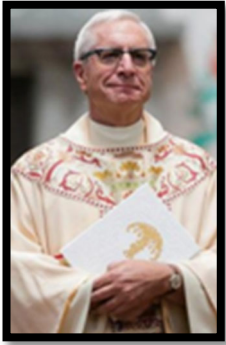

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

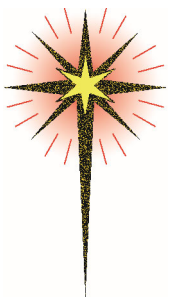
It is with human sadness but with strong faith and hope in the resurrection of Jesus that Fr. Luke and I ask you to pray for us and our brother in the Servite Order and priest for the Roman Catholic Church Fr. Perry McCoy, OSM who died on December 31, 2017 – New Year's Eve. A memorial service for Fr. Perry will be celebrated on Wednesday, January 10 at 5:00PM at the Priory Chapel of the Seven Holy Founders Servite High School 1952 W. La Palma Ave, Anaheim.

For the past two years Fr. Perry has been in residence in our rectory community as a retired priest. During his ministry he was stationed, among other places, at St. Philip Benizi Parish in Fullerton and Servite High School. He was quite active with World Wide Marriage Encounter and other Catholic ministries especially those related to peace, justice, immigration matters, and restorative justice. Most recently he has been ill with anemia and leukemia and other illnesses.

Today we celebrate the Feast of The Epiphany of the Lord. It is a most wonderful feast to reflect on The Light, the bright light that leads us. The problem, there are two bright lights! The bright light which is Jesus and leads to Jesus and the bright light which is Lucifer and leads away from Salvation. While Jesus unites, reflects God His Father, and brings the fullness of life – Lucifer, the other light is also bright but is 180° removed from grace.

Guided by light to the manger, today's visitors brought gifts. We might giggle at the gifts and ask about their usefulness – gold, frankincense, and myrrh. What gifts might we bring today? Here is a suggestion: Perhaps gifts that are not so tangible, but never-the-less obvious, especially in their absence. The gifts might be faith, hope, and love – which wipe out doubt, despair, and loneliness. Perhaps they are the gifts of acceptance, love, and wisdom – which take the place of prejudice, selfish-ness, and ignorance. They could be healing, compassion, and hospitality – which will ease the despair of sickness if not the sickness itself, harsh mercilessness, and homeless-ness. Matthew's scene of the Last Judgment suggests, among others acts, welcoming, comforting, and visiting. Letting Mary and Joseph know that they are not alone was indeed a gift.

These are the gifts that make us Christians, which is no laughing matter and a bright light in an otherwise darkened community. These make us Christians, far more than the common gifts of clothes that don't fit, stuff that doesn't work, and a fruit cake!

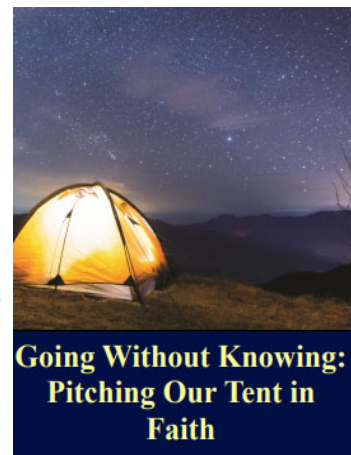

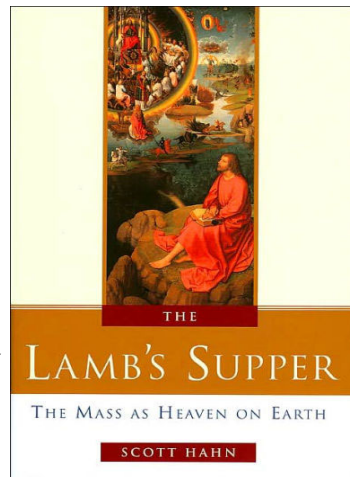

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

This year, in the United States the celebration of the Epiphany falls on January 7, but the traditional date for the Epiphany is January 6. The date we know as January 6 was established as the solstice in Egypt in 1996 BC, but the Egyptian calendar lost a full day every 128 years. Twenty centuries later the actual solstice had migrated to December 25. People still kept January 6 for the solstice celebration, but December 25, matching nicely with the Roman pagan feast of the Unconquered Sun, launched an extended solstice holiday. By the time of the early church, the whole period of twelve days was celebrated just about everywhere.

Christians began to celebrate Christ as the true light of the world in four themes: the Nativity, the manifestation to the Gentiles, the baptism of the Lord, and the wedding feast at Cana. That was entirely too much for one day to handle. A twelve-day season was ready to be adapted, so Christians borrowed from the pagan calendar for their own season of light. Thus early Christian celebrations of the Christmas season extended from one date for the solstice, December 25, to the older date, January 6. The darkest time in the Northern Hemisphere could now be filled with the Christian observance of the arrival of the Light of the World.
