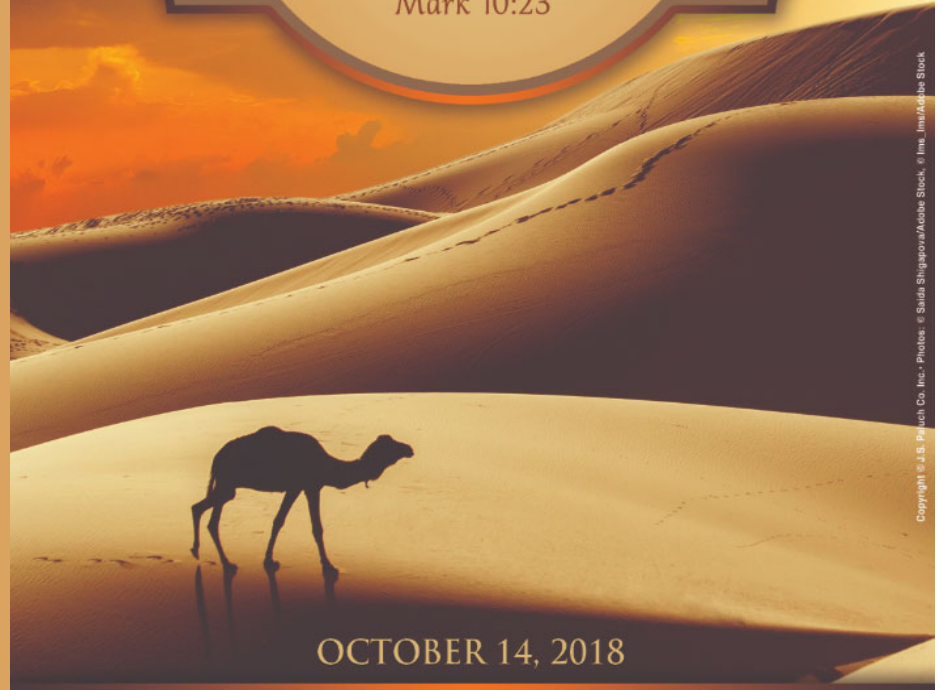

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

Let's continue the morality course! In the last exciting episode, we established that Truth is OUTSIDE of us. It's there, we discover it on its terms whether we accept it or not. The Smart Phone, knife, orange outside of me tells me what it is and how it is used best. I can pull out the Smart Phone and ignore my family at the dinner table; not the proper use for the Smart Phone. I can use the knife as a screwdriver, doing so might bend the blade. Not its proper use. I can throw the orange across the lunch area, not the best choice for its use. These are truths, not "opinions." Truth is objective not subjective.

Today's two questions: True or false, no cheating; 1) Morality is doing what works, it's all up to the individual. 2) There is no such thing as objective morality.

Psst: "Just Do It" works! Does your subjective action make the action right? As long as winning is the goal, **utilitarian** motives will guide my actions toward winning, rules to the wind. It's the game of "beat the system" which we learn at an early age. We perfect it throughout life. **Altruism** is doing what is right because I want to be a person of character. Character is the inner self, with developed principles, a conscience, and courage to act on those principles, especially when no one is looking, even if you act alone. Character and conscience are developed, reasoned, discerned. Character and conscience are not picked "off the rack." A personal conscience is 180° different from "everyone knows" or "everyone's doing it." Personality is "taken off the rack", accepted from anyone; whether it's the school teacher, parent, or media, you'll have a personality but no character. Never stable, personalities blow with the wind, this way now, that way later. Personalities are actors. Actor and hypocrite have the same root meaning. An actor's personality is his casted role; Mr. Rogers now, a Mafia Don later.

Character, acting on conscience, will cost you. It costs the time and effort to discern the right objective moral behavior and the courage to act on it with integrity, always being true. A developed character is the "real deal"- reliable and rock solid all the time whether or not anyone is looking. Here's the short course: being moral means directing your natural tendencies in the right way. Consider Psalm 119: 125 "I am your servant; give me discernment that I may know your decrees."

It is your choice to be a victim of impulse or a true self. God gave us the ability to reason the objective truth. The Holy Spirit gives us the gift of courage to act on it. "Everyone says so", "They are all doing it", "I believe what I saw on some media (the movies, television, or print)", "I read that some high authority says" is not a formed conscience.

Spend time with St. Paul: I Corinthians: 13: 11-12 "When I was a child I used to talk like a child, think like a child, reason like a child. When I became a man I put childish ways aside." Adolescence, being inchoative, is an opportunity to form an adult self. The world around the adolescent has to be reasoned and critiqued before the mature adult self can be established.

Prepare yourself with Truth (Veritas) before you agree with or condemn what you see and hear. A wrong opinion can be lethal.

In summary, it takes considerable courage to be moral. It takes considerable courage to direct natural tendencies in the right way, which is what being moral is all about. Are you a developed self or a victim of your impulses and outsiders, including the media?

"The Ten Commandments are so old and sin makes me feel guilty." Psst: **sin** of the Ten Commandments is called **crime** in the penal code. Doing what comes naturally is not always the right thing. Controlling natural tendencies takes wisdom, understanding, and courage. What are your natural tendencies toward cheating (tax forms, school tests, dishonesty by any name), ruining the good name of another person (gossip, detraction, calumny), stealing, sexual drives and desires, violence, liquor, gambling, possessing stuff? How do you direct and control what comes naturally?

Sin and crime and explanations can all be avoided by acting virtuously with integrity, courage, wisdom, and right judgment.

Come, Holy Spirit, fill our minds.
Might we discern right action and have the courage to do it.

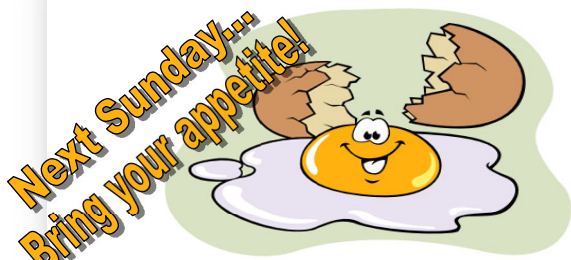

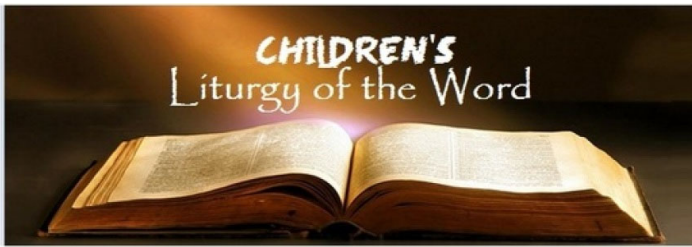

WORDS OF WISDOM

The spirit of wisdom, as we discover in today's first reading, comes to those who pray for her. Wisdom, like the word of God, carries a message of consolation as well as of great challenge. The Letter to the Hebrews tells us that the word of God, infused with the wisdom of God, is "sharper than any two-edged sword." We cannot shrink from the wisdom of God, or from the word that has the power to penetrate our hearts and minds. Jesus, the living word of God, the embodiment of wisdom, has strong, deeply penetrating words for the rich young man who comes to him seeking answers to his most profound questions. Just when the young man thought he had done enough to fulfill God's commands, more was asked of him. This is no less true for us.
