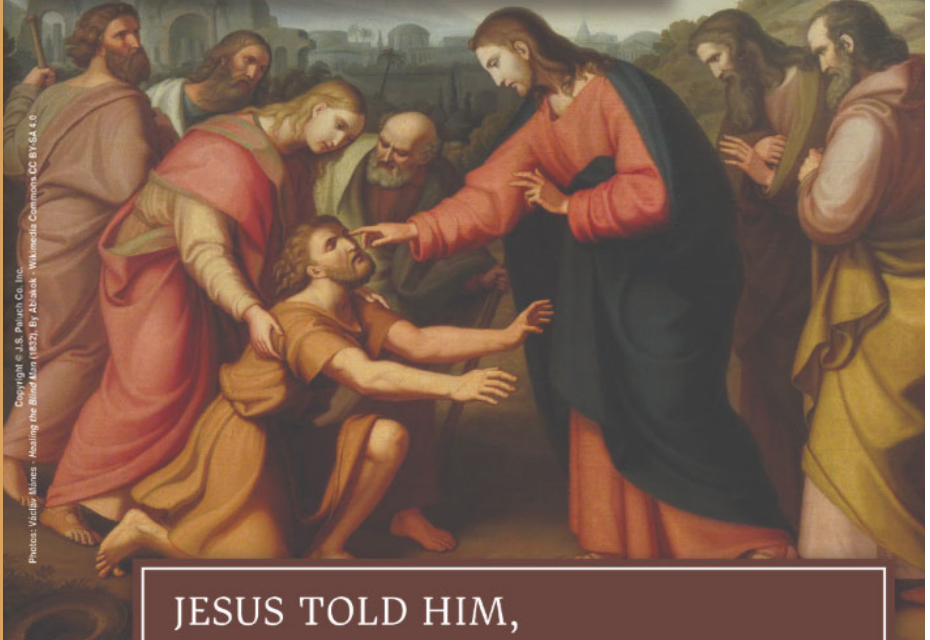

### A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

The morality course continued! Bored yet? **Discuss among yourselves: 1) Any act that is legal is moral. 2) Murder was wrong long before there were laws against murder. 3) Human beings are free to go against their nature. 4) Loyalty to family, team, country, is important to me; I would not call the police on my brother if he were selling cocaine.** Anyone get hurt on the last one?

From a previous lesson: a good definition of being moral is being human. No moral command (this act ought to be done) nor law is valid unless it is grounded in the objective nature of what it means to be human. If you aim at being human and miss the mark, there's a good chance your act is not a good human act. When you reflect on your act your mind and your heart tell you what is right and what is wrong. When you degrade yourself or another, when you simply use another person or are yourself

being used, you know and feel it. When you do good, you know you've done the right thing and you feel it.

Some laws are simply arbitrary; they are choices for good order. It's quite arbitrary, it really does not matter which side of the road we drive on, which color light means "Go", or the start time and dress code for school. To keep order, everyone is asked to abide by a proclaimed but arbitrary law.

Natural laws are based on the objective nature of things. Remember: the first step to wisdom is to call a thing by its right name and to use it appropriately. Human beings are different from animals; therefore, no human being should be treated as if he/she were an animal.

If we want to live together with relative harmony, we all need to overcome narcissism (me first self-absorption) and inertia (laziness). While refusing to admit mistakes, narcissists insult themselves as they separate themselves from the truth. The inert, refusing to think or act, simply go from bad to worse.

Moral authority is the power to reason and act by controlling both narcissism and inertia. Moral authority demands us to speak in such a way that others will change their wrong actions to right action.

Political power is external. Leaders use this power because they have power and they wish to keep it. Authority is power; those with power will enact and enforce laws for which they have vested interest.

Remember, read, or watch *A Man For All Seasons*. Thomas More refused to surrender his moral authority. He paid a high price for living his outward moral authority. Such is the case with all morally strong people; Rosa Parks, Lech Walesa, John McCain, Jesus Christ, and the company of martyrs come to mind. Think of Sandy Koufax, who would not pitch on Yom Kippur, game one of the 1965 World Series. Include courageous parents who continue to teach their children to be examples of virtue, while the media and many friends offer other directions. These are parents and their children who stand against: "Everyone's doing it", "Everyone knows", "Everyone has one". They are strong moral figures in our community. Would you call the police on your sibling if he/she were selling cocaine and refused to stop? There is a huge difference between choosing what's right in itself – objective and subjective - and what's right for me. Have moral strength. Choose not to be a victim of impulse, become a true self.

## THE HOPE AND PROMISE OF REDEMPTION

The prophet Jeremiah prophesies the end of the Babylonian exile. He describes how the weak and sorrowful people now return with joy. These are the scattered people of God: the blind and the lame, the mothers and pregnant women. They shall be led along an easy road so that no one will stumble. The Lord's kindness and mercy are on all these weak and broken people.

Here and in Psalm 126 we find the most lovely poetic images of God's love and care for us. "Those that sow in tears / shall reap rejoicing. Although they go forth weeping, / carrying the seed to be sown, / they shall come back rejoicing, / carrying their sheaves" (Psalm 126:5-6). Although God had to punish Israel for their many sins, God never forgot them, scattered as they were, and brings them all back to the land of their ancestors, there to flourish and be joyful again. We can see in this the hope and the promise of our own redemption, gathered from the far corners of the earth into the great banquet of God.

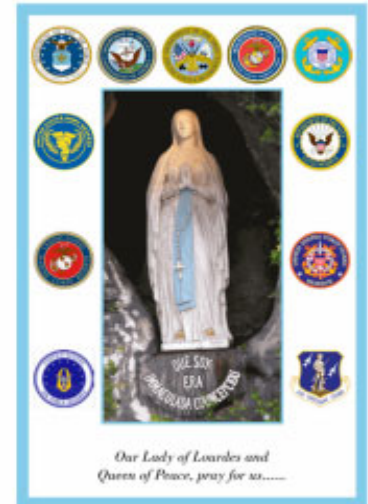

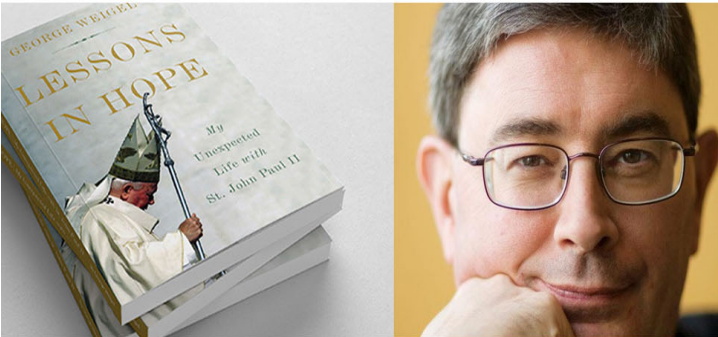
