
THE PARISH AS ONE BODY

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.



Okay, savage crew, here is a one question test: True or False – My (first person singular) opinion just as good as anyone else's opinion. Think before you answer or criticize anyone's answer.

Is your opinion on playing basketball as good as LeBron James' opinion or your opinion the Tesla automobile as good as Elon Musks' opinion? Is your opinion of your teeth as good as your dentist's or heart as good as your cardiologist's? What about the theologian's opinion of God, Jesus, and the Church?

Your opinion is only as good as the evidence that supports it. Period. Your opinion is always only as good as the evidence you have gathered, sifted through, and put into some logical conclusion.

Real science is a quantum leap different from in high school, cook book science. By any name high school science taught the guaranteed results of Betty Crocker. Your high school science book came with a

teacher's text with its already researched with the correct answers. The Manhattan project was quite different. So too is the practiced opinion of your dentist or cardiologist. The atom, your teeth and your heart present the professionals with precious information that has to be gathered, arranged, and studied. Then put out for critique which will change minds, direct action, and manifest emotions. Sometimes the most exercise we get is jumping to conclusions and making rash judgments. The latter was taught as sinful and can be fatal.

Truth is waiting to be discovered, outside of me, not made up by me.

Opinions do not change facts, no matter who proclaims the statement or with what degree of belief or volume of voice or with fist pounding certitude. If everyone was told to believe by whatever authority that the earth is flat like a Frisbee, the earth will not flatten itself out because of an opinion. Continuing to argue is of no use, truth was never the case.

Should "expert opinion" be trusted? Knowing that we've been hoodwinked in the past, of course we live with some degree of paranoia or cynicism. Experts have completed necessary academic course work, competency examinations, and are accepted by the college of their profession. These professionals are respected as university professors, school teachers, medical doctors, lawyers, judges, Certified Public Accounts, plumbers, and priests.

Finally, a risk is taken when one formulates, speaks, and lives an opinion. There is a risk of living by a different opinion! Add to that the ever present game, "Divide and Conquer"!

What is the risk of forming an opinion, belief, that Jesus is Lord and living that opinion? A risk is taken when one lives publically and openly as a Christian, or a member the Roman Catholic Church. Do you live your life according to: "Lord, to whom shall we go, you have the words of everlasting life? You are the Light, the Way, and the Truth"? (see John 6:68) Are you willing to be known as a Catholic Christian publically living not just the Ten Commandants but also the Beatitudes and Jesus' Command to love one another? Add to that the precepts of the Church!

How do you discover and discern Truth? What is the risk of acting on it? What is the risk of NOT acting on it? Do you accept ALL the Truth or only parts of it you like? Nifty questions!

THANK YOU, THANK YOU SO MUCH – all of you who organized, volunteered, and participated in our Fall Festival. The comment that touched me the most came from neighbors, not members of the parish who said: "Best EVER!

We've been coming since we moved here. It's a matter if you can't beat them, join them! So we naturally come." I pursued the matter, "You aren't members? Would you like to change that?" "Well, we belong to another Church." As the conversation continued I found we are generally good neighbors. Great to hear. It's a reflection on YOU.




