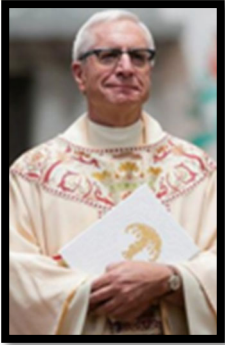

In order to be good people, we follow laws which order society. As Christian Catholics we are moral when we imitate Christ and his actions of love/service for others. Our goal is the beatific vision, the blessed and beautiful vision of God for all eternity. There is an overlap of the two circles, plain good human behavior expected even of atheists and the Christian imitation of Jesus. Christians love each other as Jesus loved and served. The behavior of the Christian is the love of Jesus extended to all people. With the example of the Good Samaritan, Last Judgment Scene, and the Prodigal Son we witness to the Gospel.

Honesty is behavior expected of all people. We all hope that we are not being deceived; that we are told the truth. Last week I introduced you to the twins - **compassion** and **empathy**. This week meet **honesty** and **trust** who are also siblings. Without honesty and trust, we are hoodwinked.

Once hoodwinked we are paranoid. "Fool me once shame on you, fool me twice shame on me." I've been fooled more than three times by the same source. Haven't you? Please agree!

Liars simply cannot be trusted. We all appreciate the truth and desire people to see, speak, and act truthfully. It's a reasonable expectation, a justifiable burden to place on all people under one roof and within a neighborhood.

Sometimes, "we just can't handle the truth." Being brutally honest might be hurtful. It might also be what someone needs to hear. Truth isn't always what we like. In one episode of *I Love Lucy*, the guys bet the girls that they could not go for a day without telling a lie. Each put the other in situations, humorous as they could be. The truth could not be told without hurt feelings. Put in a situation today; what would you tell a daughter who is simply dressed inappropriately? A son who is on his way to doing wrong? A roommate who is headed for ruin if he/she continues such a life-style? A classmate who is doing wrong and bringing others down as well? A sibling who is in fact doing something illegal? A spouse whose addiction is ruining the family?

It is here that charity, honesty and trust's other sibling, shares the spotlight. Our *Catechism* (2489) says: "Charity and respect for truth should dictate the response to every *request for information or communication*. The good and safety of others, respect for privacy, and the common good are sufficient reasons for being silent about what ought not be known or for making use of discreet language. The duty to avoid scandal often commands strict discretion. No one is bound to reveal the truth to someone who does not have the right to know it." (Italics included in original text.)

Sometimes when a person comes to confession I hear: "I don't tell the truth." I might ask: "And what would happen if you did?" That's when a good discussion and better confession happens. It is always my hope that the penitent emerges from the confessional relieved and resolved to live differently. Society will be better too!

Might I ask you something honestly – We celebrate the Eucharist, a word which means Thanksgiving at 9:00AM on Thanksgiving Day, perhaps the most religious of our secular holidays. In your charity and quest for holiness, might Thanksgiving Mass please be given priority on that morning? Priority over a football game in the park just across the street from the church or worse, on the grass beside the church. Can "that game" find time and place not in conflict with St. Juliana's Mass?

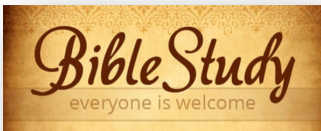

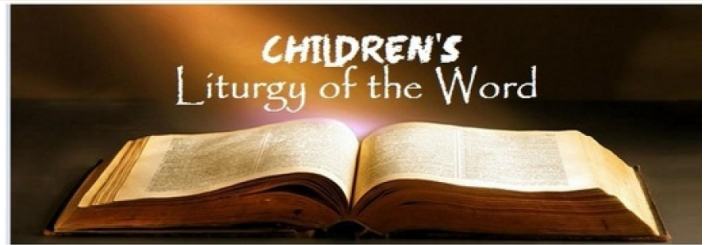
