Ha! I found two more twins! Today meet **entertainment** and **celebration**. A nice couple. Like the other twins we've met, words cannot mean whatever you want them to mean. "When I use a word," Humpty Dumpty said in rather a scornful tone, "it means just what I choose it to mean — neither more nor less." "The question is," said Alice, "whether you can make words mean so many different things." "The question is," said Humpty Dumpty, "which is to be master — — that's all." For more on this, enjoy one of my very favorite books: *Alice in Wonderland*. I strongly suggest *The Annotated Alice* by Martin Gardner. I've given the book to many folks. I've taught a lot of it. Enough about me already!

Words have meaning. Joy is not happiness. Faith is not hope. A saint is distinguished from a good person. So too, celebration is a moon shot different from entertainment.

To be entertained is to be acted upon by others who perform for us. I'm entertained by comedians, actors on stage or screen, watching folks at Disneyland, and children on Christmas day. Students insist teachers must be entertainers lest school become b-o-r-i-n-g and lapse into education only. Entertainment requires the help of someone else to distract me away from life as it really is. The point is clear in the musical tune "**Let ME Entertain YOU**" (Bold mine). YouTube Louise as Gypsy Rose Lee - sing the song from *Gypsy*, after that listen to Ethyl Merman sing "*Everything's coming up Roses*" (sorry Bette Midler is no Ethyl Merman!) "Let me entertain you, Let me make you smile. Let me do a few tricks. Some old and then some new tricks, I'm very versatile. **And if you're real good, I'll make you feel good, I'd want your spirit to climb.** So let me entertain you." Understand the person being entertained is passive! Listen to Richard Harris sing: "*What Do Simple Folk Do*" from *Camelot*: "What do the simple folk do to help them escape when they're blue? The shepherd who is ailing, the milkmaid who is glum, the cobbler who is wailing from nailing his thumb." What do they do? There's a quiz next week! Children around the tree and house on Christmas day are entertaining; you'll know that when there are no more children. Entertained, we find some way to escape, something to do when we are blue. Entertainment ends when the play or song concludes, when Christmas is boxed up, and all go home, where life goes on.

To celebrate is to act out our own performance for ourselves. To celebrate is to mark out our own affirmation of the goodness of life as it really is, even with all of its distractions. Celebration means that we greet life and shout "YES" instead of sighing and saying "Well Maybe." To celebrate is to dance like the wedding in *Fiddler on the Roof*. To celebrate is to sing the joy of our appreciation, to clap in cadence to our soul. Celebration is to bet on the gamble that life is meant not merely to be chewed but tasted, not treading water but swimming, not breathing but living. Those who celebrate encounter life in abundance.

Parish, pause during this time of year and church season: what is there to celebrate in the midst of affluence if you are poor, in the midst of family reunions if you are alone, in the midst of love when you feel rejected? What is there to celebrate at Christmas — maybe nothing if celebration is reserved only for the lighthearted and lucky.

Long ago a child was born into a world as violent as ours is. That same child became a man who died a violent and tortured death. Christians are summoned to go beyond what is feasible, manageable, even consumable when we enter into a celebration of the message of our faith — the single proclamation of the presence of the Kingdom of God - to accept that we are part of a Great Mystery that Almighty God is setting before us with lavish yet humble examples of grace, compassion, empathy, honesty and trust, unity, peace, and love.

Who is leading you to Christ this Christmas? Not to be entertained by a big tree, a jolly old fellow who might be a lady in a fellow's costume, not to be entertained by a Hollywood movie you see every year, or songs sung around a piano again this year. Really notice the manger scene; enter into the celebration of Christmas, celebrate Mary, Joseph, shepherds, a drummer boy who kept them awake, and wise people of all sorts who found Jesus. Enter into the mystery the crèche celebrates. Visit it quietly and often.



Celebrate Christmas; our salvation is at hand. Take time to celebrate before you've allowed others to amuse you to debt and death. Don't let the celebration of Christmas pass with entertainment only.

**ST. VINCENT DE PAUL
ANNUAL REPORT**

St. Vincent de Paul Ministry has “closed the books” on our fiscal year ending last September and we wanted to share the results with you:

For St. Vincent de Paul FY2018, the major elements of the \$31,881 incurred for our neighbors in need (“Friends”) are:

- 1) \$6,290 for food in the Pantry beyond the generous parishioner food donations;
- 2) \$13,406 for rental assistance;
- 3) \$6,381 for gift cards (Christmas Food/Toy Drive gift cards, gas cards, food gift cards, etc...); and
- 4) \$5,447 for motel assistance for temporary housing.

These monies were used performing 56 home visits helping approximately 224 people and 1,700 visits to the Pantry by our neighbors in need (Friends) distributing a retail value of \$129,860 worth of food. St. Vincent de Paul ministry (SVdP) accomplished this with 3,600 member volunteer hours and over 12,000 estimated volunteer miles.

Fiscal Year 2018 Highlights

- 1) The over 50% increase in the retail value of the food distributed for FY18 vs.

FY17 was due to implementation of the Grocery Rescue program by a small but dedicated group of Vincentians weekly picking up, sorting, and storing donated food from both Albertson’s and Target in our Pantry,

- 2) Also with the generous financial support of the St. Juliana community, SVdP was able to accomplish Phase 1 of providing air conditioning for the Pantry so that both the fresh produce as well as the non-perishable goods donated by the Parish will stay fresher for a longer period of time. In FY19, Phase 2 will provide the rewiring of the Pantry so that the air conditioner installed in Phase 1 will be operational.

On behalf of our East Fullerton neighbors in need, we wish to acknowledge and thank the St. Juliana community for their continuing support of SVdP. May you keep SVdP in your prayers as we continue our ministry.

JEAN M. TWENGE, PHD - SPEAKING AT ST. JULIANA JAN 2019

The iGen is the first generation to spend their entire childhood in the age of the smartphone, and this fact alone seems to have an important impact on who they are and how they relate to the world. More than previous generations, they are obsessed with safety, focused on tolerance, and have no patience for inequality. They are also "on the brink of the worst mental health crisis in decades."

In this lively talk on **January 13 and 14** at our St. Juliana Parish Center we will explore the idea that iGen may be growing up more slowly than previous generations. Also, learn what practical tools may be utilized to best meet the developmental needs of children and encourage their independence and autonomy.

ABOUT THE SPEAKER

Jean Twenge, Ph.D, is a professor of Psychology at San Diego State University and the author of more than 140 scientific publications and books, including *iGen: Why Today's Super-Connected Kids Are Growing Up Less Rebellious, More Tolerant, Less Happy-and Completely Unprepared for Adulthood*. Dr. Twenge frequently gives talks and seminars on teaching and working with today's young generation based on a dataset of 11 million young people. Her research has appeared in *The Atlantic* and *The New York Times* (to name a few) and she has been featured on the *Today Show*, *NBC Nightly News*, *Fox & Friends*, *NPR* and *CNN*.

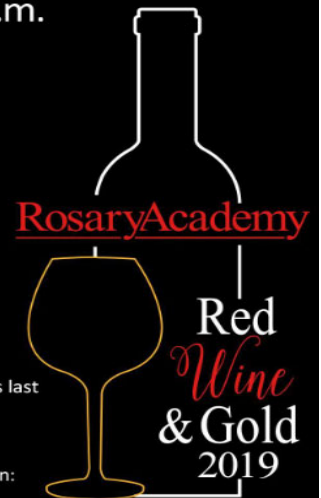
