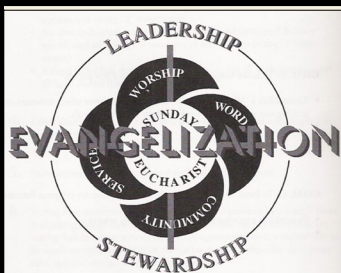

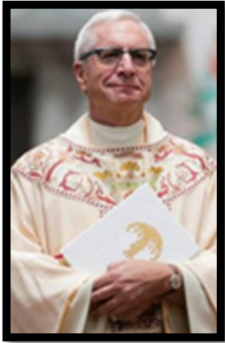

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

“Rabbi, it is good that we are here.” *Who* are we? *Where* are we? *Where is here?* *When* are we here? We are the Faithful of Jesus Christ, His Body, the Church. Can you name a more privileged group? We are in the presence of the Lord Himself. Can you name a more privileged place to be? It is the Sabbath. How do you keep the Sabbath?

Remember the Sabbath of years ago when malls and most stores were closed! Can you imagine; Sunday with malls closed, no opened Costco, in many states no buying liquor, no car sales on Sunday, in some states professional sports were regulated. Because of “Blue Laws” in Pennsylvania, professional baseball could not begin a new inning on a Sunday after 7:00PM.

That’s a far cry from Super Bowl Sunday – from Sunday Funday! I don’t especially want to return to “Blue Laws” – but nostalgically....they made sense.

Sunday should be a day to resist the regular, every day. Sunday offers an alternative to “everyday”, it is rest time. What is it for you?

If you find your life “weary” and with “heavy burdens” review the Sabbath commandment. “How good it is to spend time with the Lord.” Not just church time, but the day. How is your Sunday different from other days? A Sunday with family, a meal together? Spaghetti, every Sunday – such WAS my life!

How is going to church and being in church different from going to any auditorium and being in any public space? The Catholic church is THE place where Jesus certainly is! He lives here! Here, the church is where his community is. In the presence of Jesus, how is one to act? After encountering Jesus in Word and Sacrament, is your life changed, are you converted?

The Transfiguration that is proclaimed in the Gospel passage today is quite profound. Jesus took the select disciples away with himself, away from the others. In the presence of Jesus, the disciples acted on terms other than their own. They had to put their ordinary life, their ordinary impulses aside to be instructed by Jesus and to live with him. Jesus is gracious and merciful. He shows compassion and empathy and is available even when he retreats to “the other side” of the lake, even when he slips “away to pray.” Except for ardent rule keepers, he was able to share grief and pain, joy and hope. Such is the way he brought the Good News of salvation to those who were attentive; poor and alienated.



Jesus led his disciples away. That was the turning point in their lives. It is also our turning toward the center. He took them on a journey different from their own way. Their journey was on God’s terms. In times long past Abraham, in the first reading, they discovered that truth. Noah, Moses, Jeremiah, Mary, and the chosen disciples discovered that Truth – the Truth that life is on God’s terms and it cannot be otherwise, their lives were forever changed.

Today, we too receive God’s plan, especially when we pause and resist the “common life-style of the kingdom of everyday” and observe the Sabbath. **This Lent, pause to know, love, and serve God. Come to the church, not as any auditorium but to the place where Jesus is present in the tabernacle. Come in silence. Come to speak to him. Come to listen to Jesus speak to you.**

Practice devotions of all sorts, with leaders or not. The Lord is here. Where are you? The church doors are open and the lights are on. How good it is to find the Lord in His house, in His community of St. Juliana Falconieri.

The Blue Laws, the closure of malls and shops, made a point. **Today, without civil laws, because of a divine commandment: make room for God in your LIFE, a good Lenten habit for the rest of your life.**

“We are here.”
