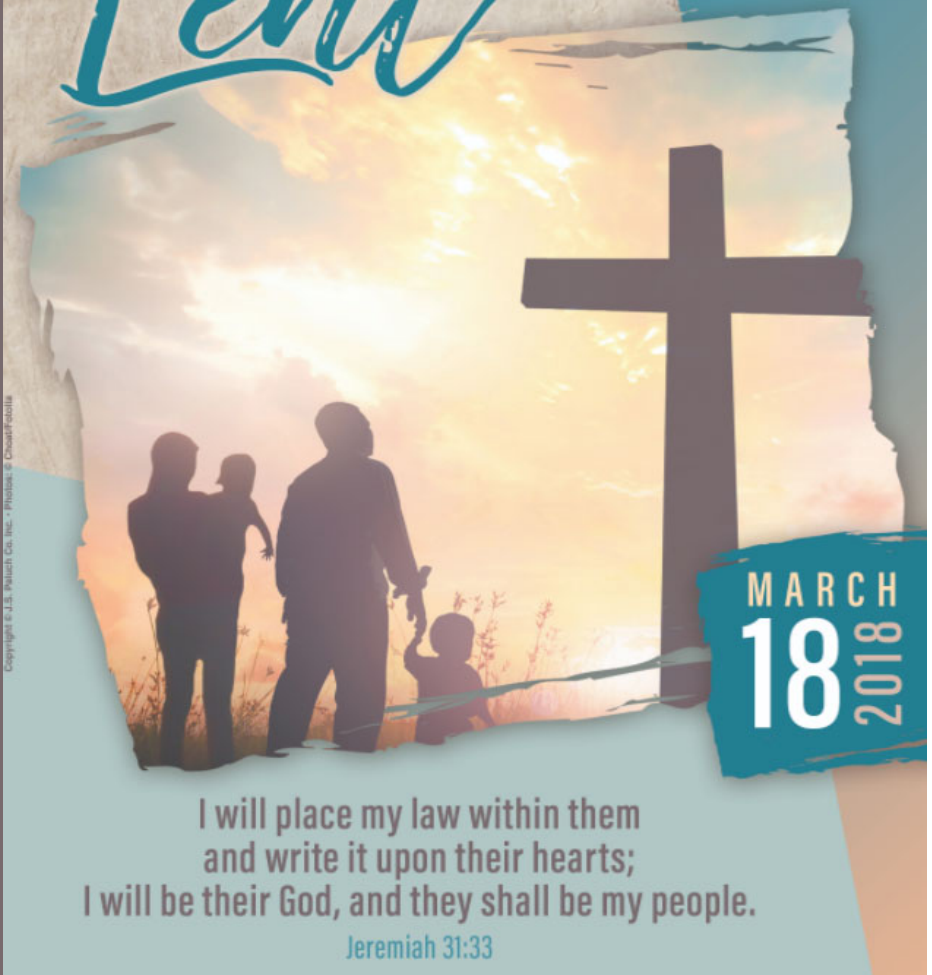

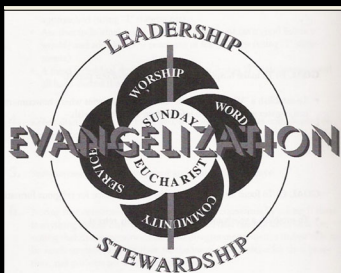

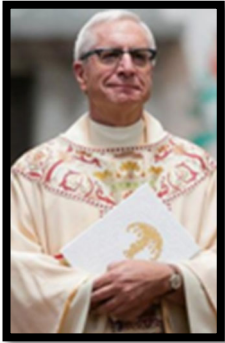

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

One of my very favorite works of literature is **Alice in Wonderland**. It should be read every year to keep one from going mad. Caution: I've not read it in at least three years! Buy **The Annotated Alice** by Martin Gardner as a graduation or summer reading present for yourself or someone else. It's marvelous!

Just after Humpty Dumpty tries to convince Alice that she would be better off celebrating un-birthdays rather than birthdays, the round wise-guy says: "there's glory for you!" "Glory" replies Alice, "I don't know what you mean by 'glory,'" " Humpty, in his pompous voice proclaims; "When I use a word, it means just what I choose it to mean - neither more nor less."

At least more or less, how did John the gospel writer choose glory to mean? The voice of Jesus said: "the hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified" and "Father, glorify your name." The voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it and will glorify it again." Glory means, "Exalt or bring renown, a special distinction." This is the special distinction that comes from the obedience that made him perfect so that he could become the source of eternal salvation for all who would obey him in the future ages.

For the longest time I thought that being perfect meant being without mistake, no error, every answer correct with the extra credit completed. After being re-tooled, I have come to understand that to be perfect means that not that I have no error but that I have no death—the life that is perfect is the life that does not end with death. The only way Jesus' life would lack renown is if it were to end with death. The fact is that death does not end his life. The hope and joy is that death does not end the life of any believer. Our special distinction is that of all living things, we will live with the Risen Lord and His Father forever. We can be saved from death because he was saved from death.

Try to convince yourself that just as that seed must lose its self to live, so too must you lose yourself. It is much more than the discipline of growing up winning valedictorian, and "all the best" awards. It is the discipline of realizing that at one time it certainly seemed as though my parents were answerable to me. When I fussed, cried, or stunk they came responding to my needs. Once I started to grow older, I lost my personal valets. I learned that I had to be obedient to them, not the other way around. Oh, the pain of the seed. Having to bust open itself to grow. But, how beautiful the growth! The more we want to hang on, the smaller we remain. The more we let go, the more we recognize the special distinction of the enormous gift of life we are offered the more glorious each individual life becomes.

Jesus tells us that we can have part in his perfect life if we leave our imperfect ways of narcissism and inertia. He does not tell us this for his sake but for ours. As Christ was obedient to his Father, so must we be. Those words, "thy will be done" can't mean what we want them to mean. His will is for our life, to be full, complete, and perfect in his presence forever.

Jesus promises that he will draw us to himself. That promise is real and it is a pure gift. Those Greeks in today's gospel had the right desire, to see Jesus. Baptism has brought us that special distinction of being the brothers and sisters of Jesus, sons and daughters of the Father. As we accept the gift again, let us embrace it fully. Let us be the exalted ones who follow our Lord and serve him as we bust out of our tiny selves and see the glory of God in each other. Can any of us be obedient to the needs of the Lord and reach out in active service to a brother or sister in need? How am I willing to grow and change? Whom am I willing to serve? Do I need to lose myself and forgive someone just to make my life a bit bigger, the circle a tad more perfect this time? Can I die to selfishness and grow new fruit?



Nifty questions! The time for our glory—our perfection—is drawing near.

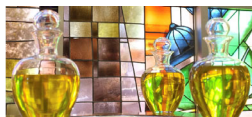

Last Saturday, March 10, near the end of the morning of prayer in front of Planned Parenthood in Orange there were two confirmed saves while parishioners from St. Juliana were there praying. Nina Kosi, Mary Morgan, and Diane Johannes had just arrived to start their prayer vigil and Barbara Legas was just preparing to leave. There were two other groups there when two cars leaving the facility stopped to talk to one of the other prayer warriors and Father Alan from St. Michael's Abbey. This is the E-mail that Barbara received from the Orange Diocese coordinator for the 40 Days Vigils later that afternoon confirming the saves.

"TWO babies and their parents were saved today! The prayers under the rain and pouring out blessings. Praise God! Yadira just reported that she directed a couple to park next to the Storage Center across the street from PP to further talk with them and asked Father Alan, from St. Michael's Abbey to help her save the baby.. They both crossed the street to talk to the couple. Yadira said that Fr. Alan told the couple that last week he attended a Rachel Vineyards Retreat for women wounded by abortion, he shared the pain that women experienced and with a visible sign of emotion in his voice. The man wanted to keep the baby but the women didn't. Father Alan prayed with them and begged her to keep the child. He even named it "Little Adam" after the father. And gave them a blessing. 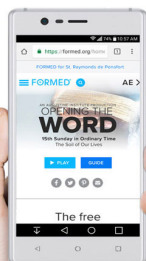

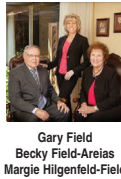
