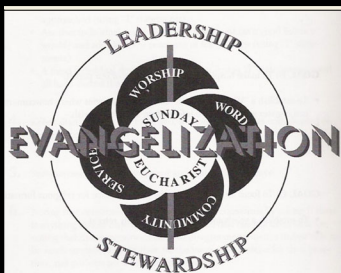

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

My second grade teacher died last week. Sister (Sr) Mara Anne Palomares, OP (Dominican of Mission San Jose) was just perfect. That whole congregation is so wonderful; I'd recommend them to anyone. Until I read her obituary, I never knew Sr. Mara Anne's age. She was just fifteen years older than me. She entered the Dominicans in 1959, she was teaching me in 1962! So don't tell me: "If she taught you in the second grade she must have been as old as a dinosaur and quite mean!" She taught dinosaurs, like me. If you knew her and she was mean to you, most likely any mean streak came AFTER or because she taught my class first! She was compassionate. The night before my Mom died, when Mom was in hospice care, Sr. Mara Anne came to our home to visit Mom and me. Together we prayed the Memorare prayer which she taught me Y-E-A-R-S ago. She had to guide me through it, not because I forgot it, but because I was so nervous! Sister was present at many of the celebrations of my life; including reading at my installation as pastor here at St. Juliana's. It was always a grace for me to celebrate Mass at St. Catherine's when she was in the congregation. I thought the world of her. In short, I loved her.

Every school day for the eight years I was at St. Catherine's, "the military school", what seemed to be an army of Dominican Sisters (penguins by the looks of them in their habits) marched from the convent to their classrooms. They were armed to teach the cadet corps of Anaheim's Little Army with faith, hope, love, courage, and common sense. They were young too. I was told that in the early 1960s, when I was a cadet, the average age of the sisters in the convent was twenty-something! And there was, as I mentioned, an army of them. How times have changed.

If you were in a Catholic second grade, or are in one now – pause and think of your second grade teacher, second grade in particular. Thank that teacher before it is too late.

For many years I taught a fabulous old book that was taught to me; *Leisure the basis of Culture*, written by Josef Pieper. Pieper was a German Catholic philosopher and important figure in the resurgence of interest in the thought of St. Thomas Aquinas in the early-to-mid 20th Century philosophy. (Google).

In *Leisure* Pieper makes a point of distinguishing between working for a wage and being paid an honorarium. One day a student was having a difficult time grasping the difference between them. It's the difference between cost of living wage for a widget maker set against the salary to General Eisenhower or the research scientist. So, I asked if he went to a Catholic grammar school. He did. I continued; "Recall your second grade teacher. Specifically your second grade teacher at the Catholic grammar school. She had to do all the things any second grade teacher does; listen to the sharing of the students – them telling her of sibling rivalries, puppies being born, the cat getting lost, grandparents getting sick, and new furniture in the house. The second grade teacher encourages the student who does not fit in with the rest, teaches the alphabet, printing, and the primary skills of reading and arithmetic which are the foundations essential for the rest of education. At the Catholic school she does all of that and also prepares the students for First Penance and First Holy Communion, teaching a new and profound relationship with the Lord. If the students miss that relationship, they miss the meaning of the sacraments. If the Catholic school second grade teacher does not inspire her students, both our faith and academic learning fail. The students are turned off to both faith and learning and believe that school is little more than a jail sentence. How do you put a dollar value on the worth of the second grade teacher in the Catholic school? You can't put them on an hourly pay scale, therefore they are given an honorarium that does not approach their worth. Don't get me wrong, all other teachers are valuable. But there is something about the second grade teacher that is priceless."

When I finished, the high school senior boy had a red face and tears in his eyes. I asked: "Tell me, your Mom teaches the second grade at a Catholic grammar school?" He responded: "Yes!"

That night I had a phone call from his parents. "Father, did you spend a lot of class time today talking about Catholic school second grade teachers?" "Why yes I did." Figuring that I was going to get chewed out by the parent, surprisingly I heard: "Why, thank you, he sees his Mom differently tonight!"

That's the story of the Catholic school second grade teacher.

Sr. Mara Anne, OP, rest in peace – remember us to God. Thanks for the memories.

Thank you SO MUCH for all the Happy Birthday wishes, greetings, cards, and gifts. You are most generous! Thanks and God bless you with good health and great happiness.

Thank you, all of you who planned, ministered and participated in the "Encounter!" worship service. It was phenomenal! I am grateful to all who served the community last Sunday night. We hope to see you at all future Encounter! worship services. Our Monday night Gospel classes are well attended, thank you! I encourage you to join us. It's never too late. Just come! The Fish Fry! WOW – best in the diocese! Thanks to all who serve our community, you are a very dedicated group. God bless. Bring yourself, your family, your friends, and your enemies. St. Juliana – THE BEST.

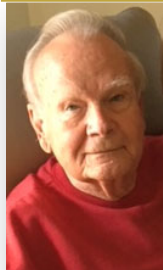

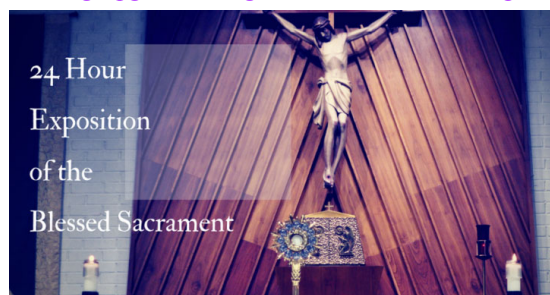

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS

If your parish is reading from Year B of the Lectionary today, and not Year A, as is normally done when there are elect present for the scrutinies and preparing for Easter baptism, you hear about Jesus driving the money-changers from the temple. If you wished to get as close as possible to this site today, you would in fact be at a Muslim shrine, the Dome of the Rock, built on the ruins of Herod's temple.

Archeologists believe that this striking, gold-domed crown of a shrine is set precisely where the Holy of Holies once was. Jews believe that the rock is the exact spot where Abraham was prepared to sacrifice Isaac. It is not a mosque, as some think, but a shrine, the oldest one in the Muslim world. For them, the rock is the place from which the Prophet Mohammed ascended on a visit to heaven. The Crusaders mistook the shrine for the actual Temple of Solomon, and the infamous Knights Templar used it as their headquarters and model for their churches elsewhere. The geometric perfection of the shrine is a mathematician's dream. The inscriptions are not exactly hospitable though, since they encourage Christians to “depart from error” and declare that “Jesus son of Mary was only a messenger of God.” In ancient times, those who prayed here after walking around the rock were given a certificate entitling the bearer to admission to paradise. The ticket had to be buried with them.

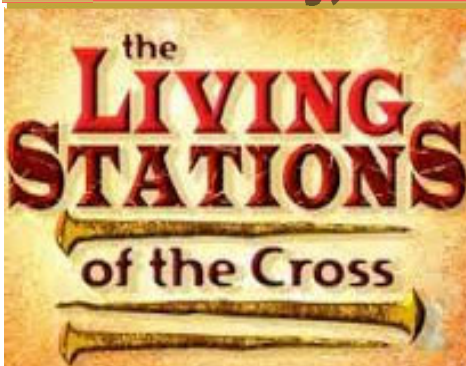

KEEP HOLY THE SABBATH

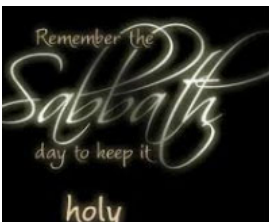
There's no better way to deepen our Lenten practice than to review the Ten Commandments. The first three, having to do with our right relationship to God, get the most ink. The one we busy people probably have the most problem with is keeping holy the Sabbath.

If we take this commandment literally, babies will go undiapered and dishes will stay on the table, or perhaps meals will not be served. The sick will go unattended and nothing that has anything to do with physical labor will be done. Is mental labor really work? How about changing that dirty diaper (poor baby!)?

We need to depend on God to discern how to observe real Sabbath time in our lives. The point of this commandment is that God has given us a great gift: one whole day per week

when we are free to rest, worship God, sing, feast, love, and rejoice. As Psalm 19 proclaims: "The law of the LORD is perfect, / refreshing the soul" (19:8). Our Sabbath rest is a great gift, to be received from God with joy, not with nitpicking.

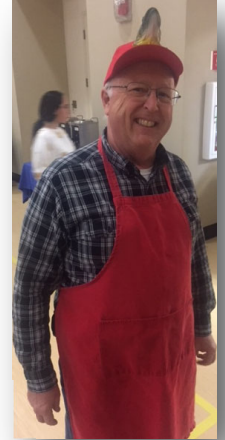
