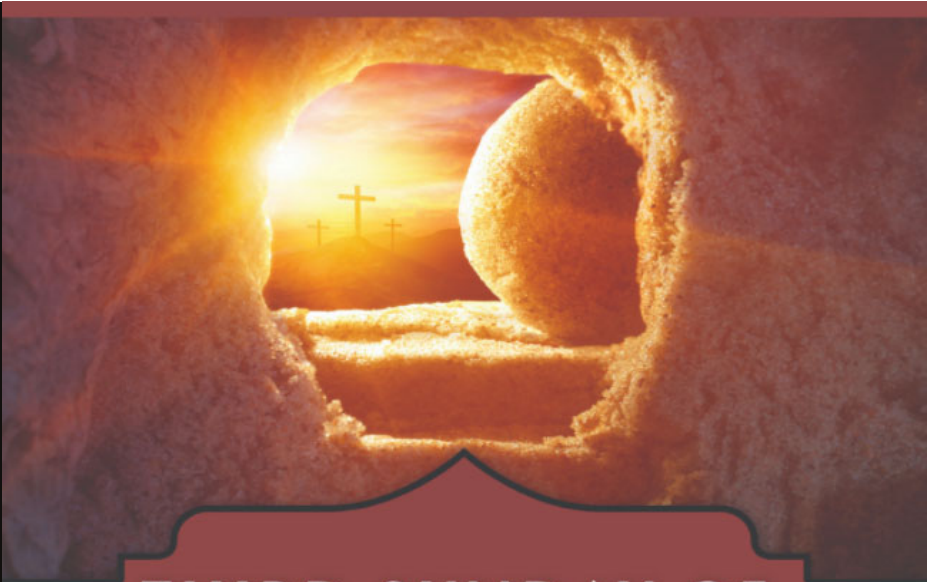

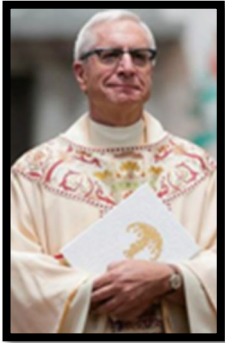

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

Friendships are begun with recognition of the other. Until I recognize that another person exists and is present to me, that other remains as anonymous as the entire population of China is to me. And I've never been to China! I must first allow the other to "Come and See" who I am and what I am about and then we share time, thoughts, and self-energy *together*. Over time we can move from anonymity to friend – even to close friend. Friendship is sharing; sharing life stories, sharing food, revealing self-identity.

So too it is with the gospel men today on the way to Emmaus. These ordinary people had great expectations for the Jesus who invited them to a relationship when he invited them to "Come and See." After all they had been through they might have believed that they were taken in by a real huckster. Their supposed thoroughbred was defeated; mocked, ridiculed, executed on a cross, and laid to rest. Then the tomb was empty, they are confused and heartsick the victims of shattered expectations. These two men knew about Jesus but they failed to know Jesus as their friend. As far as they knew, Jesus was dead! Some women were talking differently, but everyone knows how credulous they are! These men believed they could control Truth.

What is the source of their sickness? Could it be that they only *knew about* Jesus but didn't have a *personal relationship* with him? As the Adam and Eve teaching is a prototype teaching of every sin, the Emmaus journey is a prototype teaching of every conversion.

When they allowed Jesus to control the Truth, *they* changed; *they* were converted. All along Jesus taught them: "The Son of Man must suffer, die, and rise on the third day." Finally, Jesus gives them "proofs" offered by all the Scripture. But Scripture and theology aren't enough; they serve only as preparation for faith. Anyone can study religion with the mind of a dis-passionate observer. But nobody can practice the faith that way. The mind can be prepared academically for a test about God; conversion only takes place when the heart is softened and ready.

The men on the journey are not to be blamed. Many of our choices are made rationally. A husband can make a rational choice to allow a doctor to operate on his unconscious wife. But ask that man why he chose her to be his wife and he'll be without a rational answer! She appealed to him then as she does now to his heart. Love is not a decision based on reason as Thomas More explained: "Finally, it isn't a matter of reason; it's a matter of love."

Jesus continued to tell them that through their conversion they will recognize His real presence when they share a meal in His name and they will serve him when they deeply care for those in need as He did. What Jesus teaches is that he might not have been the messiah they wanted, he didn't live or die the way they wanted but he was the messiah in the way that *God* wanted. And until we yield to that Truth, we will never be fulfilled.

They aren't to be blamed. Too often the best of our race were called "idiots and fools!" Columbus sailing west, Galileo claiming that the sun had to be the center of the solar system, Walt Disney discovering a theme park in Anaheim. Truth will always outlast all of our denials. Earth is not the center of the universe no matter how much we want it to be, Jesus rose from the dead no matter who doesn't believe it. Truth might seem like nonsense but always remember that some nonsense is better than other nonsense!

It seems unthinkable that God would come to us, much less care for us, as a mother cares for her child even if that kid should wind up in prison. Yet it's true. And it all begins with recognizing that love, which is unconditionally present in the scripture, is the meal, and is the others in our community. Won't you reach out and greet the Lord today? If not today, when?

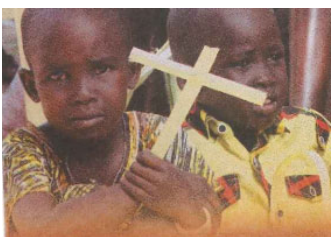

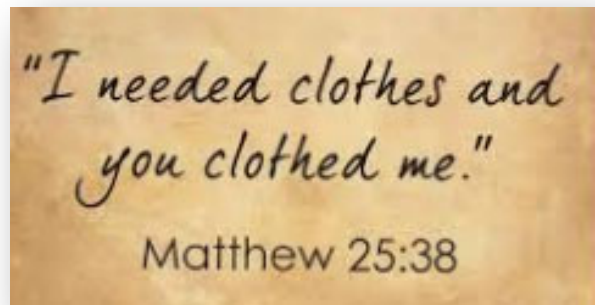


THANKS FOR THE CLOTHES

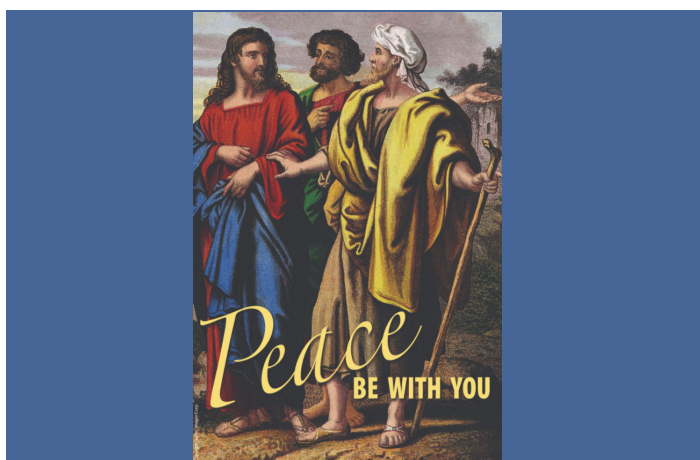

SPEAKING THE TRUTH: THE BOLD INTEGRITY OF OSCAR ROMERO

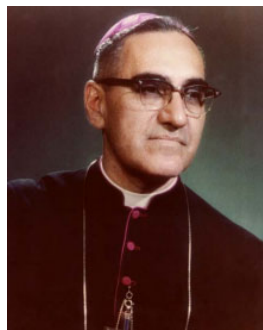

Ordained a Roman Catholic priest in 1942, Oscar Romero was named a bishop in El Salvador in 1970. In 1977, he was appointed to the highest position of the Catholic Church in his country. Archbishop Romero was viewed by many as a social conservative who chose to remain silent and neutral during his country's long and vicious civil war. However, when Father Rutilio Grande, SJ, his close friend, was assassinated by a death squad for his activism toward the poor, Romero wrote, "If they have killed him for doing what he did, then, I, too, need to walk the same path."



He did so, boldly defending the rights of the poor and vulnerable,
and condemning the violation of human rights.

He was assassinated while celebrating Mass in March 1980.

Hopefully, they will realize they are wasting their time.
A bishop will die, but the church of God, which is the people, will never perish."*

BELIEVING IN JESUS CHRIST

Throughout the Easter season, all three of the Sunday readings are taken from the New Testament—the Christian scriptures. Together they explore what it means to believe in Jesus as the Christ, the One who fulfilled the prophecies of the Jewish scriptures.

Today's selections refer to our human weakness, yet they emphasize the forgiveness and peace that are available to those who put their faith in "Jesus Christ the righteous one" (1 John 2:2). In the Acts of the Apostles Peter invites everyone to "repent, therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be wiped away" (Acts 3:19). The First Letter of John calls Jesus Christ "expiation for our sins" (1 John 2:2). Finally, in the Gospel Jesus greets the disciples with "Peace" and urges them to preach "repentance, for the forgiveness of sins" (Luke 24:47).

Jordan Hoiberg – Orange County Catholic Worker

The Catholic Worker Movement began simply on May 1, 1933, when a journalist named Dorothy Day and a philosopher named Peter Maurin teamed to publish and distribute a newspaper called "The Catholic Worker".

This radical paper promoted the biblical promise of justice and mercy.

Jordan Hoiberg is one of four community members at the Orange County Catholic Worker Isaiah House in Santa Ana. Jordan helps manage the Orange County Worker's Outreach ministries at the Civic Center and the Santa Ana River Trail homeless encampments.

Guided by a commitment to fulfillment of the corporal works of mercy, Orange County Catholic worker ministries provide over 1,000 meals a week and various other necessities to the residents of Orange County homeless. Through these services, the ministries Jordan manages, actively engage individuals experiencing homelessness in fellowship and community allowing him to address the needs overlooked by nonprofit service providers and serve as a witness to their humanity and dignity.

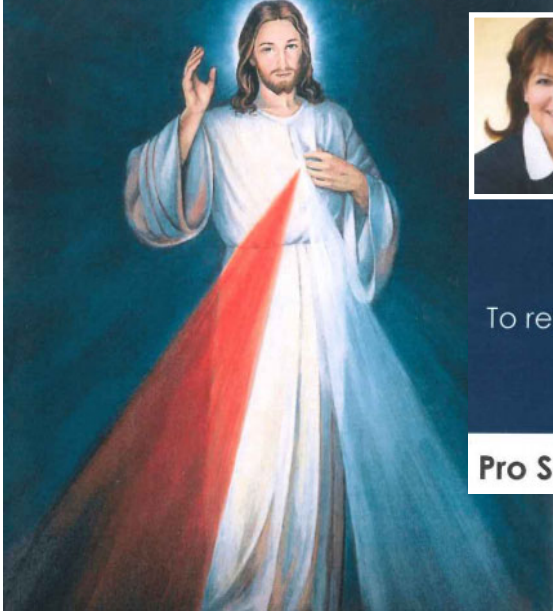

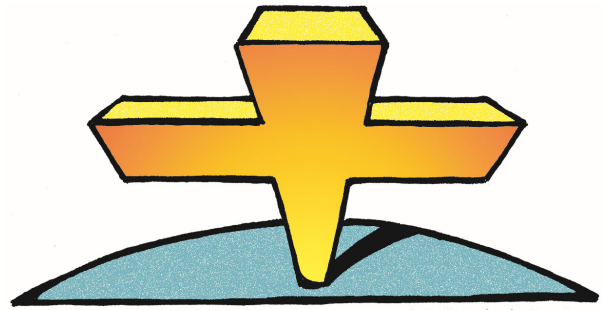
