A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

The Sunday following Easter; traditionally it's called "Low Sunday" low following the high of Easter just the week before; Pope St. John Paul II named it "Divine Mercy Sunday" celebrating devotion on a Sunday of the Lord. I think of it as St. Thomas Sunday. The Gospel reading is the lesson of St. Thomas the Apostle encountering Jesus. We are let in on Jesus telling us the secret of who he is and what he is all about. St. Thomas teaches a lesson about certitude, doubt, and faith. The lesson is ours to learn.

Except for Peter and John, Thomas is the only Apostle with a personality. The others come from the "Apostle" file at Central Casting: beard, talent for puzzled looks, the ability to push people away from Jesus, and to run away from Jesus when he needs them.

Thomas was nobody's patsy. Some pious types fault him for having too little faith. I don't. Thomas didn't have anything substantial to base his faith on. Call me Grumpy all you want. I say anyone who says faith is "a blind leap in the dark" is Dopey, because a blind leap in the dark is dopey. If someone says he just saw a unicorn eating grass in Acacia Park, I'd like to look for myself: "No, you dope, it's a horse with an arrow in its forehead." If ten certifiable Good Friday cowards tell me they've seen a man who's been stone-cold-dead come back to life, I'd like heavier evidence than their improbable word.

Something in me is more akin to Thomas the Apostle than to Thomas Aquinas. Thomas Aquinas is so certain about so many articles of faith. Certitude where I find cracks. The best that physics, the hardest of the sciences, can offer is a high degree of probability. What ought we give to a person who is making an inquiry into the faith: a catechism with iron-clad answers or a community of people on a journey to Jesus?



God gave us minds before he gave us authorities who know it all. One of the few things I'm certain of is there's not much a thinking person can be certain of. It could be that the great sin is certitude and the great virtue is doubt. Archie Bunker and all prejudiced people express certitudes about every complex question from the Church to welfare recipients. And they're just as certain they are not brainwashed by the media or by pop culture. And they have precious little evidence to support their ill-founded and illogical conclusions. Prepare to be resented when you know more than someone else does because your knowledge threatens their self-serving certitudes. Most likely those same people resent God for the same reason.

Certitude, in fact, was precisely what Adam and Eve hankered for when they ate the fruit of the Tree of Knowledge--with lamentable results: "Eat this; you'll become like God." God has no doubts; neither do diamonds, bananas, or birds. Only humans doubt, because--unlike rocks, or plants, or animals who can't think at all and unlike God who is all knowing --humans can think and a lot of times they do imperfectly. A lot of times all we can hope for are temporarily adequate answers. There is always more to discover--about everything, even about God who is continually unfolding Himself before us.

So, too, with the ten apostles who claimed to have seen Jesus alive again--and with the women who first reported the news. When you have fifteen people testifying to an experience, and they have nothing to gain by deceiving you, you have to be skeptical about your skepticism; critical of your criticisms. What's more, those same witnesses went to their deaths -- deaths they could have escaped if they'd just denied their own experience of the risen Jesus.

An act of faith in the risen Jesus isn't a blind leap in the dark. It's a calculated risk. Today, as "Doubting Thomas" did, gather the data and open yourself to Christ and let him "prove" himself to you.

Thank you for all the encouraging comments you expressed regarding our Easter liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, the Great Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday itself. We do worship God with joy and gladness. Thank you, everyone, who participated and celebrated with us -- all ministers, choir, servers, and celebrants. God bless!

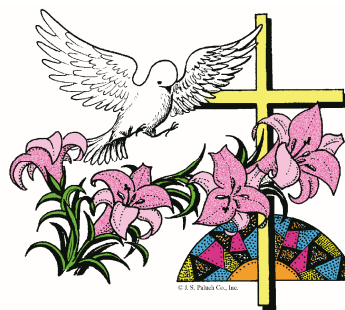

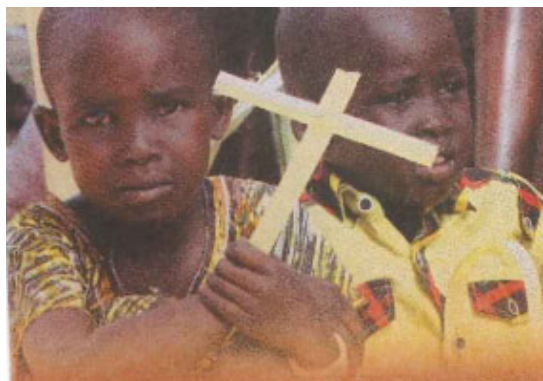

“SO THAT YOU MAY BELIEVE”

It is not often that the author of one of the books of the Bible comes right out and tells us directly why he is writing what he is writing. In this Sunday's Gospel reading, taken from the conclusion of John's Gospel, the author tells us that he has chosen to record these events so “that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name” (20:31).

The letter of John echoes this idea by saying that “everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ is begotten by God” (5:1)—what we might refer to as being “born again.” Our reading from the Acts of the Apostles for this Second Sunday of Easter shows us exactly what it looks like when believers are born again through faith.

Jordan Hoiberg – Orange County Catholic Worker

The Catholic Worker Movement began simply on May 1, 1933, when a journalist named Dorothy Day and a philosopher named Peter Maurin teamed to publish and distribute a newspaper called “The Catholic Worker”.

This radical paper promoted the biblical promise of justice and mercy.

Jordan Hoiberg is one of four community members at the Orange County Catholic Worker Isaiah House in Santa Ana. Jordan helps manage the Orange County Worker’s Outreach ministries at the Civic Center and the Santa Ana River Trail homeless encampments.

Guided by a commitment to fulfillment of the corporal works of mercy, Orange County Catholic worker ministries provide over 1,000 meals a week and various other necessities to the residents of Orange County homeless. Through these services, the ministries Jordan manages, actively engage individuals experiencing homelessness in fellowship and community allowing him to address the needs overlooked by nonprofit service providers and serve as a witness to their humanity and dignity.

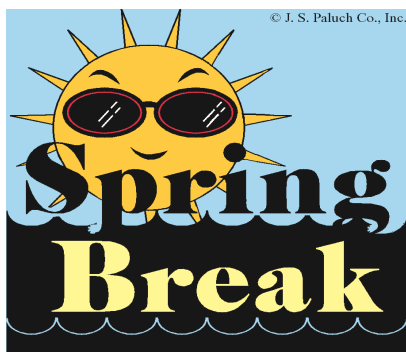

It is originally based on the Catholic devotion to the Divine Mercy that Saint Faustina Kowalska reported as part of her encounter with Jesus, and is associated with special promises from Jesus and indulgences issued by the Church.

The devotion to Divine Mercy Sunday grew rapidly after its designation by Pope John Paul II and is now widely celebrated by Catholics.

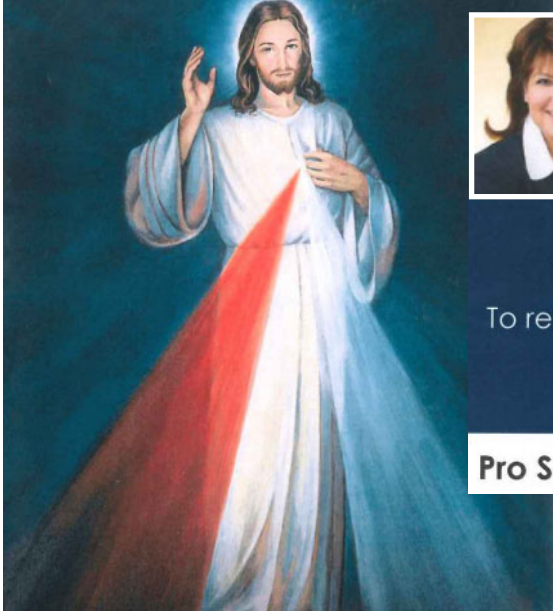

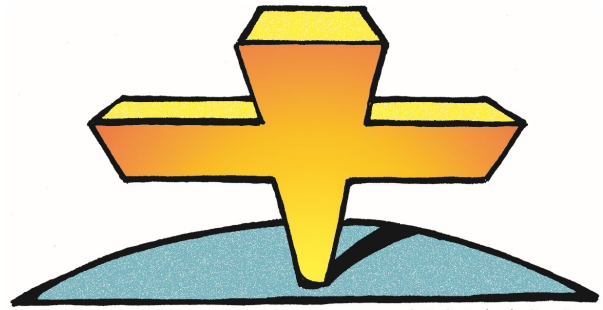

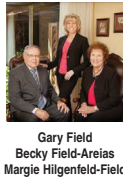
