
THE PARISH AS ONE BODY

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

I hope the deep experiences of our lives are kind of the same. Of all the places I have been, there is no place better than a meal with family or good friends. It does not have to be in a fine restaurant or glamorous home, just family and friends. Not because the time is without argument – I'm from an Italian family – but because we are sharing a meal, especially a family meal together. Until mostly all of them died, family meals were especially important. It might have always been the same routine, as a ritual, the same spaghetti EVERY Sunday, but that was what we looked forward to, what we did, how we knew we belonged. When she was in her mid-eighties, my maternal grandmother decided to sell her home and move in with my long widowed mother. I almost always joined them for Sunday dinner; salad, spaghetti, fish or meat, dessert. Wine. One particular Sunday Grandma wasn't so happy;

she was greatly unsettled. "What's wrong?" I asked innocently. Mom made all kinds of gestures, no comment, just arms moving like a Dutch windmill. "Don't seem like Sunday, no macaronis!" said Grandma. Grandma always called them "macaronis." Just then I understood. "It is not Sunday." I lied. "Yes it is, you're here." She knew better. "Grandma, it's Monday, a day off of school." "No, it's not, I'll show you!" She went and got the newspaper, "See, it says (with a long A sound) here, SUNDAY!" "That's yesterday's paper!" "I'll show you!" She turned on the television, 60 Minutes was on the air. Routine ritual gives meaning to life. Sunday macaronis with red gravy (not sauce).

It's not just routine. It's what we do to be family. It's what we do to know who we are.

The Feast of Corpus Christi that we celebrate today, is our feast of nourishment. Our feast of identity. This is REAL food, it's really the precious Body and Blood of Jesus. It's what we eat to be holy, to be like God. Unlike the food that Adam and Eve ate to be like God, they died. This is the Food of Eternal life.

Corpus Christi, the feast we celebrate today, was for centuries one of the greatest feasts of our Church. Several cities around the globe are named after it. "Sacramento" or "Corpus Christi" cities dot the states. Many parts of Catholicism still celebrate this feast on the Thursday following Trinity Sunday. In those cultures, businesses are shuttered for the day as the feast and its Sacrament is brought out into the streets for cultural ritual celebration. The consecrated host is brought in procession, brought through the everyday cobbles and muck, just as Jesus first did in Bethlehem. Kings, queens, hardened sinners, and daily communicants all fall to their knees. The community is gathered, stories are told, and food is eaten. That's the celebration of a feast.

Ah, the Eucharist! Through it a spiritual bond is forged between us and Jesus - between us and God Almighty. As His Body and Blood are coursing throughout our body and blood, we are in a more intimate relationship with Christ.

And, basically, it's as simple as that. If we have a deep faith in Jesus - a deep faith in the Eucharist - we won't need complicated religious systems or big words or faraway shrines or apparitions to bring us closer to God. The Eucharist is Jesus - is God Himself. The Eucharist is everything. What more could anyone want? I surely can't think of anything else that would (or could) bring me closer to God.

So, how do we receive our Lord in the Eucharist? Do we receive Him with wonder and awe and delight and, most of all, love? Do we greet Him as our long lost lover who has just come back to us after being away? Or, do we take Jesus for granted? When we're in line to receive Him, are we only 'going to communion' rather than 'I'm in Holy Communion with Him'? Which is it for you?

How do YOU receive the Sunday Bread of Life? It can be received every day! Celebrate the Bread of Life.

SMALL CHRISTIAN COMMUNITIES - DINNERS FOR THE HOMELESS

St. Juliana Small Christian Communities and other parishioners will be preparing dinners for the homeless June 9-29. The Interfaith Shelter Network is managed by MERCY HOUSE to assist clients who are working or seeking jobs locally. Several churches in North Orange County offer facilities to house 8-10 clients for up to 4 weeks. We will be assisting the Brea Congregational Church to supply dinners and food for breakfasts and sack lunches.

MERCY HOUSE provides the managers for the program. We deliver dinners to the church between 5:30 and 6:00 PM. Clients commit to staying up to 3 months, then go to work or interviews during the day, arrive for dinner, stay for the night, get breakfast and lunch to go, plus bus passes if needed, and counseling as needed.






