

When I reflect on my greatest teachers, I recall those who taught and encouraged me to read, especially fiction. Non-fiction is an easier read. I know, not everyone enjoys the humanities, literature and art. However, it is those soft-sciences that teach us how to be human beings. More students are directed to the "hard sciences." Hard not because good grades are difficult but because those studies have conclusions that are objective: "Either the apple falls or it does not." There is no personal choice. The soft sciences of the humanities seem to be "write what you FEEL to be true" as if there is no data to evaluate or evidence to consider. I made a homily comment last weekend: "I had physics and I got over it. (As if it were a disease.) I had mathematics to college calculus level and today my concern with math is money." All teaching is important; it trains the mind to think, to reason with data and form valid conclusions. That's way it is learned, not because of the usefulness of algebra in everyday life, but because of the beauty of the equation, the

way a character in a novel can transform your life, the beautiful sight of visual art that delights the eyes, mind, and heart.

In 1972 the United States Bishops wrote a pastoral message "To Teach as Jesus Did." His was to teach with stories that transform lives. Jesus told stories, parables, about what was ordinary with an unexpected twist that changed lives because they challenged perspectives, previously unchallenged certitudes and opened otherwise closed windows and doors. With stories Jesus made bridges leading to service of neighbor and love for the stranger. Short stories and novels have their own ways of coming into our lives and awakening in us a different perspective. It is not possible to read *To Kill A Mockingbird, Huckleberry Finn, The Catcher in the Rye*, or *Hard Times* and not be made aware of human life. Psst: that's exactly why they are or were on the canon of literature to be read in classrooms across our country. Short stories do the same. In classrooms we considered *A Good Man Is Hard To Find, The Gift of The Magi*, or *The Love Song of J. Alfred Prufrock*. John F. Kennedy famously said: "When power leads man toward arrogance, poetry reminds him of his limitations. When power narrows the areas of man's concern, poetry reminds him of the richness and diversity of his existence... for art establishes the basic human truths with must serve as the touchstone of our judgment." Literature and visual art awaken the human in us. With them we are invited into another person's life to transform our own life.

Mike will preside at the 5:00PM Mass on Sunday August 5<sup>th</sup>, be with us for a free dinner and present a

- ~The two \*Life Centers, Santa Ana and La Habra.
- ~The Horizon Pregnancy Clinic and the Vietnamese Hot Line. (Contact information for all these services are on a poster in the vestibule.) In the next few weeks we will continue to highlight information on one of these facilities each week.

### \*Info about the Life Centers in Santa Ana & La Habra

The Centers provide the following services to clients at no cost: testing, counseling, post-abortion counseling, health care, maternity care, housing, baby needs and much more. The LA HABRA LIFE CENTER moved into larger facilities a year ago and are in the process of becoming a licensed full service medical clinic for women in need. They also have an ultrasound machine.

## First Communion - Year One

Year One is for children who are just beginning the First Communion process.

These children are typically in first grade, however, older children are welcome.

The fee is \$100.

### First Communion - Year Two

Year Two is for children who have **completed** Year One in the Sacramental formation process, no matter the grade.

The fee for Year Two is \$180.

(The additional \$80 is to cover the cost of the Sacramental retreat).

A copy of your child's baptism certificate is mandatory before the first day of classes.

## Faith Formation Grades 3, 4, 5

This part of our program is for families who wish to continue with the religious education of their children. Fee is \$100.






