



A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.



Good news: our grammar school opened with 305 students! With a dedicated administration and faculty – a support staff including MANY volunteer parents all of whom have one goal in mind and action: filling the students with knowledge of God, our parish grammar school is Good News. Our school knows a secret, I gave it away, I want all to know – "The school will be successful only when the community of the Catholic school is faithful. The school has one purpose: to form the next generation of Catholic Christians. Our school will be successful when the community imitates Christ."

We allow all sorts of people and things to get in the way of the purpose of Catholic education which is a choice, a challenge, and a sacrifice. Ask most people – Catholic students, teachers, administrators, and others: "When will the Catholic school be successful?" Possible answers: "When the football

team is victorious. When the Catholic High School alumni become college football players. When fund-raising makes and surpasses its goals. When no student has detention. When test scores are improved. When the graduates get into the next level of education." None of those answers pass the test! **The Catholic school, at all levels, is successful when its students imitate Jesus.**

I'm excited. When the school students are at Mass on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Fridays together we celebrate the True Presence of Jesus in our community. I'm excited when I walk the halls of the school and see the bulletin boards, I know Christ is being taught in the classrooms. I'm excited when I see students and community members helping others; the commandment of Jesus to serve others with love is being fulfilled on our grounds.

I'm excited and I want you to know and spread the news of the school and community alive with the charism, the gifts and spirit of St. Juliana; community, worship, and faith formation.

I want YOU to be part of this excitement and community. Join our weekday Mass – especially 8:00 on Tuesday with the younger students, Wednesday with the third, fourth, and fifth graders, and on Fridays with the sixth, seventh, and eighth graders. On the First Fridays of the month and on other special days the whole school gathers. On those weeks there are no grade level Masses.

I want YOU to MARK YOUR CALENDARS NOW and invite your family and friends to special talks by Jean Twenge PhD – JANUARY 13 and 14 2018 – topics and times to be arranged. Please GOOGLE Jean Twenge, PhD and see and listen to her various talks. Read: *IGEN*, *Generation ME* or any of her other books. Dr. Twenge will be speaking HERE. We will be hosting a speaker or two between now and then leading to this important KEY NOTE speaker. Families and children are important – so important we need to do our best to understand and support raising and sustain their health and safety.

The School of Religious Education for children who do not attend St. Juliana School is also strong. It too has a very dedicated staff to teach and direct service to our Catholic tradition. In that school students prepare for the sacraments and their journey in life toward Almighty God.

EDGE is a program for junior high students. It is an important program to guide its members toward a life-giving relationship with Christ and his Church. It is an important program to discuss human relationships at an age-appropriate level.

Confirmation preparation is also beginning again. I am grateful once more to those who help high school students to prepare for the Sacrament of Confirmation. Receiving and using the gifts of the Holy Spirit makes our teens courageous and strong in the journey of their life to Christ.

If you have a child who should be part of faith formation, please enroll a new student.

Without community, worship, and faith formation, how would we develop in the sight of God? I am excited that YOU are part of this community that preserves the integrity of our patroness and the unity and peace of our faith.

URGENT ACTION ALERT - FROM the CALIFORNIA PROLIFE ORGANIZATION

Call Gov. Jerry Brown's office at 916-445-2841 and ask him to <u>veto</u> these two bills, SB320 and AB282. The current California Legislative session ended on August 31. These two bills were passed and have gone onto Gov. Jerry Brown for his approval or veto. <u>SB320</u> mandates Free Abortions at all Calif. State Colleges and University campuses. This bill would require these colleges to provide the abortion drug, RU486, for up to 10 weeks of pregnancy at their student health centers.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS

Back to work we go! Summer break is over and there is much to accomplish in school and in the workplace. It's a venerable Catholic custom to assign patron saints to the trades and occupations of life. This is largely in the realm of popular devotion, and although from time to time the Vatican declares a saint to be patron of this or that, the process is free-wheeling and just about uncontrollable. Still, there is a saint for almost any purpose, whether you are on death row (Dismas), having eye trouble (Lucy), or pursued by poisonous toads (Hubert). Medieval guilds would often associate themselves with heavenly patrons, so Saint Joseph has the carpenters, Thomas More the lawyers, and physicians get Saint Luke. If you're stuck in the airport, St. Joseph of Cupertino is on call since he was said to rise off the floor when he prayed, and if you're in a long line at the ATM, Saint Anthony Claret is for you.

In recent years, the Vatican has from time to time assigned a new patronage, as when Saint Aloysius Gonzaga was named the patron of HIV-AIDS patients, since as a young Jesuit novice he had cared for his fellow novices during a terrible plague. Anything that matters to us--nation, parish church, occupation, illness--can have a patron, and it is an aspect of Catholicism that has enormous appeal. To believe in the "communion of saints" is to know that the ties that bind us as a communion do not unravel with death, and that when we stand before life's struggles, we do not stand alone.



PRIESTHOOD DISCERNMENT




