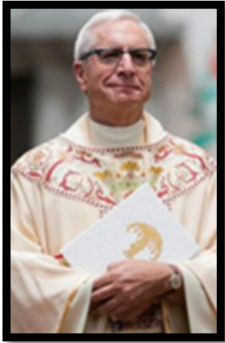

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

Forrest Gump made the point: “Stupid is as stupid does.” Simplified as a rule: “You’ll never go broke betting on dumb.” Dumb is a virulent virus. It manifests itself with a total lack of objectivity and proper perspective. Common sense is absent and self-inflicted righteousness is nearly always present. Dumb causes damage. Huge amounts of damage.

Dumb is not eradicated easily. Baptism alone does not do it. Ordination doesn’t do it. Education is only a help. There has to be an engaged will and a community of supporters.

The sacraments are, each one of them, a call to transcend mere humanity. Sacraments by their nature establish us in a relationship with God, who is Truth. Humans transcend “ordinary human nature” by maintaining a good spiritual life and education. These are invitations to grow. To grow in knowledge of God in the universe and to grow into a relationship with Jesus who is always The Way and The Truth and The Life. As invitations, they demand a response. That response asks us to be vulnerable. To be open to God’s ways.

Jesus’ call is a command to rise up and be holy as he is holy. As a command we can give a positive response: “Here I am Lord, I’ve come to do your will!” Or, we can fail to recognize and actualize the Good God that is offering us “life in abundance.” We are humans and Christians more-or-less. Humanity is recognized on a spectrum from Hitler to Mother Teresa. We live among sinners and saints – dull and bright.

The daily news tells us how often humanity has remained only a potential. How much entitlement (ME first) gives way to resentment. How much Christianity (THEM first) mercy, hospitality, compassion, love and service are still needed for conversion to the “ways of the Lord” whose ways are not our ways.

Christianity invites us to a complete reversal from otherwise gross humanity. From our self-absorbed pursuits to serving others and welcoming the other as Jesus himself welcomed people.

There are two races being run. Simultaneously. In opposite directions. One is the human race to the top of the organization to be the greatest, the first. The second is the race in the opposite direction to the Kingdom of God where the first is the one who serves (loves) the rest. Jesus didn't give some heady explanation of what true fulfillment is. He merely took a child in his arms and said, "Here. Here's what it's all about." Love this example.

What do children have that adults have lost? Wonder, awe, a total lack of ego-boundaries. Which of us still has time to stand in awe of the **real** stars? That's what we've lost. That's what our humanity and Christianity invite us to find again: vulnerability.

Perhaps the greatest challenge of our lives is the challenge to grow up without growing old.


