




THE PARISH AS ONE BODY

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

"What are you discussing along the way?" The way is preparing for an encounter with Jesus! The question was asked last week of the disciples. The question is asked at the conclusion of St. Luke's Gospel as the disciples are on a journey to Emmaus when the unknown Jesus walks with them.

What are you discussing – as you prepare to encounter Jesus? As you prepare for Mass, as you enter church, as you take your place; What are you discussing? How do you prepare for sacred time? How do you prepare to enter sacred space? Is the discussion appropriate? Is it a distraction to Mass and its prayer which should lead to your conversion and change in behavior? Is the discussion with God? Is the exit from Mass or the end of prayer any different? Do you leave to "Glorify God by the way you (have resolved to) live your life"? Or are the concerns trivial; sports scores and the cost of Coco Puffs and milk?

As always God is telling us what He wants us to hear. Problem is, God's voice and His intentions for us will not stand a chance against our desires and wishes. The disciples argued among themselves who was the greatest. Full of themselves, God could not enter into their lives. On the Emmaus journey, the disciples were bags of negative emotions. They were afraid, sad, and discouraged. Simply, they were distracted and could not be aware of the presence of God.

Entering into a time with the holy is a time to be present to God. It's a time to reflect on the graces (gifts) of the Holy Spirit; their presence to us and our good use of them. That's why we begin the Mass with the "Penitential Act."


Pray each Mass giving attention to every prayer. There's an old axiom: "*Lex orandi, lex credendi*" that is "the law of prayer is the law of belief" – the law of praying establishes the living of our faith. The Mass of Vatican II is brilliant in its prayers. Sometimes the translation is stilted yet the prayers are brilliant. After the Our Father, raise your hearts and voices to God and ask Him in prayer to: "...look not on our sins but on the faith of the Church and graciously grant her peace and unity in accordance with your will." Unity and peace, the gifts God wants for His Church and our prayer and determined acts for it.

Where do the distractions come from if not: "jealousy and selfish ambition" and other forms of ego? The wicked continue to say: "let us beset the just one, because he is obnoxious to us." Listen carefully to what might be the foundation of schism, asunder, sin by any name. Do you hear ego-drama and not the guidance of God? God ALWAYS guides us to "unity and peace." Ego-drama is ALWAYS directed toward the narcissistic self. Listen to the just one. Observe the just one. God defends the just one.

As we are aware of the presence of grace, a relationship with Almighty God, be aware of the presence of sin, that which destroys a life-giving and life-long relationship. Thus it is that asunder and sin have a similar root meaning; to tear apart and lead astray.

One way of being led astray is by incomplete information. A lot of confusion is founded on unchallenged certitudes. "The less you know the more certain you can be!" Gather balanced information. For Roman Catholic issues I strongly suggest the media of Bishop Robert Barron. He hardly has a private thought! And his public media productions are superb. Very good is our own Bishop Vann and the Orange Catholic weekly newspaper. These resources are free. I generally avoid hype and drama and I search for evidence before I believe something, it's a good way to live. Follow the caution of Walter Cronkite; let's make sure the President is dead before we announce his certain assassination.

Live this prayer: "Look not on our sins but on the faith of your Church and grant her unity and peace." Then, avoid sin and make yourself an instrument of unity and peace within the Church. Pray and live the Prayer of St. Francis, feast day October 4th. Does your discussion lead to peace and unity? Pray what you believe and practice what you pray. Allow life to come to faith and faith to come to life.

RESPECT LIFE - NEWS

Of the 422 baby bottles that went out in August, 282 were returned and the total of money that was collected was \$8,347.84. (\$148.48 was kept out to reimburse for the cost of 12 doz. extra baby bottles needed.) So the total of the check sent to the Diocese of Orange Office of Respect Life was \$8,199.36. This is the first time that our collection has brought in over \$8,000. THANK YOU all so very much for your generosity. All the Life Centers, Homes and Obria Clinics could not operate without the funds collected from the Diocesan Pennies From Heaven Yearly Campaigns. Our local Life Center in La Habra, on La Habra Blvd, one block West of Harbor Blvd. is especially grateful this year. On August 22, they finally received their license from the State of California to operate as a medical clinic as well as doing counseling, testing, referrals, and providing baby supplies. If you still have baby bottles, just hold on to them and return them (hopefully full) for the collection next August.

The parish Respect Life Group will have two raffles for the Parish Festival again this year: A handmade quilt and a furnished doll house. 
