
THE PARISH AS ONE BODY

Page Three A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M. January 20, 2019



The Baptism of the Lord raises many questions. How do we know he was baptized, did it really happen? That question asks the **historicity** of the event. A second question might be: "Who told us that Jesus was baptized?" That question asks for a **source**, "Who spilled the beans?" There is a third question and, to my spirituality, a more important question: "**Why was this event included in the Gospel at all**?"

The more deeply spiritual question: "Why is the teaching in the Gospel?" - has but one answer: It presents an insight as to what the Kingdom of God is like. The Gospel's purpose is to proclaim the Kingdom of God. The Gospel teaches one lesson: "Here it is, the Kingdom of God." The spirituality of Jesus' baptism speaks to all baptisms; the one baptized has a new relationship with God. The newly baptized belongs to a new community, the Church of Jesus Christ, his body. The newly baptized and his/her family leaves the place of baptism and goes home in a new way. Claimed by and for God, sin is

forgiven, life is changed, and eternal life is promised. The baptized go home as the Wise People at the Nativity of Jesus went home, "by a different way". Their lives were changed.

Ask the same three questions of today's Gospel teaching, the wedding feast of Cana. **History**, all I can be certain of is this, there was a poorly planned wedding in Cana. **Source**, perhaps Mary herself. Simply because of her presence from the Nativity to Pentecost, Mary is the source suspect of a lot of Gospel/Pentecost teachings. **Why is it included**: it tells us what the Kingdom of God is like. It tells me that the Kingdom of God is extravagant love. Six jars each holding twenty to thirty gallons produce wine – fine, choice wine. Split the difference, six jars times twenty-five gallons, that's one hundred fifty gallons of extravagance. It's an incredible amount of love. An incredible amount of service. When we speak of the "heavenly feast" this is what we are speaking about. When we speak of the Kingdom of God, this is what we are speaking about. Incredible love. Shouldn't I turn from selfishness to service?

How does the Gospel teaching of the Wedding of Cana lead me to conversion? It **informs my mind** of what the Kingdom of God is like. I begin to **know** it. It **stirs my heart** to love. I **feel** that "joy, joy, deep in my heart." **My actions turn toward love and service to other people**. Morally, I care for people in an extravagant way. I extend the love of Christ to those in need. Note again the three steps to conversion; the mind (intellectual), the heart (affective), and moral actions choices of the will to do good.

During the weeks of Ordinary Time that begin now, do the work of conversion. Know, love, and serve God in this world so that you will be with Him in the next. It's an old teaching and it's still true. Experience the presence of the Kingdom of God in your life and offer it to a neighbor in need. Extend the love God has for you to another person.



I am excited, over the top, that St. Juliana hosted **Professor Jean Twenge**. Her talks were informative and important to the raising of the next generation of human beings, encouraging human interaction, and preserving family life. She is the best speaker we could have gotten on the topic. It's a goal of mine that St. Juliana Falconieri Parish and School will be a place where such speakers are welcomed and where people gather in numbers to be informed so that family life will be strengthened. The Sunday talk drew a bit more than 500 parishioners and friends! A robust group of Officials from the Diocese of Orange, Catholic school principals, faith formation directors, and others heard her on Monday morning. She spoke to our school's seventh and eighth graders; "The most disciplined group of middle school students I've been with" was her compliment. The Monday evening talk was a well-attended presentation especially to parents. Thank you for your PSA contributions and for private donations which made the presentation possible. Thank you, each and all of you, who helped me to do all the necessary things to make the presentation a success. I am grateful for your considerations and guide. Certainly after hearing Professor Twenge, we went home "in a different way" – informed about the next generation and with direction for our family. "When can we do this

again?"

The church front entrance project is beginning. I apologize for the inconveniences that will occur. The project should be complete by Palm Sunday. It's more than changing out the doors – the sidewalk will be demolished and replaced creating a plaza, an access ramp for the front doors will be erected, the entrance widened and doors replaced. Thank you for your patience and your contributions to the project.

IN ANTICIPATION OF THE JULY 17, 2019 DEDICATION OF CHRIST CATHEDRAL ... WHAT IS A CATHEDRAL?

As we continue our Diocesan Year of Preparation in anticipation of the dedication of our new Christ Cathedral (on July 17th), periodically a different aspect of this exciting historic endeavor is the focus of these reflections. It is only logical that we focus on the simple question: What is a Cathedral?

From the earliest days of our faith, Christians have gathered to 'break the bread' as they listened to the marvels of the Lord enshrined in the 'memoirs of the Apostles,' as St. Justin, writing in the 2nd century, so beautifully referred to the Gospels. The earliest locations where Christians gathered for the Eucharist were undoubtedly in 'house churches' belonging to the more affluent members of the community. Fearing arrest and persecution, these house churches were often unadorned on the outside with simple frescoes of the Good Shepherd or figures of the prophets and luminaries from the Old Testament in the room set aside for the celebration of the Eucharist.

Following the lifting of the official ban on Christians by the Emperor Constantine through his Edict of Milan in 313 AD, Christians could now worship publicly without fear of government harassment and persecution. With the growing number of converts to the faith, larger spaces were needed for worship. Often, public court buildings or 'Basilicas' were taken over and re-purposed for sacred use. These buildings were often referred to in Latin as the domus ecclesiae or 'house of the church.' This beautiful expression underscored the fact that a 'church,' in its deepest and most important meaning, remains the living stones of God's Holy People!

In each city, the first church to be designated would be that of the chief shepherd or successor of the first apostles who brought the good news of Christ to a particular portion of the Lord's vineyard. If the community was small enough, that would be the sole 'church' presided over by the bishop. Hence, in the city of Rome, Constantine gave over land for the building of the 'first church' on the Lateran Hill and designated that as the Church of the Bishop of Rome or his Cathedral. To this day, the Cathedral Church of the See of Rome is St. John Lateran.

As the Christian communities grew in number and the Cathedral Church could no longer adequately accommodate their need, 'suburban' churches were built and delegates of the Bishop or 'presbyters' were sent to celebrate the Eucharist in the name of the Bishop in these various ancillary churches. In Rome, to show the intimate relationship between the unity of the Bishop with the presbyters in the suburban churches, on Sundays, a small fragment of the consecrated host would be sent to all the suburban church so that it might be co-mingled with the consecrated wine – thus, connecting the Bishop to each celebration. Through this simple yet profoundly meaningful symbolic gesture, the words of St. Ignatius of Antioch, writing in the 2nd century, came alive for God's People, "Where the Bishop is, there is the Church."

When the Diocese of Orange was formally established in June 1976, the church of Holy Family in the see city of Orange, was designated as our Cathedral Church. This parish Church, though modest in size, has served our local Church as its 'mother church' for the formative years of our growing Diocese. With a Catholic population that now exceeds 1 million, our long-awaited hope for a Cathedral Church that can more adequately meet our liturgical needs will soon be realized in Christ Cathedral! We rejoice in God's loving providence!
