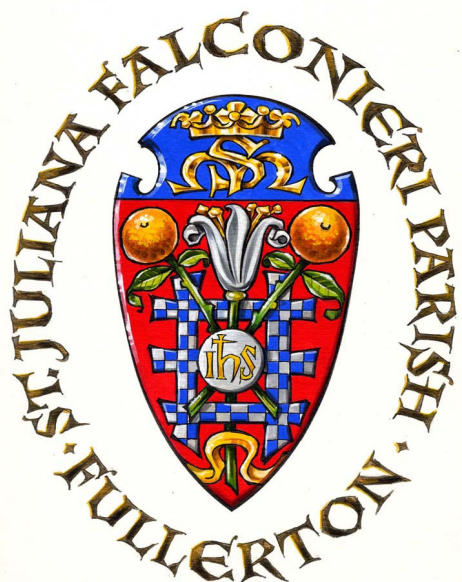

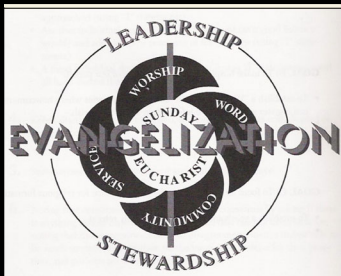
MARRIAGE ~ Couples planning to be married should contact a Priest or a Deacon at least six months before scheduling a date for their wedding.

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M

Fall is in the air, most days. Thanksgiving can't be long in coming. The virtue gratitude is an obvious theme this time of year and it's in today's Gospel. Jesus' act is generous; he cures ten lepers. After his generosity, only one returns to Jesus with gratitude.

Which of the two virtues, generosity or gratitude, is more difficult for you?

My hunch is gratitude is more difficult. It might be that patience is even easier than gratitude. Why might that be?

Gratitude suggests the imposition of a debt. Debts akin to bills "Oh, goodie just what I want, my dentist bill!" Said nobody ever. We are uncomfortable and have the feeling of owing gratitude when people do nice things. When that otherwise narcissistic daughter or son does something kind and out of the ordinary, when that parent who doesn't understand my miserable life in Orange County, CA gives me what I want but didn't ask for, when that humorless teacher posts an unexpected positive comment on my report card, when that neighbor whose front yard resembles a vacant lot visits me in the hospital, when a person I don't know opens a door with a smile we feel strangely uncomfortable. Oh, well, perhaps the feeling will just go away.

However, it doesn't.

We are all indebted, aren't we? I am indebted to my parents who had the good sense to move from Chicago before I came along. To Mom who taught me it's spaghetti on Sunday and how to make it. To those grade school teachers who taught me the faith. To the same teachers who taught me to read and enjoy reading. To any teacher who taught me to write. To the teachers who made math incomprehensible except where money is concerned.

Every now and again, a former student returns with words such as these: "I have been meaning to stop and see you. I've been thinking of how much you taught me, although I hated you and your stupid class at the time. I just wanted to say 'Thanks, you were right!'" Often when this happens, I ask if he has thanked his parents for spending his inheritance on private Catholic education. For a teacher, gratitude is about as rare as snow in the Sahara. I imagine parents find the same rarity.

Apply today's Gospel to your life. Surely, you have taken someone for granted, whom you have never really thanked — even though that person is truly precious to you. Think of that person. Does gratitude make you feel very uncomfortable? Hey, ya wanna get rid of that feeling? Hand write a few personal lines on a piece of notepaper, mail it in an envelope with a postage stamp. You need not show generosity with roses, chocolate, or a gift certificate.

Let me go further. Sometime when you have nothing better to do—especially during those times when you're feeling sorry for yourself, grumpy about your accommodations in life, sit down with a piece of paper and list all the things you are grateful for; birds chirping, the soft dog, the purr of a cat, butterflies, fragrant roses, shade trees, sunrises and sunsets, the beach and waves.

When you're finished, thank God for providing you with of that. It won't enrich God very much, but it'll surely enrich you.

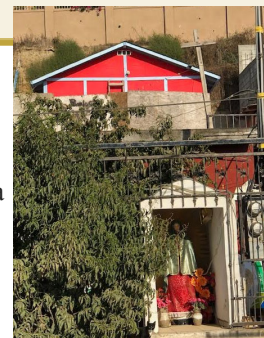

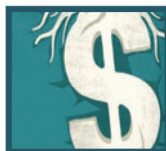

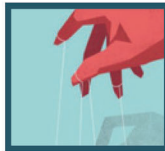
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
