


MARRIAGE \sim Couples planning to be married should contact a Priest or a Deacon at least six months before scheduling a date for their wedding.

THE PARISH AS ONE BODY


"If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be?

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M



Read today's Gospel lesson. Say **p-e-r-s-i-s-t-e-n-c-e**. Recall persistent people such as the hero warrior and first responder in uniform, the researcher who found a cure by returning to the lab day-after-day, the youngster in the classroom or on the field who would not stop trying. Think of the relationship between Helen Keller and Annie Sullivan. The recovering addict, who lived a sober life one day at a time for decades. That married couple, the priest, brother, or sister who kept their vows. WOW! Their spirits could not be broken. Kinda makes you pause. Right? Isn't that what reading the Gospel is supposed to do: "Kinda makes you pause'"? If you are reading the Gospel and don't pause, you aren't reading the Gospel.




The Gospel always teaches a lesson. It teaches God who is love and love's action: "Leave ninety-nine and search for one. Welcome home that brat who lost it all and treat him as if he never left. Keep knocking."

The crusty old gal in today's Gospel really is persistent. Poor woman, she kept bothering the iron-hearted old buzzard of a judge. And she would not stop. She would not rest.

Neither did Jesus stop as he made his way "up to Jerusalem." Neither did that soldier we honored at the ball game. Nor the determined researcher who kept gathering data day-after-day. The good teacher Annie Sullivan never gave up on Helen Keller. The persistence of the coach and team is admirable during the rebuilding year. We admire Mom and Dad, priest, sister, brother who are faithful forever. Such folks are paid an honorarium; most will never be seen on a late night show. Persistence makes success.

Yet, strangely, there is something odd about persistence alone. Just as something is odd about having confidence in confidence alone. We work for success. Is persistence, *per se*, success?



The point might not be that the old woman got her way. The point can be that she never gave up. The point is not the achieving, it's the striving. Strangely, in going there we arrive! Hope is a virtue. It begins with "I don't think I can. But, I'll try." Faith is a virtue; it says, "I rely on God's love at all times. I'm God's friend, He won't abandon me."

God will know you are His friend when you continue to badger Him. There's a lesson for you!

PERSISTENCE (Another note on persistence...)

Today's readings are about persistence, passionate persistence. Exodus tells of a battle won despite weariness because Moses, with help from Aaron and Hur, held his hands raised. Timothy asks that same persistence of his community and us. Luke tells of a court case won by a widow, despite the dishonesty of the judge, because she will not leave him alone. The psalm reminds us that God is everywhere, guarding us from harm day and night, coming and going, now and forever. The readings are about persistence, the relentless, unwavering pursuit of what must not be lost. The readings are about God's passionate persistence in pursuing us, seeking to win our hearts. *Copyright (c) J. S. Paluch Co.*



TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS

Although the hours of daylight are rapidly dwindling, many people would say that these October days bring the year's most splendid weather. Americans are riders and joggers, not strollers, and so the pleasures of the season are often lost on us. This is not the case with many Jewish people, who observe an ancient rule in walking to synagogue on the Sabbath. On city streets and suburban sidewalks in many cities, we may notice around sunset the nicely dressed families walking and chatting on Friday afternoon. After a short prayer at dusk, the families stroll home again for a relaxing and festive meal. They return to synagogue in the morning, and then spend an afternoon in family leisure until three stars appear in the night sky and Sabbath ends.

Catholics, on the other hand, pile into the car and drive even a short distance to Mass; some even divide the family to participate at different hours. For Jews, the leisurely walk marks a dividing line between hectic life commitments and a day of abundant joy and enrichment. Before we became an automobile culture, Catholics embraced a similar pace, and in most places walked to church. These lovely days of fall invite us to tap into an old and life-giving tradition. If you live within a mile of your church, walk next week. If you must drive, park at a good distance and walk the rest of the way. Talk about your life, greet strangers, notice the crunch of leaves under your shoes. You may be surprised at how different Sunday Mass feels when it is framed by leisure!

THIRD WORLD GIFTS & HANDARTS



MORE CORAZON NEWS



Over 30 years ago an American named Carolina, a Corazon volunteer, went to Mexico and taught Alicia Figueroa how to sew. Carolina would be amazed to know what an impact she has had on many people. Alicia became the master teacher for the Corazon sewing program. She has taught countless people how to sew. The program has expanded to all 7 communities that Corazon serves.

Lucy, a Corazon staff member in Mexico is in charge of coordinating the overall program accepting donations and purchasing materials for the sewing projects, and repairing machines.

Cumbres has six sewing machines at the community center. A six month, weekly course provides 56 hours of training. The ratio is 6 students to 2 teachers. Students use the machines to make the projects in the prepared



curriculum. They start with simple projects, sewing an organizer (see photo below), a sewing bag, and a full sized apron, then advance to making flannel pajamas, with pants and a fitted loose top, and a jacket. As they work on these projects the students are taught skills such as, putting in snaps, hooks, handles, applique, borders, and embroidery. They continue using patterns and adjusting them to fit their own size from small, medium, and large patterns. Zippers are sewn into the jackets. If there is enough material, students can make skirts, blouses, and dresses. If there are not enough donations, the course is cut to three months. There is a waiting list to take the course. After graduation, the new seamstresses can come to the community center and use the machine to make clothes for their own families, or to fill orders and sell their work, or they can become a teacher and swap hours of service for Corazon benefits such as home repair and scholarships.

Once graduated from the course, community members get together on their own to make quilts and knitted projects to sell or raffle.

The Corazon community would like to thank all who have donated money or materials to teach them a valuable skill. Your donations are greatly appreciated.
