

### A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M



Wanna see an image of Christ the King? Look above the "Great Doors" of our little church, on the left side! Now, notice the sanctuary. Meditate on Christ on the Cross - in the center of the sanctuary. Christ the King of the Universe and Christ on a cross. They both say the same thing: "Behold your king."

How might you picture Jesus Christ? Such images are numberless. Which work of art best works your spirituality?


Ah, the pleasure and difficulty of religious art! Historians write that before the Edict of Constantine in 313 the most popular image of Jesus was that of the Good Shepherd. After the Edict Jesus was dressed in royal robes, with a crown, scepter and orb – as in our window. Likewise, Mary is presented in similar dress. Jesus is titled the "King of the Universe" and Mary, the "Queen of Heaven." Thus the two windows above the "Great Doors" of our church.

Christ the King – robed in splendor. Christ the King – mocked, spat upon, nailed to a cross and "lifted high." Both lead us to salvation.

Many men claim the title "king". A certain local chap named Paul was the "king of the big screen television." Elvis and Michael Jackson were both kings. The title claimed them fame and fortune. As real kings rule empires, about kings Shakespeare wrote, "Heavy the head that wears the crown."

So, just where is Christ's Kingdom? Christ's Kingdom is "not of this world." Yet it is not outside of it either. It's in our midst and we are his subjects. Christ the King influences Christians as they imitate him in "showing compassion for the children and the poor, for sick and for sinners." Bringing all people to a new





hope, Christians become a "neighbor to the oppressed and the afflicted" showing his mercy with compassionate words and merciful actions.

That is what makes this feast and this King so important. As always, Jesus directs us to what really matters. Not kingly clothing, ambition, or power. What matters the most is that the followers of Christ the King continue the reign of their King making a peaceful and just society by following the command and example of Jesus, serving others as he served. When Christians do this, they become co-heirs to the Kingdom of Christ and extend that Kingdom to others.

Take another meditative look at the art in the sanctuary and above the doors. Why is this King so important to you? Which work of art "works" better for you?

### **TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS**

Today's solemnity, the final feast of the Church year, is a youngster as feasts go. In 1925, Pope Pius XI was distressed by global political upheaval and the de-Christianizing of society. That year was a "Holy Year," keyed to the sixteen hundredth anniversary of the Council of Nicaea, when the words "and of his kingdom there will be no end" were added to the Creed. The Pope explained that although most feasts had developed over many centuries, the Church sometimes provided a new feast to address new needs. He pointed to the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, showing Christ's love and compassion in a time when many people embraced a cold and gloomy spirituality. Originally on the last Sunday of October, in the late 1960s the so-lemnity of Christ the King was moved to the last Sunday of the year.

Fresh from baptism's waters, we are anointed with chrism "as Christ was anointed priest, prophet, and king." This feast is a key to our identity. On this feast, we recognize Christ as a king who breaks the usual mold of kingship, and who shapes his kingdom with our hands, our words, our deeds of love and service. *—James Field, Copyright* © *J. 
