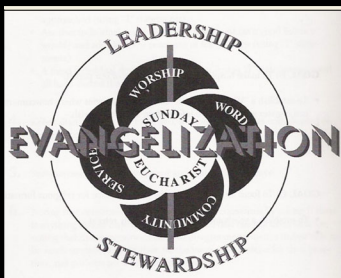

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M



Here's an easy lesson to learn: there were two main groups in the Synagogue: the Pharisees who believed in a resurrection of the dead and lived their lives accordingly. And the Sadducees who did not believe in any resurrection of the dead. That's why they were sad, you see!

I am no stranger to a lot of research data providing conclusions that organized religion, Roman Catholicism in particular is failing, I also believe that most who have abandoned organized religion are likely to disagree with any argument that begins: "the Church says" or "Jesus says."

The Sadducees in today's Gospel try the same technique to trip up Jesus with a most ridiculous argument.

Is there a real failure to believe the heart of Christianity? Give this a thought: If there is anything non-negotiable about Christian doctrine, it is the incarnation **and** the resurrection. Jesus' validity as a messenger from God depends on the trustworthiness of two claims: that **Jesus was God himself, he lived among us a man, and he went through death and came out the other side.**

Why would anyone believe that? Well, this is why I do. The martyrs. Those many men and women who, instead of denying faith in the Risen Lord, died often times really cruel deaths.

There is no arguing with death. The argument arises about what comes **after** death--not what will it be like (as these Sadducees sophomorphically inquire), but will there be anything at all? Jesus says there will. If we accept that, is it just wishful thinking? If Jesus is wrong, atheists are right. When we die, we simply cease to be. All our struggles to live honorably disappear like a computer file in a power outage. Bin Laden and Mother Teresa get the same reward: eradication.

At death, there are only two options: God or...nothing.

If you choose nothing, you are bound to be sad you see.
