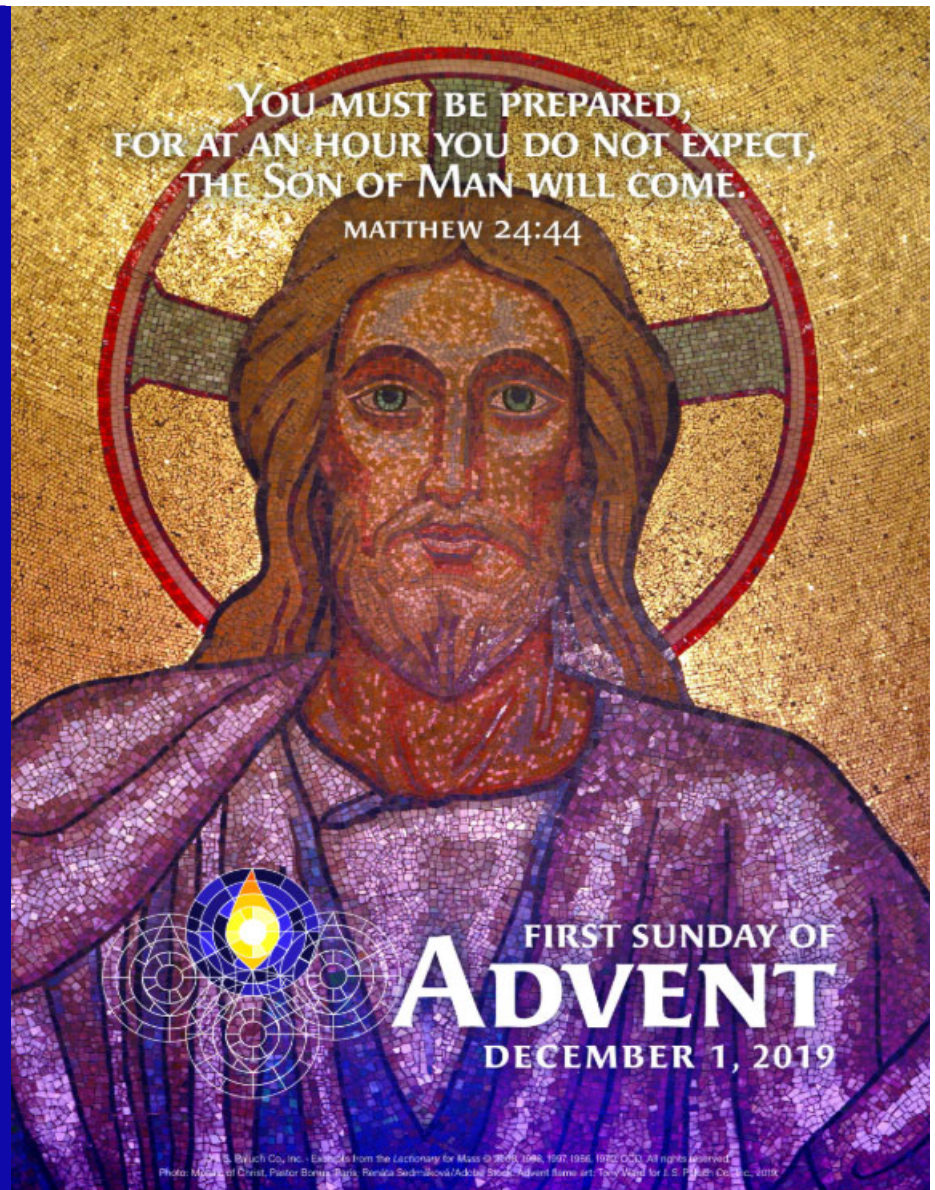

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M



Last week I asked you to look at two images in our church building – both of Christ the King. One above the “Great Doors” of the church on the left and the other, the Cross-in the sanctuary. Both illustrate Christ as a King. Church art must be influenced by theology – the science of understanding God. Theology is not such a soft science as to be anyone’s feeling and it can’t be wrong. Theology is the study of God founded on Scripture, Tradition, history, and the Church. Not all theology is good theology.

Alas, theologians and artists can be obstacles to religion.

Surviving many years of priest-school, I can tell you that many very good theologians seemed to be like the biology teacher who kills the frog in order to dissect it for the class. They demonstrated a lot of understanding of God and faith but sometimes lacked evidence of belief. God was always the subject of our study, infrequently the Father of our belief.

Artists aren’t always helpful either. Groups of sad-faced saints with big gold dishes behind their heads. Add to those scenes of hell and purgatory and dark crucifixions or martyrdoms - Yikes! And some songs, perhaps a nice rhythm but not good theology. Kumbaya!

Christmas season brings us baby Jesus in the manger. Spend time with the manger. Begin to understand it’s the way the Son of Man came to us. Are you able to place yourself in the scene, to smell the manger? Re-watch Christmas time movies, Peanuts Christmas special, re-read Christmas time plays, religious songs, and novels. Why they serve a God-filled, theological, purpose, there is a moral to tell. The same lesson Jesus brought, be reconciled to God and with one another.

Allow the art, movies, novels, religious music, and Manger Scenes influence your experience of Jesus this Advent and Christmas time.

In the thought of good theology, Jesus came not only at a time we didn’t expect but also at a place we didn’t expect, to parents we didn’t expect, and in ways we didn’t expect. At one time, long ago and in a faraway place, Our Savior **came** in unexpected ways. Today he **continues to come** in ways we do not expect. Celebrate the presence of the Lord among us.

Imagine, picture, experience, reflect on how Jesus comes to you today.

He’s present in the folks at the freeway off ramps. He’s the person in your office or school who eats lunch alone. He is also the one who invites the lonely to share table space and conversation. He’s in that teenage boy who is unaware of his talents, who tells his old-fashioned parents lessons about life. Jesus is in that girl who doesn’t see her clothing or style as seductive. Jesus is there, clearly there, in the grumpy priest (!), in the person at the restaurant whose voice could etch glass, and in the store clerk who detests each customer.

In end, Jesus is not an abstraction or a math formula. Often He is not the lighting flash, thunder clap, or earthquake. He continues to be in unexpected places at unexpected times. Unexpectedly He’s present when feuding people reconcile, when justice beats equality, when love overpowers selfishness, when an ogre offers people new hope. You will find him. When you find him, he will make a difference in your life. And you will be alive. Fully alive.



This Tuesday, December 3, come to 24 Hour Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and find Jesus Truly Present to us in the Most Blessed Sacrament. Go from our church to be Christ for others.

Next Sunday evening, December 8, come to Encounter Night and find Jesus – present in the community for dinner and in the Holy Eucharist in the church.

The Feast of the Immaculate Conception will be celebrated on Monday, December 9. The Feast Cannot be on Sunday, December 8th, the Second Sunday of Advent. **The Immaculate Conception is NOT a Holy Day of Obligation this year.**

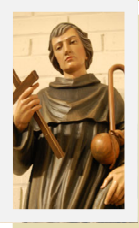

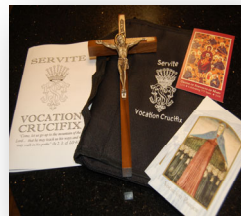

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS - THE FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Our liturgical year begins with the season of Advent—a time of hopeful expectation of the coming of the Lord. On the First Sunday of Advent we look forward to the end of time when we will awaken to the dawn of Christ’s new day.

Today we hear Isaiah speak of a day when God’s power will have brought universal peace and God’s Word will have instructed all people, radiating God’s “light” (teachings) into all of human society. Only when humanity walks “in the light of the LORD” (Isaiah 2:5), when all people desire to be instructed “in [God’s] ways” (Isaiah 2:3), will the world be set aright and our deepest longings fulfilled. The reading from Romans calls us to “awake from sleep” for this final “day is at hand” (Romans 13:11, 12). Together this Sunday’s scriptures proclaim our Christian faith that Jesus is the One who will finally come to fulfill God’s plan of salvation.

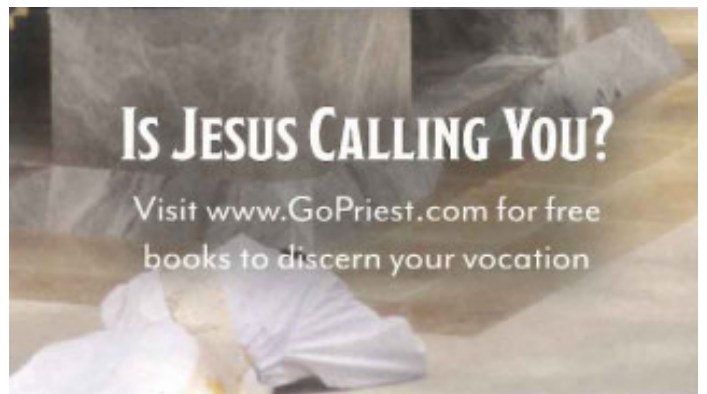
