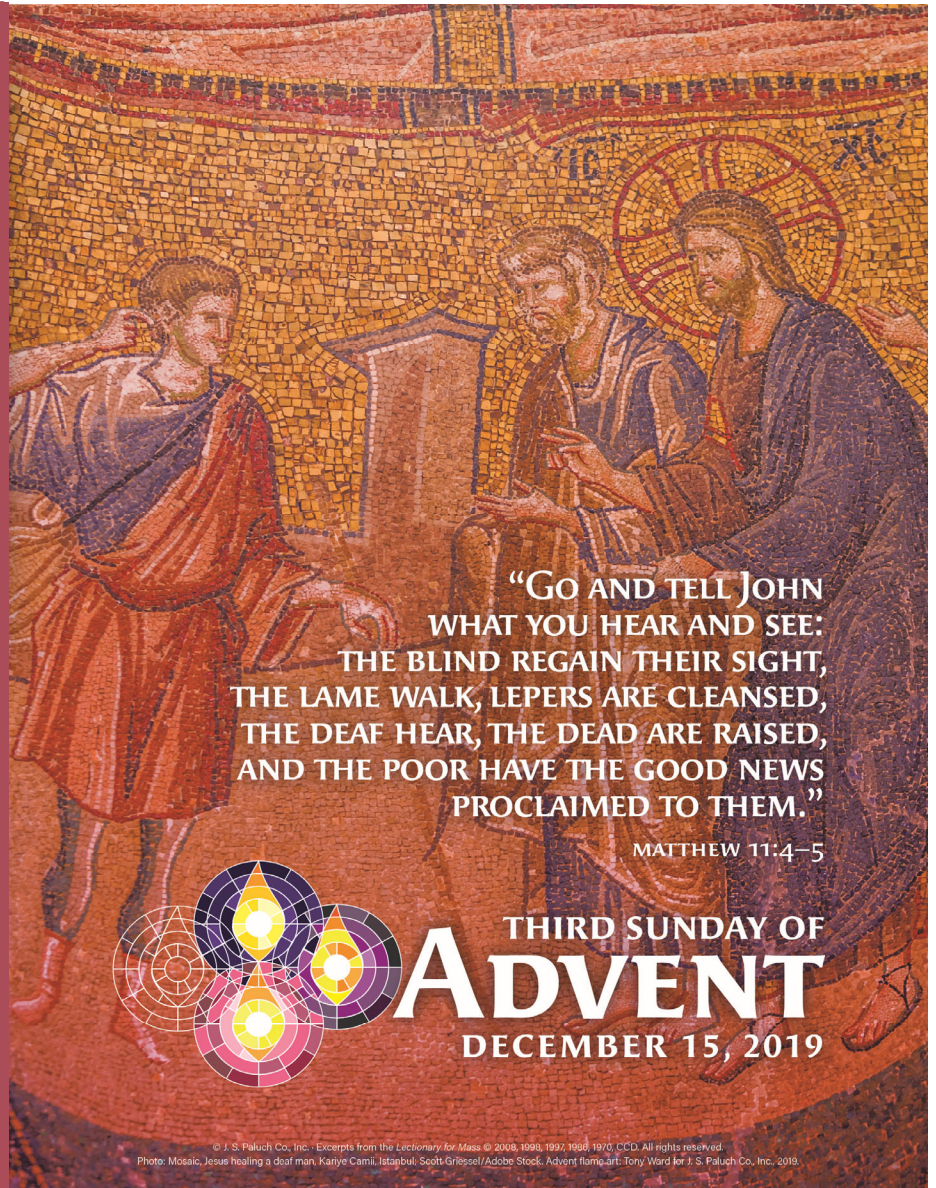

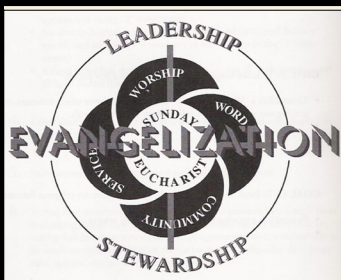

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M

Faith just has to come alive every Gaudate Sunday, this Sunday, the third Sunday of Advent. Particularly with this cycle, cycle A, the readings are rich. I encourage you to re-read them. For your spiritual life, read the lectionary readings, the daily Mass readings, every day; simply use the website of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops – usccb.org. There is even an option to have the readings spoken aloud. Which is nice, it allows the listener to imagine the scenes. Well, I like it!

Advent really awakens our “theological imagination” making faith come to action and action to faithful. Allow that to happen. Many folks come to priests and ranking members of the hierarchy searching for answers to faith’s questions as if they can be answered with inflexible certitude. The WazeApp can get you to any destination in a manner that even the Church’s grace of infallibility would fail. Then there are the witless and arrogant fools who believe “it’s all left up to the individual.” Yikes!

Proper direction to the right answer, if not the right answer is only with curiosity and the courage to be open to change. “Let’s look at the situation differently” and “Let’s do this differently” might be the right answer. Sometimes, “full steam ahead” is not the right command! Change could be the right course. Which means the great sin is being static, stuck in smug certitude. If so, a great virtue is doubt, uneasiness with the status quo, searching for the right.

The Prophet Isaiah really paints a picture of disruption in the status quo. A scene of animals that don’t get along, living peacefully. The desert blossoming abundantly with flowers. Feeble hands strengthened. Captive Israel being ransomed. The prophet proclaims “Rejoice! Good News is fast approaching.”

Being a prophet is a thankless task. The prophet is always just the warm-up act. The high paid headliner will follow. Realizing he is second fiddle, the prophet can’t steal the thunder of the greater one who is to follow. Prophets do not get credit for their performance, like that second grade teacher who prepared you for First Holy Communion and inspired reading skills and a love for learning. If that teacher failed, so did the faith and your academic future.

And “everyone knows” if you’ve been called to be a prophet, it’s a task you can’t escape. Ask Fr. Greg Boyle, SJ of Homeboy Industries “What could have possessed you to found this ministry?” Or Bishop Vann “Why did you accept being a bishop? He could have said “No”. Ask an educated graduate who turned down a high paying position for one he/she believes will make a difference in the lives of others.

Here’s the point: Possessed by the Spirit of God, each of us, most confirm our baptism and accept the role of prophet. That same role that possessed every saint and all religious leaders to stand up and tell people their lives are too small must stir to life within you. The question is whether you will be too discouraged by the prospect even to begin.

If you take on that task, don’t look for any sudden conversions. You’re fighting years of defense-building. Don’t expect tangible rewards. If you can carry an inflated pig bladder through eleven men on a long lawn with white stripes, your salary will be in the millions of dollars; if you do pro bono work, you’d better develop a taste for franks and beans.

You have a prophetic challenge right here in at St. Juliana’s Parish, an invitation to make a difference. Shake up the silent sea of complacency. With the grace of God you can make a difference. He won’t let you down. Try it!

REJOICE!

Dark violet is used throughout Advent to express its character as a season of spiritual preparation for Christmas and “the coming of the Lord.” But on the Third Sunday of Advent, formerly known as *Gaudete* (Latin for “rejoice”) Sunday, rose may be added to the liturgical environment. The entire liturgy is infused with a spirit of rejoicing.

Today's first reading and Gospel proclaim the reality of God's saving work in our midst. Isaiah exuberantly describes the idyllic transformation of all creation as a result of God's presence in the midst of the people. In the Gospel, Jesus connects Isaiah's prophecy with what is happening in his own ministry. In addition to the list of healings from Isaiah (the blind, the lame, lepers, and the deaf), Jesus' presence brings two other reasons for rejoicing: “The dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them” (Matthew 11:5).

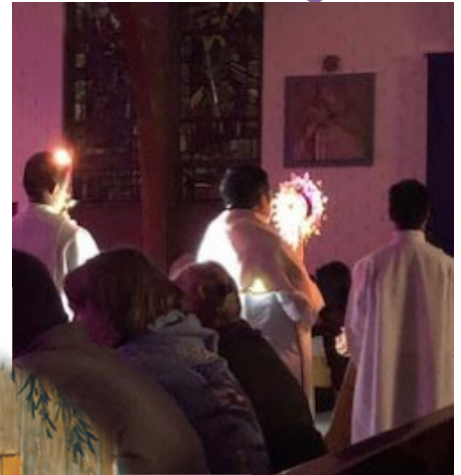

When John the Baptist was in prison and his disciples came to Jesus to find out if he was “the one who is to come,” Jesus replied that they should “Go and tell John what you hear and see...the poor have the good news proclaimed to them.” This response echoes what the prophet Isaiah had foretold about the coming of God. In fact, our care, concern, and concrete action for the poor and vulnerable reveal the activity of the Spirit of the Lord at work in our midst. The Psalmist acknowledges in prayer that the LORD secures justice for the oppressed, gives food to the hungry, loves the just, and protects strangers. Jesus’s identity as the Christ, the one who is to come, and indeed his *divinity*, is affirmed by witness to works of mercy which Israel identified with the LORD’s faithfulness.

Today in our County, more than 7,000 persons are struggling with homelessness, sleeping on the streets and in shelters, in need of housing.
