




THE PARISH AS ONE BODY

For many years I've started these lines with this sentiment: "It seems odd to use the modifier 'holy' before family. Shrinks, philosophers, and sociologists suggest that the family is dysfunctional." Let **them** suggest the family is dysfunctional, let **us** believe the family is holy. Further, let us make it our intention to make it holy and live as a holy family. Shouldn't we, by our religious identity, be different?

Here's the point: The Gospel suggests that "Herod is going to search for the child to destroy him." Popular culture has been destroying Jesus, the family, and children for a long time. It didn't just happen "in these, the most difficult of all times." All times are difficult, all times are the best of times.

Academic literature often refers to family as an institution. That reminds me of one of my favorite comedians, Groucho Marx and his quip that "marriage is a great institution, if

you like living in an institution." Catholic Christians believe that marriage is a covenant that a man and woman make primarily to God through each other. They do this because they love each other and want to grow in love. Remember, and never forget, love is the reason you began your marriage and love is the reason you remain married. Love creates your family and as the trite song suggests: "Love will keep us together."

Strangely, some of the most dedicated parents I know do not seem to realize that the most important gift they can give their kids is the evident solidity of the marriage itself. Kids need a gut conviction that Mom and Dad had a precious relationship before they came along and that the bond between them is something the kids can rely on without a shadow of doubt.

"Herod is searching for the child to destroy him." That's still true of our children. The media and the pop-culture are searching for them, not literally to destroy them, but to own them, program them, entice them into willing slavery. If you put into one pan and balance all the time parents and children that is, the family, share with one another, and in the other pan all the time children spend on "smart electronic devices" which would outweigh the other?

Many prayers celebrate the Feast of The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. Here's the one from the Feast – found in the Roman Missal:

O God, who were please to give us
the shining example of the Holy Family,
graciously grant that we may imitate them
in practicing the virtues of family life and in the bonds of charity,
and so, in the joy of your house,
delight one day in eternal rewards.
We pray through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son
who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
One God, for ever and ever.

Amen.
