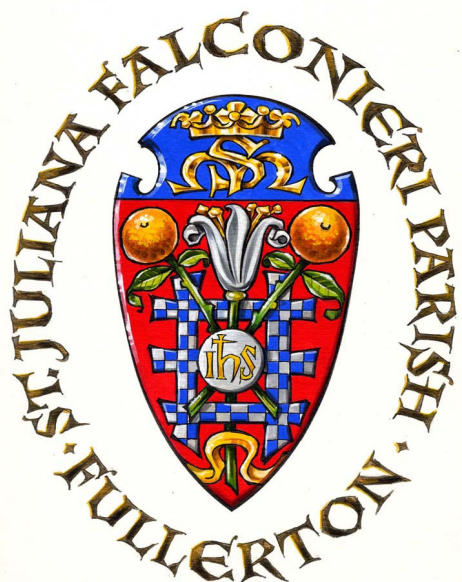

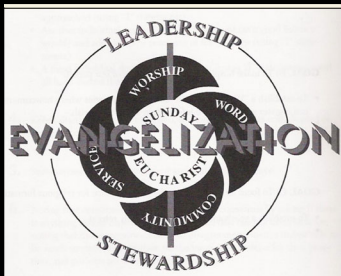
MARRIAGE ~ Couples planning to be married should contact a Priest or a Deacon at least six months before scheduling a date for their wedding.

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M



I am pleased to present the financial statements for our St. Juliana Parish for the fiscal year ending on June 30, 2019. What a year it has been! What an incredible year! From the completion of the upgrades in our church and the new entrance and doors to the pay-off of our “mortgage” with the Diocese of Orange, it’s been great. From the summer series of dinners and talks with Fr. Paul Addison, OSM to the Lenten Series on morality with my student, Brian Traska, Ph.D. and me, faith formation is alive and well.



Our parish maintains its financial strength through planning an annual budget. Based on the previous year with anticipation to what can be ahead, we forecast both revenue and expenses including campus maintenance, office supplies, ministry needs, and salaries. In the past twenty years the campus footprint, ministries, and ministers have expanded. Today, we are debt free. We must balance the budget and operate the ministry of the parish responsibly. We must also establish and maintain at least six months of operational expenses as savings.

As a parish of believers, we express our faith in prayer, instruction, and service. A fine choir and dedicated clergy lead our Sunday Masses. Our First Eucharist program prepares youngsters to seek reconciliation in Penance and to receive the Lord in the Holy Eucharist. Directed by new leadership, our Confirmation and high school ministry is strong. Our RCIA team welcomes men and women who seek the Lord and desire to become Catholic. We celebrate more funerals than baptisms and only a few weddings. The St. Vincent de Paul and Bereavement ministries make the lives of many people easier.

It is my vision to lead an engaged parish where belonging leads to believing and believing to conversion and conversion to Christian witness. Our Mission and Vision Statements must direct our lives as we journey to cooperate with the work of God and accomplish salvation.

To fulfill our Mission Statement of “Proclaiming the Gospel, celebrating the Sacraments, educating, serving, and providing opportunity for all to enrich their faith” we have engaged FOCUS missionary Mr. Adam Ybarra and added Mr. James Abowd, Mr. Gerrick Gamboa, and Ms. Beth Gomez to lead our evangelization ministry team.

As we live the mission of our parish, we need each other. To be an engaged parish, your gifts of prayer, ministry, and financial sacrifice are necessary. If it is possible, we encourage you to increase your contributions of time, talents, and treasure. **We depend on your weekly charitable giving. Your continued charitable commitment is essential. Electronic giving through Faith Direct is an ideal way to give to St. Juliana on a consistent weekly basis.**

Stewardship is what we do after we say: “We Believe.” Responding to belief takes courage. At St. Juliana Parish we witness to Christ as a faith community by the way we live our lives. As Jesus commanded us to love one another, I encourage you to continue to live your lives to their fullest by sharing your gifts of time, talents, and treasure as we pursue holiness and become the community Almighty God intends us to be.

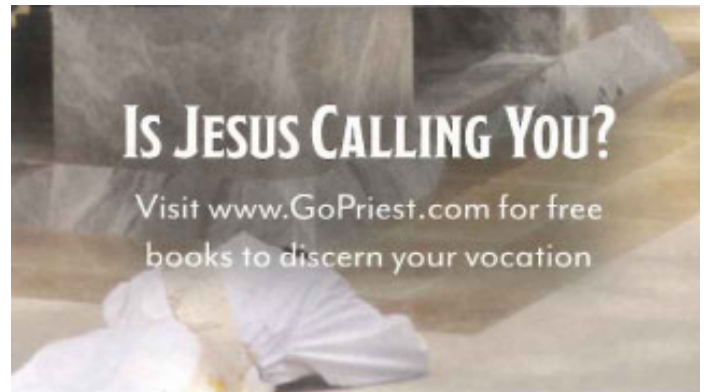
